The Delegates Meeting opened at 2 with a moment of silence for Eugene Koenig, NNJSDA R/D Liaison, who had died earlier that month. 3 clubs had no representatives at the meeting - Kings Squares, Kittatinny Rangers \& Ocean Waves.
1 VP - Next Special dance - March 31 with Bill Harrison \& Roy Gotta at Bloomfield Middle School. Soft soled shoes a MUST. The summer dance schedule is all set. Always on lookout for reasonable halls.
2 VP - 30 squares attended Mid-Term in January with 10 callers participating. Graduates Spring Fling will be May 6 at St. Aloysius. Sample packets of the information the NNJSDA distributes to ALL graduates were distributed to all Class Coordinators. Requested the CC discuss the enclosures with their class members.
3 VP - Reminded all of the Poster Contest. Deadline - June 2, 1990.
COR SEC - Reminded all that club rosters are over due.
REC SEC - Reminded all delegates to sign in on attendance sheets.
GRAND SQUARE - Booster Drive - now thru February. Plans for changing Editorship are moving smoothly. The NNJSDA has authorized purchase of a computer, scanner, etc for their use.
SDCNJ - Convention will be March 24. Advance information will be mailed to all registrants early February. Volunteers still needed as floor spotters, security and hall managers.
NNJRDLC - Mourn the death of friend \& liaison Gene Koenig. Had an excellent education session with George Loewenstein who spoke on taxes. Have canceled April 1 dance due to lack of reasonable hall facilities.
MINI-FESTIVAL - 48 sets with 29 member clubs represented ( 17 had 1 set or more). Next Mini-Festival - November 11, 1990.
LEGACY - Their new logo was introduced. LEGACY is similar to our NNJSDA LUST but on an international scale. All leaders are welcome to join.
NSDC - Will be in Memphis,TN. See Tirrell's if need registration forms. BLOOD BANK - After such an enthusiastic desire to have a blood drive, and in spite of letters to every club plus follow up phone calls, only 18 donors have turned out. Richmond Dancers was awarded the first aid and comfort kit for the most turnout.
S/D - NATIONAL FOLK DANCE - We need to let more New Jerseyites know S/D is the New Jersey State Folk Dance.
LUST - Scheduled for Sunday afternoon- September 9, 1990 with an evening dance. This leadership seminar is open to all with many pertinent topics, all relevant to our activity, to be discussed.
OLD BUSINESS - A reminder not to schedule dances on major religious holidays. Secretary was given a listing of major Jewish holidays. Discussion on advertising square dancing - is it worth the price or is personal contact better? NJ Dept. of Tourism has been requested to include $S / D$ in its brochures. In a discussion on the lack of convenient, affordable halls it was learned the Bergen County Park Authority specifically excludes square dancing. No reason ever given!
NEW BUSINESS - Hi Taws letter detailing their struggle to stay afloat was read. Discussion followed. There is a need for volunteers as Llaison for CCNJ \& NNJRDLC.... see Kelly's if interested. Belles \& Beaux objected to NNJSDA moving its Mid-Term to 2 nd Sunday from usual 4th Sunday without notification to clubs.
GOOD AND WELFARE (no discussion) - Please notify clubs IN ADVANCE if raiding. Tenakill Twirlers acknowledges and honors all Delegates with a Delegates Ball every January. Any suggestions for the Education early hour in April? Suggestion made to cut back on club refreshments at dances. We do not need the calories and it has gotten to [continued on page 7 ]

# NORTHERN NEW JERSEY SQUARE DANCERS ASSOCIATION <br> Constitution and Bylaws <br> Revised 4/16/89 

## CONSTITUTION

## ARTICLE I. Name

The name shall be the "Northern New Jersey Square Dancers Association." It will be a nonprofit organization.

## ARTICLE II. Membership

The membership of the Association shall consist of organized square dance clubs governed by elected officers.

## ARTICLE III, Area of Eligibility

Section 1. The initial area of eligibility for membership shall be Northern New Jersey (defined as north of and including Mercer and Middlesex Counties) and Richmond County (Staten Island) in New York.

Section 2. Clubs in other counties in and out of New Jersey that border the initial area outlined above, may be included upon mutual agreement.

