At the last delegates meeting, a resolution was passed emphasizing the importance of proper square dance attire at all Association dances and further encouraging clubs to instruct their members and club guests accordingly. In the recent reissue of the "Basic Western Square Dance Figures" Manual, the Ten Commandments of Square Dancing were made more explicit on this point. Quoting from Commandment VI "Thou shalt dress for the occasion so as not to offend those around thee—this shall include for the gentlemen a long sleeved shirt, and for the ladies a full skirt with the proper accounterments."

These Ten Commandments really encompass the whole matter of square dance MANNERS. Each dancer should take the time to re-acquaint himself with them and then put them into practice wherever he dances. Some are rather obvious and are seldom found lacking in club dancers — and when they are found, the person is usually made aware of the other dancers concern, such as drinking (VII), bathing (VI) and acting your age (III).

Some of the commandments are harder to live by, simply because they require a little sacrifice on the part of the dancers. These deserve equal attention.

II "Thou shalt not be a snob". This not only applies to the way you feel but to the way you appear to others. Put yourself in the other person's place and take a good look at your own actions at a dance to see if you are really practicing this commandment.

Commandment V deals with treatment of strangers and guests. Make a special point to talk (and dance) with those new to the club or new to you. If you come with a group, split up and spread your fellowship. When one club raids another, don't dance with your own party only, rather get into as many different squares as possible. Then they will really know you were there!

IX "Thou shalt not kill thy club with bickering and faultfinding."
This requires real fortitude and thick skin at times but must be avoided at all costs. If you can't speak good of your club, say nothing.

X "Thou shalt not forget that thou wert once a beginner". Surprisingly this commandment is often forgotten by relatively recent dancers. Remember, if you can dance, you will be an asset to the square. The other dancers will appreciate your tolerance and understanding. This little sacrifice will pay the greatest dividends in the real "thank you's" you get at the end of a tip.

Remember, none of the above can be legislated by the Association. Each dancer must do it himself.

GUY NEARING can be likened to an ice berg in the sea of life; 1/10 we see as we meet him at dances and 9/10 is hidden.

Rapidly approaching 83 (his birthday being January 22, 1890) this soft-spoken gentleman is still one of our areas most avid square & folk dancers.

Blinded three times in his life, Guy has only shifted gears and directed his energies elsewhere.

Starting college with the idea of becoming a botanist, Guy switched to English and began training to live up to his coach's prediction

of becoming a world champion mile runner. Blindness forced him to forego that idea, but nevertheless he graduated Phi Beta Kappa from the University of Pennsylvania in 1911. At Harvard where he went for graduate work in preparation for an assistant professorship in English Philology (study of words) the blindness recurred. With reading out, Guy turned to nature and began studying wild mushrooms - becoming a leading authority...in fact even leading New York Mycological (Fungi) Society lectures and hikes.

An ornamental blacksmith, Shakespearian actor, gifted painter, talented poet and author, Guy printed and bound his own book of 100 sonnets "Dawn Breaks Late". During a ten year period he wrote and illustrated "The Lichen Book" - still used as an authority for these complex lower plants, plus doing editorial work for Mentor Magazine and Harpers Bazaar.


When his blindness recurred after his discharge from World War One. the doctors discovered he had tuberculosis and suggested he get out into the open air. So Guy pitched a tent and built himself a house...which he later sold. He also learned to read and write Braille.

Following the flooding out of his nursery on the Saddle River in 1945, he purchased 4 acres of land, including a 130 year old house, in Ramsey where he lives alone and ministers to his thousands of rhododendrons.... some of which he has grown himself. His Nearing frame (for growing the rhododendrons from cuttings) for which he is known throughout the world was developed over 45 years ago. Visit him in late spring for a glorious sight of his Windbeam (his most successful hybrid), Wyanokie and Mary Fleming and hundreds of others. Many varieties he grows for experimental purposes. Naturally Guy is a member of the American Rhododendron Society and winner of their gold medal, a former editor of American Rock Garden Society bulletin and listed in Who's Who in the East.

With abounding energy Guy still finds time to be an active member of the Interstate Hiking Club and Wocoland Trail Walkers, leading hikes anywheres up to 15 miles...and then returns home to dance at night.

Looking for new interests led Guy to square dancing in 1946, before lessons were needed. Honorary member of several clubs...active member of many more, Guy dances 6 nights a week. But his favorite tho is folk dancing. Ever dance his Nearing Circle Waltz?

What is his secret? Some might say it is living on a diet of natural food, eating no sweets, making his own wine and getting about 6 hours sleep. Others might say it is Guy's insatiable curiosity and energies, his intense love of nature and a spirit that is unquenchable.







I am glad for the concern the Cowans are showing and wish them well. More than that - in the ensuing investigation, I hope the clubs are honest in their reports." Delegate Committee assignments are: Program - Mooneys, Chr. - CaliHoes, Dancing Squares, Ramapo Squares, Somerset Hills; Beginner Classes - McCarty Chr. - Circle 8, Hanover Squares, Richmond Dancers, M T Squares; Publicity - Koved Chr. -Cloverleafs, Hi Taws, Sussex Spinners, Merri 8; Administrative - Tenakill Twirlers, Chr. - Warren Wheelers, Hill City, Rutgers Promenaders, See Saw Squares, Y Squares; Festival - Princeton Squares Chr. - Country Promenaders, Hix & Chix, Mountain Squares, Colonial Squares; Education -Drakes - Chr. - Cross Trail Squares, Reelers, Swingin' Stars, Tenafly Squares, Isle Squares...a donation was made to the Ridgewood Y in the name of past president Lyle Hopper... Delegates were reminded of their duties, especially to carry back to their club the substance of every Association meeting....presidents were asked to give the delegates time to make their reports.... Square Dance Week was discussed and clubs are to report of their success or failure to promote it next meeting .... clubs were asked to submit to secretary a list of members, 60 years or older, who could help with Senior Citizens ... . 



- VIII- Thou shalt honor thy club and give loyalty, for if thou canst not do this, it were better to separate thyself from it and join thyself to another whose methods, members and callers are more to thy liking.




First. How to make perfect bias ..... Bias trims lend themselves to a variety of uses, edging necklines and sleeves, hems, etc.

Cut your piece of fabric into a square. Fold on the bias and cut into 2 triangles.



Then match the top and bottom of the former square and stitch them together-sort of like Dutchman's breeches.



Now press seam open. Now form a tube by matching the straight-of-goods edges of the piece. Before you stitch them together, slip one edge so it extends 1 1/2" beyond the other edge. When edges are stitched, start cutting at one of the extended edges, cutting a continuous strip 1 1/2" wide.



a square of fabric 36" square yields about 24 yards of bias.

Second, How to add a pocket to your favorite skirt or dress....

Trace around your hand, fingers all close together on a scrap of paper. Add an inch all around. Cut out this piece.



Measure down about 1 to 2" from one wrist edge. Draw a line diagonally to opposite side and cut away this wedge.

When cutting your skirt or dress cut out 2 pieces of this pocket pattern to match your fabric.

To assemble: Pin your pocket pieces to your skirt pieces, right sides together, placing them about 6" from waistline edge, with

the higher edge of pocket near the top.

SEW EACH POCKET SKIRT

Sew your seam, incorporating the pocket seam as you do so.

TOGETHER

Trim, notch and turn. Press flat.

The pocket can be added to the right or left seam, whichever you prefer. Pockets are handy and easy with a little practice. Try it.....
