From the desk of FRANK & NAN HABERSBERGER, presidents NNJSDA

In our Square Dance activity we depend upon effective leadership at the Club & Association levels to make the correct decisions to keep our Clubs strong & viable in diffi-

cult times and yet be alert & progressive so that when new opportunities come our way they will be quick to recognize and make the most of them. There are three separate activities taking place now that can have great significance to us in New Jersey and Square Dancers nationwide. By providing effective leadership now, we can tie these activities into one objective and be well on our way in establishing Square Dancing as "The American Folk Dance" of the State of New Jersey. This would go a long way to help the National campaign.

Phase 1 - Identity

Thanks to the ten squares that performed at the Statue of Liberty on October 6 & 7 at the first New Jersey State Ethnic Festival, our Club Dancers positively identified Square Dancing as the American Folk Dance. The flyer printed by the Governor's Ethnic Advisory Council publicized this fact.

Phase 2 - History

NNJSDA will send to every New Jersey State Senator a copy of the History of Square Dancing in New Jersey, requesting their support for passage of a Bill proclaiming Square Dancing as the American Folk Dance of the State of New Jersey. After the November elections, similar petitions are to be sent to our State Assemblymen requesting their support.

Phase 3 - Petitions

One petition, provided by the National Folk Dance Committee and a second, provided by NNJSDA, will be circulated to all Clubs for dancers signatures - to be collected at a specified date. It is hoped that both proclamations will take place in 1980.

Phase One is completed and Phase 2 is now being acted on by our Vice Presidents in charge of Publicity, Sila & Gabe Dell'Angelo and their Committee headed by Frank & Helen Cavanaugh. With the years of involvement and experience represented by all Club Officers, Delegates and the NNJSDA Executive Committee we are ready and we are doing it now. We ask for the full support of all Square Dancers.

INSURANCE COVERAGE Committee Report - Ed Bell



On Dec. 15, 1976 the NNJSDA entered into a group liability Insurance Policy with the Selected Risks Insurance Co., of Branchville, NJ to provide Liability Insurance for all NJ based Member Clubs who desired to join. Member clubs based in NY were

not eligible to join, but were urged to join the insurance program sponsored by the NY State Federation.

(Insurance Chr. Ed Bell has sent an updated coverage information bulletin to all NNJSDA Club Presidents. This bulletin should be given to the Club Treasurer to retain & have available for ready reference by all the Club Executives. And pass along to their successor.)

Basically the coverage is Liability against bodily injury \$300,000; against property damage \$100,000; medical payments \$500/\$10,000. A "certificate of Insurance" will be issued each member club participating. The member club will be billed by the NNJSDA Treasurers for the amount of the annual premium due. Continuance of coverage under this policy requires the filing of an annual "Renewal" form. (It was due Oct 31! Call if you forgot!) NEW clubs that are approved NNJSDA members may join this insurance program by requesting an "Insurance Membership Application". The Selected Risks Insurance Company Agent that handles the NNJSDA policy & all matters pertaining to it is: The Marjorie Ellis Insurance Agency 255 Woodport Road, Sparta, NJ 07871.

Check the bulletin for exact wordings, but basically your club, all its members, guest dancers & class members are all covered at all dances sponsored and scheduled by your club - including specials, Executive Board meetings, demons. You are not covered en route to or from the dances just while there. Remember, all questions to Ed - in writing.

LEGACY

thanks to IOWA S/R/D NEWS LEGACY RESOLVES

The members of LEGACY, known as LEGACY Trustees, are constantly striving to improve the square dance activity. During each LEGACY gathering specific positions are taken relative to certain problems or situations which may exist or are seen as possible future trouble areas within the square dance movement. These positions or statements take the form of resolutions. It is from these resolutions that the LEGACY Trustees receive their direction and make recommendations to other leaders within the activity.

Among the resolutions adopted during the recently concluded LEGACY IV, held in Louisville, Kentucky, May 10 -13 1979 were these which specifically refered to Education as it relates to square dancing.

(1) Whereas square dancing is a friendly, social activity providing wholesome recreation at a reasonable fee and in suitable surroundings, and, Whereas, the quantity and complexity of what we dance has a bearing on the number of individuals who will enjoy this activity, and, Whereas the emphasis appears to have been placed upon more complex movements than the typical square dancer can or will accept, . . . Be it resolved that LEGACY go on record as offering a mandate to callers and dance leaders to deemphasize the complexity and the number of basics involved in general dancing and produce a more realistic mainstream plateau.

(2) Whereas education is the cornerstone of the entire square dance activity and, Whereas proper education can eliminate many problems found in the activity, and Whereas caller/leader training sessions, such as caller clinics and National Square Dance Convention educational panels and seminars, are of utmost importance in the development of the education process ... Be it resolved that LEGACY Trustees become involved in conducting Mini-LEGACIES utilizing the LEGACY leadership manual and appropriate educational materials, prior to LEGACY V.

In addition to these specific Education oriented resolutions other recommendations were made to the LEGACY Trustees. To more readily explain the LEGACY organization it was recommended that the following slogan be utilized to inform nonmembers as to the purpose of LEGACY—

"LEGACY is the international leadership organization to provide for the sharing of knowledge by the many phases of the overall square dance activity."

It was further recommended that LEGACY take the following actions:

 (1) Establish a standing education committee which should be charged with (but not limited to) the creation of the following 1. A list of resources,
 2. A talent bank of leader/specialists,
 3. Topical outlines by subject, 4. Reports of successful Mini-LEGACIES,
 5. School programs.

(2) That LEGACY encourage Callerlab and Roundalab to become more actively involved in the development of suggested programs for the teaching of square dancing in schools.