## ARTICLE IV. Purpose

Section 1. To promote square dancing in the area by:
a. organizing and providing special activities.
b. serving as a clearing house for area activities and information.
c. the promotion of square dancing through publicity.
d. working in harmony with others interested in the promotion of square dancing.
e. encouraging standardization of styling and ways of executing figures.

## ARTICLE V. Organization

Section 1. All dancers in good standing of Member Clubs shall be considered members of the Association.

Section 2. Each Member club may elect one couple as Delegates, and one or more couples as Alternate Delegates not to exceed three couples, none of whom may be members of the Executive Committee of the Association. Individual members may be selected in lieu of a couple.

Section 3. Callers or cuers receiving remuneration from any Member club, directly or indirectly, are not eligible to be Delegates, or elected officers of the Association.

Section 4. The Delegates shall elect the officers of the Association.

Section 5. All Past Presidents of the Association shall be Lifetime Honorary Delegates without voting privileges.

Section 6. The term of office of the Delegates and Alternates shall be from June 1 to May 31.

Section 7. Delegates and Alternates must be members in good standing of the club the represent.

Section 8. Delegates and alternates may not represent more than one club simultaneously.

## ARTICLE VI. Officers

Section 1. The officers shall be Presidents, 1st Vice Presidents, 2nd Vice Presidents, 3rd Vice Presidents, Corresponding Secretaries, Recording Secretaries, Treasurers, and Assistant Treasurers.

Section 2. All officers and appointees of the Association shall serve without remuneration.

Section 3. Officer positions may be held by a dancing couple or a single. At no time may a dancing couple or a singie hold more than one officer position.

## ARTICLE VII. Advisors, "Grand Square" Editors, Liaisons

Section 1. The immediate Past Presidents shall remain on the Executive Committee in an advisory capacity until replaced by another immediate Past Presidents.

Section 2. Advisor couples may be appointed as non-voting members of the Executive Committee by the Presidents to serve during the current term.

Section 3. There shall not be more than three advisor couples appointed.

Section 4. Advisors shall render general advice and assistance to the Executive Committee.

Section 5. The Presidents, with the concurrence of the majority of the elective officers, shall appoint the Editor and Associate Editor of "Grand Square," for a period of one year.

Section 6. The Presidents, shall appoint liaisons with other organizations who share our interest in the square dance activity.

## ARTICLE VIII. Election of Officers

Section 1 . Individuals receiving remuneration from any Member Club directly or indirectly, are not eligible for election to office.

Section 2. To be eligible as an officer in the Association, candidates for office must have served as a Delegate of the Association or an officer of a Member club.

Section 3. To be eligible to hold office as Presidents of the Association, candidates for office must have served as an Officer of the Executive Committee.

Section 4. Election of officers shall take place at the Annual Meeting held during the month of April, from a slate presented by the Nominating Committee and nominations from the floor. Any nominations from the floor must have the prior consent of the candidates. The Nominating Committee's slate shall be presented to the Delegates not less than 30 days prior to the Annual Meeting.

Section 5. Election shall be by simple majority of the Delegates present and voting. The vote shall be by secret ballot whenever a contest occurs.

Section 6. The elected officers shall serve for a one year term, starting June 1st.

Section 7. No person shall hold the same office for more than two consecutive terms.

## ARTICLE IX. Duties of Officers

Section 1. The Presidents shall preside at all Association meetings and insure that all business is covered. They shall be spokespersons for the Association. They shall call all meetings of the Delegates and the Executive Committee.

Section 2. The 1st Vice Presidents shall be responsible for special events, balls, and callers except as specified in other Sections of the Constitution. They shall assume all duties of the Presidents if the Presidents are absent from any scheduled function.

The 2nd vice Presidents shall be in charge of beginners' classes, the Mid-Term Student Dance, the Spring Fling and all other items in connection with new recruits to square dancing. They shall assume all duties of the Presidents if the Presidents and the 1st Vice Presidents are absent from any scheduled function.

The 3rd Vice Presidents shall be responsible for all publicity, the Poster Contest, the Association Scrap Book, new Member Clubs of the Association, and act as liaison representatives of the Association in connection with any disputes between Member clubs, and assist Member Clubs who may have financial or membership difficulties. They shall assume all duties of the Presidents, if the Presidents, the 1st Vice Presidents, and the 2nd Vice Presidents are absent from any scheduled function.

