DELEGATES MEETING Mini-notes April 21, 1985

"Missing at roll call: Al"e"mo Squares,Gr and Prowlers,Kings Squares, Kittatinny Rangers, M T, Mountain Squares,Princeton, Tenakill Twirlers, Warren Wheelers, Western Wheelers, Y Squares. Present also President of CCNJ, SDCNJ, reps from FAD & Queen Sq.

1 VP: Summer dances all set; Warm-up dance Aug. 31 to be Manny Amor & Noskers at K of C in South River,NJ. 40 sets at Mar. 30 special with Cliff Brodeur-17 clubs with one square & Somerset Hills won attendance award with 5 sets! May 31 will be Mac McCall of VA with Pennies on R/D. Probably in Montville.

2nd VP: 46 sets at Student Mid-Term (194 students, 172 club dancers,2 freeloaders); 12 callers; special thanks to Bill Heyman for handling the sound.Student Spring Fling to follow same pattern April 28. Graduation rosters mailed to all coordinators lists 156 couple and 181 single grads. FREELOADER program changed to permit six free NNJSDA dances over a two yr. period enabling 1985 grads more time to enjoy their award. Must attend 8 of 10 NNJSDA summer dances to qualify. Open to any 1985 grad.

3rd VP: No poster contest entries yet. See GRAND SQUARE for contest rules. Rec. Sec: Swingin' Stars has given permission for Western Wheelers to use its night for an additional dance night since Swingin' Stars disbanded. Cor Sec: Notebook all up to date; dates oked for next seasons delegates meetings at VFW, Elmwood Park,NJ; records ready to be passed on to next. R/D Liaison: Have had to resign due to business pressures.

GRAND SQUARE: Advertising rates to remain the same...NNJSDA informational questionnaire and rate sheets available to all clubs. Please return the questionnaires to Editor Tirrells as soon as possible-before July. INSURANCE: While the rates have increased it is still a must for all clubs. If any have questions on incorporation, see Rec. Sec. Koenig for step by step way of incorporating without having to use lawyer's services.

SDCNJ: Stressed ECMA - Emergency Call for Medical Aid - flyers available for all clubs; also mentioned in GRAND SQUARE previous issues. SDCNJ will form an honor guard using a rep. from every member organization to head the NJ delegation in the NSDC Parade of States.

Statue of Liberty: Monies still coming in from button sales (still have more available) and 3 clubs have ticket sales outstanding. Already given \$4200. and now have \$1006.60 since then to donate.

BLOOD BANK: Merri Eights has a drive 5/18. Dancers urged to donate in NNJSDA name using our number 9192 at any local Red Cross Blood Drive. OLD BUSINESS/NEW BUSINESS:

MINI-FESTIVAL: to be continued- Nov. 10,1985. Place and callers to be announced. Will feature 2 halls; ELECTION OF OFFICERS-Proposed slate unanimously accepted by delegates; Anne Gallo presented an American Flag to NNJSDA which had been flown over capitol 3/8/65 donated by she & her husband; CCNJ with help from many will hold a benefit dance for Mike Foley on Sunday afternoon May 5. All proceeds to go to Mike. CCNJ to pay all expenses; CCNJ thru its president and Liaison presented a check to NNJSDA for \$200 to be used for any project NNJ decides. Bill Heyman also stressed to the delegates to love your graduates; get out and recruit for fall; and please do not push your new graduates into higher programs of square dancing but allow them to dance using their recently acquired skills before pushing them into the plus program;





BLOOD BANK NEWS

We do not have to repeat how important a BLOOD BANK is. red There are many S/D who do not work for employers who have Blood Banks, & a program like ours is needed. Several S/D have already had blood replaced, thanks to our Blood Bank.

Support for our NNJSDA Blood Bank was enthusiastically given last year, but NOW we must channel that vocal support into greater participation. Last year, the clubs in the Edison area came through with flying colors. Merri Eights have donated close to a 100 pints in the 3 years their program has existed. Several dancers from other clubs, primarily Lakeland Squares, set up their own date when the donor date was cancelled last Thanksgiving. We recognize that giving on a holiday weekend is a problem, & are now scheduling donor days close by, but not on, the holiday weekend. In areas where we cannot recruit enough dancers to warrant a team from the Red Cross, we have lists of all the open dates in each area of NJ. If you or your club can secure at least 20 donors, we shall set up a date for that group. If you cannot, we can tell you where and when you can give in any area on an individual basis. We do need your support.

