


## INTRODUCING THE E C M A EMERGENCY CALL FOR MEDICAL AID . .

E C M A is the abbreviation for Emergency Call for Medical Aid. This signal is designed for use by dancers to notify the caller of a medical problem in their square. When such a problem occurs, important minutes are often lost in the frenzy of waving arms & explanations which cannot be heard or understood across a crowded dance floor. Therefore, the 33rd National S/D Convention will employ the

method of an arched circle to insure the fastest possible response time by medical personnel to an emergency on the dance floor.

Step one: When a dancer goes down, a second dancer attends him/her.

Step two: Remaining couples join hands and take a step backwards. This allows the injured person & attendant air and room.

Step three: Raise joined jhands as high as possible in the form of an arched circle.

Step four: On seeing this signal, the caller or hall monitor will immediately place an ECMA.

We, the staff of the 33rd NSDC, sincerely hope there will be no need for this action in Baltimore in June '84. However, because of the large numbers of dancers attending a NSDC, there is always the probability that emergencies might arise. It is our hope that the arched circle E C M A will become a useful part of our S/D world, used wherever large numbers of dancers gather. Happy, healthy dancing to all.

Our thanks to Judy Ross Smith for the follow ing idea for dancers attending the NATIONAL S/D Convention for a first time.....

What to do first?

Register in at your hotel; unpack your clothes and hang up those crinolines. Then, avoiding the rush hour traffic in Baltimore register down at Convention Center. Bring along your registration number to aid in finding the correct line in



to get your program book, badges, etc. ALL who attend the NSDC MUST wear the special badge issued or you will be denied entrance to the halls. If you've lost your registration certificate, there will be a special place to go to find out your number. Once you have the program book in hand, go someplace quiet and STUDY the program book very carefully. IT lists EVERYTHING - times, places, callers, etc - there will even be a smaller daily tear out sheet to carry with you - BUT study the program carefully; make notes on where you want to be; what you want to see; mark it down; balance activity with rest periods...remember one can dance from 9AM until 1 AM for 3 straight days!!! Pace yourself carefully to get the most enjoyment from the NSDC. Besides dancing, there will be 144 dress shops & suppliers; exhibits; demonstrations; seminars; sewing clinics; teaching; dancing; and most of all lots of new friends just waiting to be made. Bring lunch or you can buy it at one of the many concessions; plan sightseeing time....the day will not be long enough. What do I wear?

Square Dance clothing is expected at all events. Bring along another pair of shoes to change into - IF you have the NJ state outfit, plan on wearing it Saturday and march in the Parade of States. March in it even if you do NOT have the outfit- be a part of the NJ, NY, PA contingent. (more on page 11)



What about transportation at NSDC?

Shuttle bus transportation will be provided to & from the Convention Center, campgrounds, dormitory housing & the hotels/motels inside Baltimore Beltway all

3 days of the NSDC...early in morn until after the afterparties. Bus passes will be required- fee is \$4/day or \$10 for all 3 days. PUBLIC transportation by bus or subway is also available. Routes/schedules to be posted at convention information booths.

If I drive downtown, where can I park?

There are parking garages & lots, as well as streets with parking meters, within reasonable walking distance of the dance facilities. Your best bet, if you insist on driving is to come early Thursday & Friday as these are working days for Baltimorians.
Can I register for one day?

Yes, although we hope you'll be able to come for all 3. The fee is the same \$18 for each dancer for the NSDC.

Will there be provisions for spectators?

All those who enter or leave the Convention & Civic Centers must have a convention badge. There is no provision for spectators as we want to provide good security for the dancers. Spectators may observe the dancing at our outdoor locations. Children under two are admitted free. (Therefore spectators must register!)

I signed up as a spotter. What do I do?

All spotters will receive in the mail confirmation of their time & place and instructions as where to sign in. If in doubt contact the Oliers or Tirrells. Anyone who wants to offer more time, sign in down there at the proper registration desk-volunteers always welcome!







Sorrowfully, we report the news of Lou Hardy's death this past winter from a sudden heart attack. There was nobody to whom square dancing meant more, or who gave more to it. His association with Ramapo goes back to its very beginnings when the club met in Wayne and was known as Wayne Squares, in 1951, and even before that when this same pioneering group danced at the Grange in Wyckoff in the late 40's.

Dependable, ever friendly, helpful, and amiable, unstinting of their time and energy, Lou and Helen Hardy served in every capacity and on every committee. They were presidents, delegates to the organizational meeting of the NNJSDA, publicity and refreshment chairmen inumerable times, never missed being angels at the Sunday night teaching sessions for new dancers. Long-time Ramapo members like the Allisons, Brandts, and Buhlers can attest to that. In 1970, Lou and Helen won the Lucarini Award for their long and dedicated service. In 1973, they were the first recipients of the Vi and Hanley Clapp Award--there have only been two more since then--"in appreciation and recognition for all they have done, and continue to do for us." And in 1981, Ramapo's 30th anniversary year, they were honore with Life Membership. In the record of S/Ding in northern NJ--synonymous to great degree with the history of Ramapo Squares itself -- Lou and Helen Hardy played a prominent and significant role. Indeed, the ever increasing popularity and continuous growth of 3/Ding in our region is Lou Hardy's truest and best memorial.

May we remind you, too, of our last dance this season in May before we resume in Sept. We extend hearty wishes for a satisfying and pleasurable summer, and look forward to greeting you all in the fall when Ramapo will offer again A-2 APD dancing at its highest and most enjoyable level!

The SQUARE PINCUSHION adds 'Chicken Scratch' to square dance clothes....





Chicken scratch has nothing to do with hens and chickens. It is a type of embrofidery done on gingham. It makes lovely borders and/or special designs such as hearts, animals, flowers, etc.

Decide on a design and mark it off on graph paper. One square on the graph paper equals one check on the fabric.

If you're stuck for a design look around you, there are designs in your curtains, wallpaper, books, magazines, even in ready-to-wear clothes. Or venture to the library.

There are 2 basic stitches: the double-cross stitch & the woven stitch. The double-cross stitch is made by making an X in one dark check and a + over it in the same check. Work in white thread, either tatting cotton or single strands of embroidery thread. The woven stitch is likewise worked in white thread but over the medium squares, one stitch horizontally across all medium color squares in a row, then vertically in all the medium color squares in the succeding row. Repeat till all are covered. Then go back and weave a circle around the white squares, weaving the thread under the horizontal and vertical stiches on the medium color squares. Be careful not to pull the threads too tightly. Fill the design entirely, you can outline the border in a color if you wish. This is great pick-up work and makes for a lovely addition to your costume at little cost.





The above directions are for filled in design work. But you can adapt these designs to borders too. Work a few in crosses or squares, leave some plain in between. You may want to try a contrasting color rather than white. Practice on a scrap. A large initial on a blouse looks great. I almost forgot to tell you, use in gingham (4 squares to the inch) for best results.





The PLUS QS selection beginning April 1 is CHASE THE TAG (Right, Left, In, From couples back-to-back, right side dancers right-face U-Turn Back, left-side dancers Fold. All finish as in Tag the Line, then take the facing command (Right, Left, In, Out) if one is given. Variations would include: Chase the Half Tag, Chase the 3/4 Tag. Note that if no facing directionsis given, the movement ends as in Tag the Line, with dancers in single file awaiting the next command.

If you had problems finding a caller the beginning of Easter Week, it probably was because your caller was among the 700+ attending CALLERLAB's annual convention out in Chicago.