Section 3. The Recording Secretaries shall take and distribute minutes of the Delegates and Executive Committee meetings. They shall be Chairpersons of the Clearance Committee. They shall also keep accurate records of all Member Clubs' regular dance schedules.

Section 4. The Corresponding Secretaries shall be responsible for all other correspondence including filing the Annual Incorporation Report to the New Jersey Secretary of State. In the absence of the Recording secretaries, the Corresponding Secretaries shail assume their duties.

Section 5. The Treasurers shall keep an accurate record of all income, moneys on hand, and expenditures. They shall be prepared to present the financial status at each meeting of the Delegates and Executive committee. The Presidents shall authorize all expenditures and may delegate to the Treasurers authorization of routine bills/invoices in accordance with the annual budget. The Treasurers shall be bonded.

Section 6. The Assistant Treasurers shall assist the Treasurers at all Association Dances and Special Activities. They shall assume all duties of the Treasurers if the Treasurers are absent from any scheduled function.

Section 7. Other duties may be assigned to any officer by the Bylaws or by the Executive Committee.

## ARTICLE X. The Executive Committee

Section 1. The Officers, Editors of "Grand Square" and immediate Past Presidents shall constitute the Executive Committee.

Section 2. The Executive Committee shall formulate policies and programs, and, with the help of committees, carry out the activities of the Association.

## ARTICLE XI. Meetings

Section 1. The Presidents shall call, in addition to the Annual Meeting, a minimum of one fall and one winter meeting of the Delegates, giving at least two weeks notice for these meetings. A quorum shall exist when at least $50 \%$ of the Member clubs are represented.

Section 2. The Presidents shall call meetings of the Executive Committee as required. At least two-thirds of the Committee Officers shall be required to make the meeting official. One individual of an officer couple attending shall constitute attendance by that office.

ARTICLE XII. Voting
Section 1. At Delegates Meetings, a simple majority of the Delegates present and voting shall be required to approve items of business requiring a vote, except as otherwise noted. Each Member club present shall have one vote.

Section 2. The Presidents shall call at least one Executive Committee meeting at least four weeks prior to the Delegates Meetings. Also one Changeover Meeting prior to June 15 th. A two-thirds majority vote of the Executive committee present and voting shall be required to approve items of business requiring a vote. Each individual has one vote.

## ARTICLE XIII. Succession of Officers

Section 1. In the event that the Presidents resign, or if one partner becomes incapacitated, the remaining partner, if he or she is capable of doing so, will carry on the office. If unable to continue as Presidents, the office shall be filled by the Vice Presidents in order of their titles. If this is not possible, the Executive Committee shall appoint the Presidents for the remainder of the unexpired term.

Section 2. All other officer vacancies shall be filled by appointment by the Presidents with the concurrence of the Executive Committee for the remainder of the term.

Section 3. Any elected officer may be removed for cause on the recommendation of the majority of the Executive Committee and a twothirds vote of the Delegates present and voting.

## ARTICLE XIV. Committees

Section 1. The Presidents shall appoint the following committees giving geographical consideration to such appointments:
a. Nominating Committee - consisting of a chairperson couple and two member couples, one of the couples shall be former officers of the Association.
b. Audit Committee - to audit the books annually and at each change of Treasurers.
c. Administration - for review of Constitution, Bylaws, and other Association procedures.

Section 2. Special Committees may be appointed as necessary to cover activities.

## ARTICLE XV. Finances

Section 1. Necessary operating expenses shall be defrayed by fund-raising events and/or membership dues.

## ARTICLE XVI. Suspension

Section 1. A club may be suspended from membership in the Association for failure to comply with or for acting contrary to the Articles and Bylaws of this Constitution. Temporary suspension of membership may be invoked by the Executive Committee until such time as action shall be taken at the next Delegates Meeting.

Section 2. For a club to be suspended or expelled, a vote of twothirds of the Delegates (one vote per club) present and voting at a scheduled meeting shall be necessary.

Section 3. If temporary suspension is recommended by the Executive Committee, participation by the temporarily suspended club in any and all activities and benefits of the Association, except insurance coverage, is temporarily suspended until the case is voted upon by the Association Delegates.

