Try to dance at least once a week if you want to retain all that you have learned. We hope that you will attend our next Special - Spring Fling - on Sunday, April 27 at Montville High School, NJ. Most clubs will be having special Graduation dances to help you get acquainted with their clubs. They are all anxious to have you join them in a Square of Fun and Friendship.

There is so much fun and enjoyment ahead for you. Take a look at the flyers that each club has available at their dances. You will see that you can dance almost every night of the week if you are so inclined. Wonderful week-ends are also available to you as well as the 35th National Square Dance Convention, which will be held in Indianapolis, IN on June 26, 27 and 28. Treasurer: We have just paid the Insurance bill of \$9,779.00 leaving us a balance of only around \$1500 in the treasury. While the insurance bill for each club comes out to \$289., the NNJ will subsidize each club \$89. and thus bill each club only \$200 for their share. We ask all clubs to please get their share to us as soon as possible as other large bills must be paid soon. Several clubs have yet to pay their dues.

All entries become property of NNJSDA and will be used at the Indianapolis NSDC Showcase of Ideas in the NNJSDA display. Remember the objective of the Poster Contest is to stimulate interest in Square Dancing.

RULES for the 1986 POSTER CONTEST

1. Any number of entries may be made.
2. All posters must be 11 x 17 inches, done in black ink on white paper, poster board or paper.
3. Subject should be a S/D theme to attract NEW dancers. Keep in mind the poster will be used in NJ, NY & PA.
4. Sufficient space must be left on poster for local club information which clubs may add at a later date.
5. All entries must be received by NNJSDA 3rd VP by May 29, 1986 - Ken/Helena Robinson 51 Center Avenue, Leonardo, NJ 07737. Judging will take place June 1, 1986 by the NNJSDA Executive Board.



All are aware of the rising cost of INSURANCE nationwide and the difficulty in obtaining/renewing such coverage. Almost all facilities are requiring proof of insurance up to a million dollars. NNJSDA was fortunate to have its liability policy renewed as of 12/15/85 for \$1,000,000.00. The premium however increased substantially \$9,779.00 - more than doubled! Your NNJ has assumed the major share of this increase (\$89 per club or \$3,115.00). The balance, apportioned between the clubs who use this insurance, amounts to \$200.00 per club...an increase of approximately \$82 over last year. The Hills, NNJ's Insurance Coordinators, are continually reviewing our insurance requirements to endeavor to reduce costs and improve coverage. They are also preparing an insurance brochure explaining exactly what is what. 

Official NJ S/D costume

New Jersey Square Dancers adopted an official state outfit, which many wear when dancing in another state, and especially at Festivals and Conventions, to signify they are from NJ. For the ladies- a white dress (or skirt/blouse) with green vest. Optional is a green overskirt or apron. Men- green pants (white pants optional), white shirt,

green vest. On the back of the vest is a white map of NJ with a yellow star denoting the hometown. (One CA person has placed theirs a way outside of NJ!) Patterns & kits are available from ALBERTA/HARRY VANLUVENDER 70 Miller Road, Kinnelon, NJ 07405 201-838-3392. There is a nominal fee to cover expenses plus the postage. One does not have to have the NJ state outfit to attend a festival, convention, etc- nor to march in the Parade of States. It is optional - but it IS a stirring sight to sit in the grandstand and see a large group of dancers march in all wearing the same outfit and know they are all your friends.

NEW YORK state will decide its official costume at their Festival in October 1987. In the meantime, the suggested costume: Ladies-Navy top, white skirt,petticoat,pettipants,shoes; Men-Navy shirt,white slacks,scarf. A NY patch worn on right front of ladies skirt,left pocket or sleeve man's shirt is available \$4. Dave/Dorothy Casa 41 Stoner Ave.,Pelham,NY 10803.




