MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Although there still remains nearly 4 months before my tour of duty as president is ended, this issue of GRAND SQUARE is the last in which I will have this opportunity to write a "message".

My subject continues to be coordinated and cooperative efforts to advance square dancing. When NNJSDA was formed, we looked at the dancing population and enthusiasm of the West Coast, Florida, etc. and eyed this as some sort of an objective. We still have a long way to go; on the otherhand, we have made a good deal of progress. This year saw the graduation of about 55 new square dance couples, we've had widespread publicity in newspapers, and organized three Association party square dances for your pleasure. In addition, the undertaking of the Seventh Convention is a big step to popularizing square dancing in New Jersey. The reason why these affairs were or will be successful is because of the willing and coordinated efforts of the many dancers who have taken an active port in the work --- willingly, cooperatively, and unselfishly. The continued success of the Association depends entirely on the willingness of enough people to take a working port in future Association undertakings. A dangerous threat to the progress of square dancing in our area is complete apathy and an attitude that somebody else will do the work or struggle with the problems. A more dangerous threat is that of individual actions and programs made without concern for and which directly oppose or conflict with planned Association activities and schedules.

Your new officers take the reins on September first. Support them and help them because you want <u>them to</u> succeed.

Finally, I wish to express my sincere appreciation for the willing efforts and support of my fellow officers, Fred and Mae Schreiber, Bert and Dot Starlin, Bud and Betty Sibbald, and advisors Al and Jean Aderente.


HI-LIGHTS OF APRIL 16, 1961 ANNUAL DELEGATES MEETING

Despite inclement weather, there were very few seats at the Field House, Summit, N. J. where on April 16 the Delegates of the Association gathered for their Annual Meeting. This is the meeting at which the new officers of the Association are elected and practically all of the clubs were represented. Voted into office starting

Sept. 1 were: Bud and Betty Sibbald, President; Bob and Isabel Kellogg, Vice President; John and Kay Adams, Secretary; and Bill and Alice Fengler, Treasurer. Three new clubs were admitted to membership - the HANOVER SQUARES in Hanover, the GRAND PROWLERS in Whippany, and the PARSIPPANY SQUARES in Parsippany. This brings the Association's membership up to a total of 20 clubs. The Delegates voted to continue the Summer Dance Program geared however to encourage greater Beginners attendance. A list of the graduates of the East Brunswick, Plainfield and Paramus Classes were distributed to the Delegates with the suggestion they be invited to join the clubs. The number of couples graduated by the Association now totals 175. Plans for the May 21 George Campbell dance (St. Phillip's Church, Clifton) were finalized. Seventh Atlantic Convention Chairmen Frank Preston, Bob Kellogg and Bud Sibbald gave status reports on Registration, Circulation and Publicity. Members were urged to register now to enable the Association to meet printing, postage and advertising costs. Next meeting of the Delegates - Sept. 10.

Whether the dancers are beginners, intermediate or advanced, their main interest is fun but they also receive a little different reward for their efforts according to the dancing they are doing at the present time.

The beginners are being introduced to square dancing so therefore along with some confusion they feel that they also are having fun learning the more simple dances as well as meeting and

making a great many new friends. The brand new square dancer leaves his first dance with the enthusiasm and feeling, "I should have done this sooner. I had a lot of fun."

The intermediate dancer has already experienced the feeling of the beginner so he looks a little further. The intermediate dancers are still dancing for fun but they find their enjoyment dancing with their new made friends along with the thinking they have to do to execute some of the figures the caller is now giving them. These dancers leave with satisfaction and joy written on their faces for the feat which they have accomplished.




CLUB NEWS

This group looks forward to installation of officers when the new President is required to call a tip (this is a treat?) !!


- WAYNE SQUARE DANCE CLUB Another successful dance season for our friends in Wayne, with club membership swelling with recent graduates of NNJSDA classes.