## ARTICLE XVII. Amendments

Section 1. Proposed amendments to the Constitution may be submitted by any dancer belonging to a Member Club. Amendments must be submitted to the Association Presidents eight weeks prior to the meeting at which the vote shall be taken. The Recording Secretaries shall be required to notify all registered Delegates at least four weeks prior to the next scheduled Delegates Meeting. The Presidents shall notify all members of the Executive Committee of the proposed amendment at least two weeks prior to the next Executive Committee meeting. At that meeting, the amendment will be discussed and the amendment and the Committee's recommendation will be transmitted to the Association Delegates. Following discussion at the next Delegates Meeting, the vote on the proposed amendment will be taken at the following Delegates Meeting.

Section 2. To be ratified, an amendment must receive a two-thirds majority with at least two-thirds of Member Clubs present and voting.

ARTICLE XVIII. Bylaws
Bylaws shall be adopted, amended or rescinded by a two-thirds vote of the Member Clubs present and voting at a regular meeting with prior notification as for Constitutional Amendments, Article XVII, Section 1.

## ARTICLE XIX. General

"Robert's Rules of Order" shall be the governing Parliamentary Law in all cases not covered in this Constitution or Bylaws.

## BYLAWS

Section 1. Procedure for becoming a member of the Association:
a. a written application shall be filed with the Recording Secretaries of the Association setting forth the name of the club, list of membership, elected officers, names of callers, dates, program, and location of dances, and number of paid up members.
b. an officer of the club shall appear at the next meeting of the Executive Committee to answer any questions regarding the application. c. an announcement of the application shall be made at the next Delegates Meeting following the filing of the application.
d. the 3rd Vice Presidents shall visit the club prior to the Executive Committee review.
e. application shall be voted upon at the next regular Executive Committee meeting. By a majority vote, the application may be rejected, postponed or recommended to the Delegates for acceptance.
f. the recommendations of the Executive Committee shall be presented at the next regular Delegates Meeting. A majority vote of those Delegates present and voting is required for approval.

Section 2. Qualifications for eligibility for new Member Clubs is as follows:
a. must consist of at least four adult squares with a reasonably stable membership over a period of at least one year.
b. must be devoted to Western Style Square Dancing with a reguiar caller or callers, a regular meeting place, and governed by regular elected officers.
c. must not dance on the same date as another Member club within a 15 statute miles radius (defined as a straight line distance between the two clubs regular dance location).
d. teen clubs, with a reasonably stable membership of at least two squares over a period of one year, may become Associate Members with non-vating Delegates, having the right of discussion.

Section 3. Continual eligibility for clubs:
a. to continue membership, a club must conduct regular dances and maintain, as a minimum, the qualifications for eligibility defined in Section 2.
b. when unusual circumstances arise in regard to the above qualifications, any club, upon obtaining permission, in writing, from all conflicting clubs, may request consideration as specified in Section 9, the decision to be binding on all. Any party may appeal to the Delegates within one year of the decision.
c. a club must also be represented at a majority of the Delegates Meetings each year and be in good standing.

Section 4. Annual dues:
The annual dues for each Member Club and Associate Club for the following Fiscal Year (June 1 thru May 31) shal? be recommended by the Executive committee. If there are any changes in the annual dues, notification will be made to the Delegates at least 30 days prior to the first Fall Meeting of the Delegates, at which time it shall be voted upon.
a. annual dues shall be payable before or at the second Delegates Meeting (January).
b. dues not paid within 30 days after the second Delegates Meeting are in arrears and will result in disciplinary action by the Executive Committee.

Section 5. Beginner classes:
The Association or Member Clubs may organize and run beginner ciasses in various sections of the area covered by the Association.

Section 6. Beginner classes promotional material:
The Association shall provide various instructional pamphlets, diplomas and 100\% attendance pins for beginner classes of Member Clubs.

Section 7. Priorities:
The Association shall have first priority of all 5 th Fridays and 5 th Saturdays and also all Wednesdays from June 20 to August 31 for Association Dances.

Section 8. Special dances:
a. Any Member Club planning to hold a special dance on a day other than its regularly scheduled day shall notify the Recording Secretaries and shall be limited to days when no regular club dances within a 25 statute miles radius are scheduled.
b. Dates shall be recorded as written notification is received. In no event will the Recording Secretaries acknowledge any specific date for more than three years in advance. Regularly scheduled dances of Member Clubs have priority over workshops or any extracurricular activities of any Member club of the Association. This restriction will not apply to dance classes or class level dances prior to Mainstream Graduation.
c. In the event any such notification indicated a conflict with another Member Club's regularly scheduled dance or previously scheduled special dance of a Member club to be held within a 15 statute miles radius (as appropriate) of such proposed dance, or conflict with an Association dance, the Recording Secretaries shall advise such club of such conflict and suggest a new date be selected.

