

NNJSDA Membership Statistics - Jean/Gene Koenig

This dancing year there are 2531 persons with membership in our NNJSDA clubs. Of these, there are 1,020 couples (down 25 from a year ago) and 491 singles (up 10 from last year). 1661 individuals have danced 3 or more years, 387 for the last two, and 483 persons (students and others) joining this year. Of these 2531 members, 2114 belong to one club, 316 to two clubs, 78 to three, 15 to four, 6 to five, and one couple to six clubs. Thus 83.5% belong to one club, and 16.5% belong to more than one club.

Membership in our 42 clubs (West Milford Flutterwheels dropped membership while J&M Squares joined) total 3079 (down 41 from 1986-87) 606 persons were dropped from this year's rosters and 483 new members (students and others) were

and 483 new members (students and others) were added this September. Please note that 82 persons (34 couples & 14 singles) rejoined our clubs after

dropping out in 1986-87. Also, 42 clubs' membership was 3203 in 1985-86. This means a drop of 4% in membership since 1985-86. We have to get more class members and then keep them in dancing!!





This state outfit was NOT just a one club, or one organization, decision. Suggestions received from many sources were carefully studied by representatives from the various state organizations who were also working together to form the Square Dance Council of NJ. Designs were shown, discussed, & opinions sought from all clubs thruout the state before the official State Costume was adopted by the SDCNJ.

In June at our National S/D Convention, the same as at our NJ State Convention last March, many dancers will proudly march in the Parade of States wearing this outfit. For women it is a white dress (or skirt & blouse) with an apple green vest. Optional is an apple green apron with a small state figure. The men wear white shirts, white or dark green (or apple green) pants and an apple green vest. On the vest will be the State of New Jersey with a gold star marking the dancers' home location. Since we cover three states, you'll find the star sometimes in PA or NY.

Once the official costume was adopted, Harry & Alberta VanLuvender of Kinnelon volunteered to head up a committee to design & produce the patterns for the outfit. They and their committee have cut & mailed the patterns & materials to all who wanted them. Now the VanLuvenders are asking for a sabbatical. Dancers interested in getting the pattern & material for the State Outfit should contact the Bolin's (NNJSDA Presidents) for the name of the new chairmen of this committee. Our sincere thanks to Harry & Alberta for their years of dedicated, behind the years, efforts.



REPORT OF THE 1986-1987 GRADUATES QUESTIONNAIRS

Of the 329 questionnairs sent to the above Graduates, a total of 158 (48%) took time to reply. To them, a hearty Thank You! Although we were mainly looking for answers from those no longer dancing, the inputs from those who answered were very helpful. We will see if some of the suggestions can be implemented. As in any survey you have pro's and con's to any question, and this was the case here. In order not to get into the nitty-gritty we will try and summarize.

Most were drawn to Square Dancing by friends, not advertisement, television, or newspaper ads. They enjoyed the lessons as they met nice people and the friendly atmosphere. The Angels were very helpful with a few exceptions when they tried to teach. As far as the Callers; the consensus was that they did an excellent job with the number of lessons just right. Most thought that the learning of the figures was somewhat difficult and more run-thru would be helpful. While taking lessons, most attended Class program dances. However, the number attending the NNJSDA Mid-Term and Spring Fling fell off considerably.

Of the 158 who responded, only 23 are not dancing. This does not mean that the balance of the 329 are still dancing as we did not receive all the questionnaires back. There were various reasons for these 23; illness, other commitments, lack of confidence, etc. Those still dancing average between 4 and 6 dances a month.

With the Clubs in trouble getting Officers, we asked if those in this Class would ever consider being a Club Officer. It was a disappointing "NO" by 75%. Reasons were mostly: other commitments and work schedule.

The overall comments of the Graduating Class were that the unfriendly feeling they received when attending the various Clubs, even though they were dancing at clubs of their level. Another was that higher level Clubs sponsor classes, but the Graduates have to find somewhere else to dance. The singles' biggest complaint was there were no partners after graduation.

These are valid problems and as far as acceptance, we all should be tolerant with new dancers. Remember, we too were in the same situation when we graduated. Regarding the singles, they should be informed when they start lessons that angels will be furnished, but once they graduate they must find their own partner. We don't discourage singles, but Square Dancing is a Couples' activity.


Again, we want to thank all who returned the Questionnaires, and we will be very happy to sit down and discuss the inputs with anyone who

Those of you who were at the 2nd Annual N.J. Square Dance Convention and were smart enough to attend the sewing hints session with Rose Ericson must be smarter than ever now. I missed those sessions but I was at least smart enough to pick up a copy of "IN STITCHES" with Rose Ericson. This is a 27 page compilation of styling ideas; fabric & trim suggestions; organizing the tools for your sewing; sewing directions for several styles of skirts, belts & cover-ups; storage suggestions; sewing short-cuts A to Z; Sources for: Square Dance catalogs, notions catalogs; laces, trims & Western Notions, Petticoat kits, pre-cut 3D apparel, patterns, knitting a crocheting instructions and Fabric by Mail. Rose has earned my sincere respect for this very educated, informative and time consuming effort. anyone out there knows how to contact Rose, I would appreciate the info to pass on to readers of this column who were not fortunate enough to go to the Convention and get this valuable packet of ideas. Rose, Rose, where are you?

Meanwhile ----some hints I've learned through my

own mistakes or by reading books such as "Sew Successful -

1001 Super Sewing Hints" by Claire B. Shaeffer of ter.

*Fabric selection is just as important as garment construction. Consider its launderability, ironing needs, durability and special sewing problems as well as its appearance. I like poly/cotton blend prints. They don't sag on the bias (nasty problem for circle skirts); they wash & dry in my machines and sometines don't need ironing; stitching irregularities don't show that much; inside seam edges don't need binding; prints don't have to be matched at the seams and need fewer design details & trimmings. Also, the fabric allows perspiration to evaporate through, not like pure poly or other synthetic fabrics that don't "breathe".

*If I see a loosely woven fabric that I like a lot and the price is too good to pass up, then I make a tiered ruffled skirt. However, I can make a circle skirt, I just don't hem it right away. Let it hang on a good skirt hanger, so that the waist is held level, for at least 24 hours, maybe longer. Then, you can use your eyes as a guide, or if you don't trust that, measure down from the waist seam, mark the cutting line with chalk, cut (leave hem allowance) & stitch.

"Sometimes fabric opportunities lurk in places other than fabric stores. Go to white sales. Sheets are an obvious fabric choice, but check out the tablecloths and curtains. They have ruffles, border prints,

fringe edges & are already hemmed. Let your imagination run free to see all the possibilities.

Most came away with a good solid feeling that CALLERLAB is pulling through a most difficult period and that with this more positive approach to the total picture will successfully devise and implement new and innovative ways of recruitment and retantion.
