Catch all Eights



ROUND - UP to Staten Island residents has a special meaning all its own...congenial crowd...stroll by the sea...delightful dancing...sharing supper.... pure pleasure. And all because one couple had a vision - pooling the talents of all 4 SI clubs to produce an Island Festival.

Prior to this while the SI clubs had cooperated they'd never worked together on such a large project. But Ethelmae & Bill knew they could - & with their gentle prodding, sense of humor, & encouragement others began to believe....and soon the Wilders' impossible dream became Reality.

A prophetic name was chosen - "United Squares of Staten Island". Ground rules were laid to enforce their purpose - "A full day of excellent dancing using callers not normally in our area" ... advance reservations only with tables for box supper with United Squares providing the coffee/tea.

Ken/Agnes Schmidt agreed to be registrars. Flyers were designed. An ad (with wrong date) submitted to GRAND SQUARE. And on May 4, 1975 a sell out crowd oohed & ashed over the fabulous decorations. Gone was St. Joseph's By the Sea High School Gym. In its place was the ROUND-UP CORRAL. By the way, these decorations are carefully dismantled immediately after the dance, stored, refurbished, added to & all lovingly reassembled every year. Repeaters have fun trying to discover what's new THIS year. (Where DID you store the carriage & outhouse - complete with customer & Sears catalogue - from '79? A common ROUND-UP sight is couples taking the 5 minute stroll across the school's back forty to the spacious beach. On a clear Sunday you CAN see forever!



Is the ROUND-UP successful? Well, their 60 sets capacity reached earlier each year. The Chairman is appointed in June and committees immediately start functioning. In '79, Chr. Donna &Bill Anderson discovered

110 of the 480 registered dancers were 5 year repeaters! These names were posted & a special brass dangle was awarded to the 104 who came. Enhancing the ROUND-Up theme was a huge WELCOME spelled by 54 large wooden horseshoes branded for every club represented. These were later removed & given to a club representative as a souvenir. Every dancer was also presented with a garter - a poignant reminder of one of the ROUND-UP's staunchest supporters. Tony Gaeta, donator of the lace, who had passed away just weeks prior to the dance.

As the Andersons said - words can only in some small way indicate the atmosphere & feeling that are present at ROUND-UP time. The congeniality, friendliness & love of fellowman overflow. We are blessed with an excellent, hard working committee who do more than their own share before, during & after the ROUND-UP - It is due to all of them that the Chairmen seem like a Miracle Worker. IT is they who make square dancing truly what its symbol would indicate - Interlocking Squares...not separate clubs each going their own way. Interlocking Squares - another prophetic name - BUT that's another story for another issue. Our Congratulations for all involved in the ROUND-UP.












sifying dances for determining their S/D & R/D Rounds of the Month.




The SQUARE PINCUSHION completes the gathering techniques.....



Last issue we discussed the ruffler, & gathering over a channeled cord.
There is one more method which takes some practice to master but when mastered will simplify the ruffling of

crisper fabrics that are too stiff or too heavy for the ruffler attachment. Using your regular sewing stitch &




straight stitching not zigzag, place your presser foot about a from the edge. Sew slowly guiding the fabric with your left hand a using a long pin (a hatpin is perfect) make small tucks, pushing the fabric with the point of the pin about a in front of the pin about a in front of the presser foot, holding the tuck in place as the foot rides over it then repeating the process over a over. Go S-L-O-Wso you won't sew over your finger- keep the pin or needle at 90° angle so it doesn't break the needle as you sew- also your presser foot should

be the hinged type (the kind that sews over pins). The tucks can be as deep or as shallow as you wish. You will find it easier to prepare your ruffles by joining the pieces and hemming where necessary then doing the tucking in one continuous sweep.

There isn't space to do the tiered skirt so we'll have to save it for next time however I do have a few other tips.

The newest fashions for spring and summer are showing

insertions of lace....and couldn't we do things with that to our square dance attire...bands in rows on skirts, several rows down the front of a bodice or around a neckline, round or square or even a !V'...



perhaps with a matching edging. Be on the lookout for somelight-weight fabrics that make lovely dresses such as dimities, dotted swiss, a take-off on organdy and that type, printed and plain, just remember that too sheer may need an underlining and be sheered extra full.

By using this as a guide, teachers can more accurately determine where a dance fits in the total R/D picture. Your NNJRDL Council is using the Fleck System as an aide in clas-

sifying dances for determining their S/D & R/D Rounds of the Month,




The SQUARE PINCUSHION completes the gathering techniques.....



Last issue we discussed the ruffler, & gathering over a channeled cord.

There is one more method which takes some practice to master but when mastered will simplify the ruffling of crisper fabrics that are too stiff or too heavy for the ruffler attachment. Using your regular sewing stitch &




straight stitching not zigzag, place your presser foot about the from the edge. Sew slowly guiding the fabric with your left hand a using a long pin (a hatpin is perfect) make small tucks, pushing the fabric with the point of the pin about a the fabric with the point of the presser foot, holding the tuck in place as the foot rides over it then repeating the process over a over. Go S-L-O-Wso you won't sew over your finger- keep the pin or needle at 90° angle so it doesn't break the needle as you sew- also your presser foot should

be the hinged type (the kind that sews over pins). The tucks can be as deep or as shallow as you wish. You will find it easier to prepare your ruffles by joining the pieces and hemming where necessary then doing the tucking in one continuous sweep.

There isn't space to do the tiered skirt so we'll have to save it for next time however I do have a few other tips.

The newest fashions for spring and summer are showing

insertions of lace...and couldn't we do things with that to our square dance attire...bands in rows on skirts, several rows down the front of a bodice or around a neckline, round or square or even a 'V'...



perhaps with a matching edging. Be on the lookout for somelight-weight fabrics that make lovely dresses such as dimities, dotted swiss, a take-off on organdy and that type, printed and plain, just remember that too sheer may need an underlining and be sheered extra full.