Section 9. Difficulties:
a. In the event of any difficulty between two or more clubs, or between the Association and clubs, upon receiving such advice in writing from the Secretaries, or upon request from an involved club, the 3 rd vice presidents shall attempt to effect a mediation satisfactory to all concerned. If unsuccessful, the Presidents shall appoint an impartial committee consisting of at least three members from at least three different clubs (other than those clubs that are affected). This committee shall meet with representatives from each club to effect a mediation. Upon fallure to effect a mediation, the Executive Committee shall rule on the controversy.

Section 10. "Grand Square"
a. The official publication shall be known as "Grand Square." It shall be made available to all dancers of its Member Clubs, to the beginner classes of Member Clubs, and other interested persons. No advertisement
or announcement of any dance, workshop, or extra-curricular activity that is in conflict, as defined in Section 8c, with a previously scheduled dance of a Member club to be held within a 15 or 25 statute miles radius (as appropriate) of such Member Club's dance or in conflict with an Association dance shall be accepted.
b. Any advertisement not related to Square Dancing may be accepted at the discretion of the Editors of "Grand Square".

Section 11. Club rosters:
a. The Association shall keep and maintain records of each Member club, including the names and addresses of its officers, delegates, callers, program of dance, and the location of its regular place of dancing.
b. Any changes in officers, delegates, club callers or program of dancing is to be reported to the Recording Secretaries as soon as reasonably possible.
c. Any contemplated change in regular place or dance schedule is to be reported immediately to the Recording Secretaries for proper clearance.
d. In the event a club finds that it is necessary to disband, and will no longer hold square dances, notification in writing should be made to the Recording Secretaries with all pertinent information including the date of disbandment.
e. The day, time and location of the disbanded club wili be protected for a period of six months after the date of disbandment, at which time application for the area of responsibility of the disbanded club can be made in writing to the Recording Secretaries in accordance with NNJSDA Bylaws.

Section 12. Patron Awards:
To acquire the title of "Patron," a dancer shall attend a scheduled dance by a regular caller of 26 Member clubs, not counting Associate Clubs, in the Association and shall present a written record thereof to the Executive Committee. There shall be no time limit.

We are sorry to report that Caller Kerry Stutzman passed away this winter.

Every issue I go crazy wondering what to fill this age with. Sometimes I get lucky and friends or strangers (friends I haven't met yet) ask for advice about a sewing problem they're having. Thanks to two of my Cloging cohorts Barbara Bacon and Mary Snyder, I got my column idea for this issue. Barbara aske how I did my skirt ruffles. I said I have a ruffling attachment for my 22 year old Singer and (after mach practice and experimentation and breaking of at least 3 of these attachments) I use that. But I usually only make ruffles with fabric I have extra of, so that, if I haven't guaged things right (the ratio is usually 2 to 1 2 lengths of gathering fabric to 1 of ungathered, but this can be more or less depending on several variabls), I can always cut more fabric, add it on, and fill up the space. When I have a linited anount of fabric that must be made to fit exactly, then I have to do it the tedious way I used to use that Mary sugeested. You pun a double basting stitch through one edge, mark the midale of this long ruf-fle-to-be with a large safety pin and the midale of each of these halves with a medium safety oin, and pull the threads, gathering evenly, until jou match the sinilarly marked-with-safety-pins skirt ton. Mary says her daughter divides further than the $1 / 4 \mathrm{~s}$ to the $1 / 8 \mathrm{~s}$ marking points.

Whichever method jou use you will have the problem oi the fraying inside seam. When I am attaching a ruffle to a skirt to that is a circle skirt, I bind the inside seam with a $5 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ or $3 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ wide lace. You coild use bias tape or seam binding too. I liice the soft flexibility of the lace. Men I am attaching tier on tier of straight cut fabric I just sew the gathered fabric at itsi usual $3 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance, the ungathered fabric with a 1" seam llowonce, and use this extra $\vec{i}$ reic 2 s the seam binding. Tis seems quicker to me as it is alreauy "sewn" on one side of the "binding". It also"exactly matches" your skirt - how nice!
rou could also pre-hem the ruffle edges and the skirt to which you're attaching the muffle. This would eliminate the fraying problem. It would also give you the option of attaching the ruffle on top, which gives you that extra "little" ruffle. In this case it would be very difficult to use the rufiler to ruffle and seam at the same time. I would ruffle first, then join as seperate steps.