If you are unable to give blood, you can always come and help out. Helping one way or the other is something to be proud of. NNJSDA has attractive Blood Donor Dangles which are presented to all those members who do participate in some way. If you have participated in one of our Blood Drives and have not received your dangle, please contact our Chairman. Also if you gave blood and have not received your card from Red Cross, contact the Chairman.

Finally, if you do give blood on your own, through the Red Cross, our group number is 9192. Be sure to mention this so we can get credit. If you or any member of your family needs blood, or has to replace blood, please contact our chairman. WORKING TOGETHER - "MINI LUST"

For the past several months, 8 NNJSDA CLUBS(Bee Sharps, Country Promenaders,Dancing Squares, Hill City Squares,M T Squares, Merri Eights, Rutgers Promenaders & Y Squares) have been conducting their own "mini LUST". Using ideas presented at last year's LUST meeting, the presidents have been meeting monthly to discuss common problems & looking for ways to help each other.

Recognizing that most of the problems are shared by S/D clubs everywhere, & that solutions, if they are to be found, will require thinking & action by the entire S/D movements these presidents feel their get togethers can be helpful. Some of the problems are: small classes, new graduates who stop dancing, low attendance at dances, lack of participation by members in club activities. During this first year the group tried to define the areas they felt they could and should be involved with. While results of some of their discussions & activities won't be known for some time, an indication of the areas of discussion are:

*Rutgers Promenaders ran into a problem with getting a hall for classes. During discussion it was recommended the NNJSDA President & other officers & members who are professors or key employees at Rutgers be involved to approach the college. The club was, on its own, finally able to obtain a hall, but felt better knowing there was a group of their peers they could count on for advice and action.

* In December, and later in April, the clubs involved ran a joint class dance using five of the class instructors. Together, with the Angels, approximately 200 people attended. It was an eye opener for the many class members who did not know that there were so many other students in the same area.

* The clubs involved are contemplating running a joint advertisement for classes in selected newspapers. They feel the cost would be too great for any club to handle, but could be done by a group of clubs.

* By meeting regularly & getting to know each other's problems, there has been a conscious effort to support each other's dances. The meetings have acted as catalysts, encouraging clubs to do more raiding with each other. * Another problem concerns S/D weekends that are scheduled after clubs have advertised "special" dances - in many cases where a large turnout is needed. While there may be no way to prevent these conflicting schedules completely, the group hopes that by working together they can make arrangements whereby there would not be the kind of competition that will hurt either activity.

* This group ran the first and most successful of the NNJSDA Blood drives last year. A second is planned for May 18.



This is the 18th year of the FREELOADER Program which is open to all 1985 Graduates of ANY club. Simply attend 8 of the 10 NNJSDA summer dances (see cover) - have your FREELOADER Card signed by the Treas. Dangles are awarded at the August 28th dance.

In the 17 years of this FREELOADER PROGRAM over 12500 have graduated, but only 646 have qualified. Last summer Isle Squares & Cross Trail Sq. tied with the same number of graduates qualifying...followed closely by Country Promenaders. Clubs who have had a graduate qualify for the past 4 years include Hix & Chix and MT Squares. Clubs qualifying the past 3 years include Isle Squares, See Saw Squares, Somerset Hills & Spinning Wheels of Wayne. FREELOADERS are entitled to SIX Association Dances free over the next two years with certain exceptions such as LUST, Mini Festival and any special dance as designated by the Association.

If you did not receive your FREELOADER card in your graduation packets, or have misplaced yours, more cards will be available at the first two NNJSDA summer dances. Please take careful note of the dates and locations of these summer dances. Dates on front cover; maps on back cover. summer dances will be MAINSTREAM Program.



Your Association, thru its 2VP, provides a special packet of information for each and every graduate. We suggest each graduate carefully read thru all the information and save it for reference. If you have questions, contact your class chairman or any NNJSDA officer.

The NNJ's summer dance program is geared for the newer dancer and will be MAINSTREAM. All the callers have been apprised of this situation before signing their contract. The time period for free dances for those earning their FREELOADER has been extended to two years allowing the graduate two years in which to choose the six NNJSDA dances in the S/D program they are most comfortable. SEWING NOTES FROM GRANNY' HOUSE

I have had great success with slip covering my husbands shirts - turning old dress shirts into Western shirts for square dancing, by utilizing scraps of fabric left over from dresses T have made. I have enough material to make yokes, sometimes sleeve trims for his shirts and we enjoy our matching outfits. I scout rummage sales for dress shirts in white or various colors in his size and often pick them up for as little as 50 c. Occasionally I have to replace a worn collar or cuffs.