In the first year of dancing, the Class of '86 has usually been exposed to the MAINSTREAM Program calls, but now needs time to become comfortable in dancing this MAINSTREAM (MS) Program. It is strongly recommended by CALLERLAB and your Association that NO graduate be pushed, urged, or whatever you want to call - moving into the next Program - which is Plus....until the dancer has danced at least one year in the MS Program.

It takes awhile to react to the many calls within the MS Program and any caller who does his homework well can make a most interesting dance with the MS calls (and even with the Basic calls).

New Graduates, we urge you to attend our area MAINSTREAM clubs. There are 13 NNJ member MS clubs and some non-member ones. In some cases, this may mean the graduate may not be able to join the club that sponsored their class for awhile. Don't worry - the 13 or more MS clubs will welcome you with open arms and give you a chance to gain your confidence - to lose some of your frustrations - give you a chance to form new friendships. THEN when you feel comfortable and want to move on to another program, join a Plus workshop and form new friendships, etc....and eventually join the Plus Club if you so desire. There are just as many nice folks in every program so take time to smell the daisies. GRADUATES - DON'T LET yourselves be pushed into Plus Program. Stay in MS a year and ENJOY.

Mainstream clubs include: Belles & Beaux, Circle Eights, Dancing Sq., Hix & Chix 1/3 Thurs., Lakeland Squares, Ocean Waves, Princeton Sq (Thurs), Rutgers Promenaders, Solitaires, Spinning Wheels 1/3/5 Mondays, Tenafly Squares, Tenakill Twirlers, Y Squares and F.A.D.. All are Identified in their write ups with (MS) in the top right hand corner of their write up in GRAND SQUARE. For now thru June, Cross Trail Squares, Somerset Hills, Sussex Spinners, Richmond Dancers, and Isle Squares will lower their Program to make it more comfortable for the newer dancer. And remember NNJ has MS dancing every Wednesday June 25-August 27. Happy Dancing.

You and your Evelyn were a "heaven-made" pair -


Whether dancing the rounds, or part of a square.

WHY Lists & Programs???

CALLERLAB lists were developed to promote guidance to those who teach S/D classes, to callers for programming appropriate programs for the dances they call & to dancers for scheduling dances they enjoy the most. The programs were never intended to segregate dancers into exclusive groups - nor to indicate that one who chooses to dance at any one program is any better or any worse than any other dancer. Dancing skills can be achieved at any program & the quantity of calls is not necessarily an indication of dancer proficiency. The lists are to be used to aid in a logical teaching progression and thorough coverage of basics in classes and to provide an enjoyable modern S/D for dancers of all inclinations.

Approved styling and timing of movements is supposed to be an integral part of ALL classes which should result in smooth flowing dancing TO the music. CALLERLAB strongly suggests dancing at least ONE year at the Mainstream program before going into a Plus Program workshop. There should be no pressure for movement from one program to another once a dancer has graduated. Dancers should be encouraged to take their time - to smell the daisies along the way - to make new friends. Some dancers NEVER move into a different program, they enjoy where they are dancing and the many friendships formed. Here in NNJ territory we have 13 member Mainstream clubs, as well as some non members, for the new graduate to attend & practice the skills you've worked so hard to acquire. These clubs are identified with (MS) on the top line. We suggest visiting them all - Happy dancing.




1. Awarded by NNJSDA to graduates of member clubs with perfect class attendance; class administrators keep the records. Given out at graduation.
2. Earned by current grads who attend 8 of 10 NNJSDA summer dances. Attendance is recorded on special FREELoader cards included in each grads packet. Awarded at last summer dance; recipients also entitled to certain number free admissions to NNJSDA dances in two year period.
3. For dancing at 26 member clubs. PATRON's card with rules & room for signatures included in every grad's packet. Open to all; no time limit.
4. Attendees at LUST (Let Us Speak Together), NNJSDA's Leadership Seminar dedicated to helping all better understand the workings of a S/D club, receive one. A biennial meeting-next one Sunday Sept 14, 1986 - 1:30-9:30.
5. NNJSDA sponsors poster contest in celebration of Square Dance Month (September). Winning artist receives this special dangle.
6. Denotes past officer of NNJSDA. President's badge slightly different.
7. Not a dangle, but a 3 inch badge- red state of NJ with NNJSDA area in black. Center section denotes office held by wearer, ie-Delegate, Pres., etc.