A method I haven't tried uses unstretched zl" elastic cut to finished size needed marked in $\frac{2}{2} s, \frac{1}{4} s$ ic $1 / 8 \mathrm{~s}$ on both elas. \& ruffle fabric, stitched together by stretching elas, to match marks on fabric, then sewing this ruffle on skirt. In theory I guess this should work. Good luck. ——udie.

CALLERLAB will be holding its annual Convention April 9-11 down in Orlando, FL. A full schedule of programs are planncd for both the caller and the caller's partner/spouse. It is no secret the $S / D$ is facing stiff competition \& problems of increasing costs \& declining attendance in some areas. These issues are of great concern to CALIERLAB. CALLERLAB Will be holding its 3rd Annual Foundation Fund Raising Dance on the Sunday immediately following the NSDC in Memphis, TN (July l) from 10 AM to 1 PM . As one dancer said last year = it was the icing on the cake of a great week! The Foundation, a separate entity within CALLERLAB, is dedicated to preserving and promoting square dancing.


ROUNDALAB, in conjunction with the National Executive Committee of the National Square Dance Convention, will present 3 two-hour seminars at the 39 th NSDC in Memphis, TN this June. To help the committee in selecting topics, the critique and comment sheets from the previous convention are carefully studied and evaluated before selecting the program. On Thursday the topic for discussion will center around the ROUNDALAB Caller's Manual \& their R/D Leaders Manual. "Hiring a Leader: Festivals, Weekends, Fees, Contracts" will be the topic for Friday. Saturday's seminar will feature explanations and demonstrations of different R/D rhythms - concentrating on Jive and Five Count rhythms. Both dancers and teachers are encouraged and welcome to come and participate in the seminars.

The ROUNDALAB Video Phase Demonstration tapes of the Six Phases of Round dancing have recently been released and are now available for purchase. There are 9 tapes in the set, but each Phase may also be purchased separately. Each figure is shown five times - once in its entirety, the man's and woman's part separately, just the footwork, and then the figure is demonstrated to music with an entrance and exit. The appropriate Phase Booklet, describing the figures, accompanies the tapes.


The "USDA NEWS" is a new publication of the United Square Dancers of America edited by past-presidents Jim/ Peggy Segraves of Huntsville, AL. A quarterly magazine, it contains articles written by fellow members of our activity as well as features on the many facets of the USDA itself. USDA has many active committees - their Education committee has available many excellent handouts; its Handicapable Com. is busy planning a 2nd Handicapable S/D Convention; their credit card program is a financial success; and their insurance program well established. Frank/Nan Habersberger (former NNJSDA presidents \& now Pembroke Pines, FL residents) are current USDA Presidents.

NEW LEGACY LOGO
A new LEGACY logo has been created, thanks to Stan Burdick, one of the three founders of LEGACY in 1973. Stan and Cathy Burdick are now co-chairmen of LEGACY, the international leadership/communications organization of square dancing.

Stan created the new as well as the original design. The inspiration for this new one came from Peg and Doc Tirrell, former co-chairmen, Stan says, as well as from other trustees at the 1989 Reno conclave.

It should be noted that this emblem nicely embodies the purposes of LEGACY. The primary focus is the dancing couple, and bold shapes around them suggest square dancing, round dancing, and contra dance (lines). Above the lettering is a gavel, symbol of leadership. Within the gavel handle are ten dots that stand for the ten components of LEGACY - Square Dancers (individually), Square Dance Organizations, Caller Organizations (local), CALLERLAB (international), Round Dance Teachers Organizations, National Square Dance Convention, S/D Publications, Record Companies, S/C Suppliers, Foundations and Special Interest Groups and Projects.

Finally, a quill (part of the "Y" of LEGACY) suggests communication and promotion of the activity. The new design, incorporating the square dance figures, will make LEGACY more recognizable as a square dance organization.