Here are my slip cover directions:

BACK YOKE Fold the shirt in half down the back, pulling the collar straight up and out of the way. Measure the distance from the fold to the shoulder seam, allowing 5/8" for all seams. Make a paper pattern and place it on your fabric matching the fold of the pattern to the fold of the fabric. Cut one piece on fold. Clip the



curved parts of the material for smooth edges. Iron under the 5/8" seam allowance. Top stitch the material onto the shirt, leaving open at the shoulder, this makes the back Yoke.

FRONT YOKE

Make another pattern for the front of the shirt from the center button-hole opening, around the neck to the shoulder edge. Cut two fabric pieces



from this pattern. Iron under the seams, pin on to shirt and top stitch. Now, top stitch the back yoke over the front yoke at the shoulder seams.


SLEEVES

If you wish to trim the sleeves, I suggest you use two pieces for each sleeve for easier fitting. Make your pattern and cut four fabric pieces. Press as before and top stitch to each to each side of sleeve opening just above the cuff edge.

SIFEUE YATTERS

Try your own ideas using basic pattern pieces, but remember girls, the lace looks better on you!

Also remember everything, but everything that is camera copy, is reduced one third. If your ad is already hard to read, imagine what happens when it is reduced 1/3!!! Your editors are very proud of GRAND SQUARE and work extra hard and long hours to keep it a quality publication - with clean, neat copy. Occasionally we slip up, especially proof reading we can hear you say. In the past we have redone sloppy, poorly pasted, too small type "camera copy" ads and only charged when it was a major overhaul. We have tried to have clubs happy with their ads and write ups.

For some reason, this issue has had more redone "camera copy" adds than ever before. Lucky our Associate Editors have good rapport with his company's advertising department. From now on there will be \$5 assessment for every "camera copy" ad we have to redo bringing it up to decent, reproducable copy for GRAND SQUARE.

CHECKOVER - From right or left columns: Lead 2 (! & @ in the column). Checkmate the Column while 3 & 4 in the column Circulate, Cast Off 3/4, Slither, & Extend the Tag. The result will be two faced lines. Timing: 12 Beats.

MAINSTREAM QS - There will be no new quarterly figure for the quarter beginning April 1.

PLUS QS - LOAD THE WINDMILL - beginning May 1

Starting formation: Facing lines of four. Timing 10-12 beats.

The end dancers do the ends action of Load the Boat; i.e., they circulate two places around the outside of the set δ , when they meet the third dancer, they Touch One Quarter to become ends (leader/trailer or #1 δ #4) of the final column formation. Simultaneously, the center four do a Swing Thru and without stopping, Cast Three Quarters by the right to end as Column Centers. Caution: The ends have little or no trouble performing their actions as they readily understand that action. The centers must be cautioned to establish their wave and then start the Swing Thru action while maintaining both hands at the ready position so the action goes smoothly.




The purpose of a R/D rating system is to provide for rating round dances according to complexity. The system should be one that can be readily used and understood by all those involved in Round Dancing. ROUNDALAB, at its 8th Annual Convention, spent much

R/D as well as considering several other proposals. After maximum participation the attendees enthusiastically endorsed the recommendation that ROUNDALAB adopt the ROUNDALAB Phase Rating System which will identi fy a dance with a ROUNDALAB Phase Number with a plus of no more than 2 to indicate steps in the Bance which are in Phases higher than the basic rating or unphased steps or movements.

There are Six Phases in the ROUNDALAB structure, Phase I (Beginning); II(Easy);III(Easy Intermediate); IV(Intermediate);V(High Intermediate) & VI (Advanced).An alphabetical compilation of the figures included in the various Phases, enabling all interested persons to rate dances, will soon be available from ROUNDALAB.

be available from ROUNDALAB. ROUNDALAB's "Callers Manual for Using Rounds in the Square Dance Program" has recently been made available for \$1.50.

ROUNDALAB will hold its Ninth Annual Convention June 23-25 in Birmingham, AL just prior to the NSDC. It will sponsor a R/D After Party at the NSDC on Thursday evening in the Round Dance Hall from 11 PM to 1 AM. 48





7. Then do your ad and run it. The copy should be dark enough. Do not forget tho, once you turn off the machine it will no longer remember those instructions! And go buy a BLACK ribbon! no more blues, please. THANK YOU.