NOTES FROM GRANNY'S HOUSE.

This issue is dedicated to the sewing notes sent to me by Peg Terrill. They originated in the "Sew & Save" pamphlet issued at the 34th National Square Dance Convention in Birmingham, Alabama in June of 1985.

SEW UP YOUR PROBLEMS - "AND PIN THEM UP AS WELL".

NYLON ZIPPERS:

These can usually be repaired by holding a steam iron over the zipper, slide the tab up and down several times, then leave closed until cool.

SCUFF MARKS ON SHOES:

Use color crayons touching up scuff marks on multi-colored shoes.

IRONING METALLIC BRAID:

Use wax paper when pressing square dance dresses, that are trimmed with metallic braid or ric-rac for the back to new finish. Will not harm the material.

INK STAIN:

Spray hair spray on stain, the unscented kind is safest for most fabrics. Wait at least an hour, then wash the garment as usual. This even works on ball point marks.

FORGOT YOUR PETTIPANTS?

Pin a safety pin some where easily found in each slip you own. When you find yourself in this position, use the safety pin in lieu of your pettipants by pulling the first layer of your slip between your legs and pin.

GREASE STAIN:

Try rubbing flour well into stain before washing. Flour will absorb the grease. Black grease can be removed by rubbing in white Crisco.

HOLDING MATERIAL:

A five and dime embroidery hoop is handy for holding fabric taut when removing stains by the boiling water method.

THE FOLLOWING ARE SOME ADDITIONAL "FABRIC HINTS".

1. Always preshrink fabric before cutting, treat as if you had worn the garment, according to manufacturers recommended care method.
2. To remove unpleasant odors from synthetics, add one cup of baking soda when preshrinking fabric.
3. To conserve time, avoid fabrics that have to be matched, one way designs or napped fabrics when you are in hurry.
4. Stitching irregularities will show less in fabrics with a small print or texture than in smooth solid ones.
5. Keep swatches of fabrics that you will want to match in a plastic card case along with yardage needed when you shop.
6. Clamp pattern pieces together with a clothes pin until you finish garment, then fold to shape and press, return to envelope.

AS I SEE IT

BOB OSGOOD - LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA

If you've been a part of the Square Dance world for 30 years or more what I'm going to tell you may be like a visit with an old and comfortable friend. If, on the other hand, square dancing is a relatively new part of your life, then much of this may seem strange. It is, however a true recollection of how this recreation has changed over the years.

"Heads star thru, pass thru Step to a wave, swing thru, etc.." As a square dancer with a few months' lessons behind you, a call like this will not cause you any trouble. It's made up of simple recognizable basics. How far do you think you might get with a call that goes like this? "Duck in the hole with an old barrel role. Make a hoop with a backward loop. Roll the barrel down the hill. Duck right out, swing the opposite Jill".

All Greek? No, it's an actual call. Of course it sounds strange and, regardless of your present-day expertise, you'd be just as apt to fall on your face as any rank beginner might when stepping into a square for the first time.

If you were to be whisked back in time some 30 years, you might have a bit of trouble when the caller stepped up to call something like this: "Roll the barrel, tap the keg Save the oyster, break the egg. Open the book, write the check Turn inside out, go on to the next". Not difficult calls, but if you hadn't been taught how to "duck in holes", etc. as you danced, you undoubtedly would have stood there with your mouth open.

So what does all this prove? For one thing we should be grateful that today's calls are well defined and universally accepted. In times past when you traveled to another city to dance, you might have encountered an all together different set of calls than what you had learned in your area. A caller who really wanted to wow the dancers could create a new pattern, give it a new name (known only to those who danced with him) and become the hero (or villain) of the day. Thank goodness those days have passed.


