From the desk of JIM & JOYCE KELLY, NNJSDA PRESIDENTS



From The Dahl House

In a sport such as square dancing, where the dancers are expected to execute the moves in unison, the only room for individuality (other than some dance styling and our basic unique personalities) is in our costumes. Some of you may feel this is unnecessary and don't want to play the game of "Keeping Up with The Joneses".

As a matter of fact, when I first started taking SD lessons I only wore skirts to "special occasions". When they announced that ladies HAD TO wear skirts and men HAD TO wear long sleeved shirts I almost quit. NOBODY was going to tell ME what to wear. Being the stubborn type, I asked WHY these HAD TOs were being demanded. Was it someone's old-fashioned idea of propriety? If so, not too many younger folks were going to take up this sport. Many people really didn't know the answers, but I kept asking around because I really liked the dancing, but didn't like senseless rules.

The most sensible answers seem to be — that men's arms can sweat profusely and some ladies not only dislike allemanding with a wet, hairy arm but could slip and lose their grip — and — that it helps the caller who sight calls get people back in the right position if he/she sees skirts and pants and doesn't have to figure out if that lady in pants with the short haircut and her back to him is or is not a lady. It also follows that if couples are wearing matching or coordinating outfits and dancing together, then the caller is aided even further getting everyone back home after some patter calling. (I have heard callers say they hate holidays like Christmas & Valentine's Day because everyone wears the same colors.) So we can say we're not "Keeping Up With The Joneses", we're merely aiding the callers by creating these unique, sometimes wildly creative outfits.


I now realize that the costumes are fun to wear. I now look forward to dressing up for these more frequent "special occasions" called Square Dances, and adding some color to what can sometimes be a gray, day-to-day existence.

I love "odd" color combinations (like orange & turq. or lime & purple or red & turquoise combined with black and/or white). I love BOLD prints (like giraffes in a jungle or large abstracts of multi-colors). I love bright border prints and striped prints that can be cut into borders. Calicoes and solids are nice old stand-bys but remember you can excite them with touches of neon colors or

flamboyant prints on sashes, belts, slips, overskirts, yokes, ties, etc.. Remember — if you need an excuse — you're helping the callers. Sorry, this wasn't as much a sewing hints column this time as it was an inspiration column. See you at the convention!

LINES ABOUT SQUARES

by Dick Pasvolsky r braces.

Tighten up your bellybands, loosen up your braces, All rare back and get to your places.

When is the last time you heard that bit of patter called at a square dance? Unless you've been dancing for at least 35 years, chances are you never have. Western square dancing materials of the 80s are not nearly as conducive to the extensive use of colorful, entertaining, and very often useful patter as it was during the late 40s and early 50s.

Patter in its heyday, although often making little sense, did much to enhance both the enjoyment and the execution of the dances. While the main purpose of patter has always been entertainment for the dancer and the caller, callers have used patter to alert the dancers to what the next call might be (leading patter) and to help the dancers time the figures correctly as they execute them (trailing patter). The latter was much more important in the days when figures were done in a specific number of beats, usually multiples of four. Callers can also use the patter to accent the beat of the music with a rhythmic chant, usually accenting the downbeat. Some examples of leading patter:

> Chicken on a fence post, possum on a rail, Meet your honey and everybody sail.

Cat in the barn, rat in her mouth, Grab your honey and head her south. And promenade.

At its June Annual Convention, ROUNDALAB established a committee for the "Standardization of Classic Dance Cues.' Chaired by Phil & Royna Thomas, and ascitted by R/D Leaders from around the world, this committee is working at establishing standard cues for the Classic dances

that traveling dancers will encounter wherever they dance.

Using a compliation of replies, the proposed cue sheets have been distributed to the committee for review. Once a cue sheet has been given final approval by the choreographer and the committee, it will be published.

The Rounds for the 1st quarter of 1991 are: Phase III - "Watermelon Cha;" Phase IV - "Under the Bridges of Paris;" and Phase V - "It's Cha Cha Cha."

ROUNDALAB will sponsor it annual Seminar/Clinic on Wednesday, June 26, 1991 prior to the NSDC in Salt Lake City, Utah. The concentration will be on the rhythms of Mambo and Foxtrot. The Seminar/Clinic will be held in the spacious 49th Street Galleria in Murray, UT, just outside Salt Lake. Advance registration is required. In January 1990, LEGACY undertook a census to determine an estimate of the square dancer population in the U.S. and Canada. Using the a mailing to 15% of the S/D contacts listed in the latest issue of the National Square Dance Directory, with a 90% confidence level, it has been determined that there are approximately 405,223 square

dancers in the U.S. and Canada. Membership in clubs that offered both square and round dancing at both MS and Plus programs was significantly higher than in square dance alone clubs. One troubling statistic appeared to be that 34% of the active clubs responding to the question were NOT offering a class in the respective program danced. Copies of the Census Report are available from the Editors of Grand Square.

LEGACY continues to work toward having each state declare Square Dancing as its American Folk Dance. Twelve states have signed bills already: OR, WA, TN, AL, NJ, FL, WV, OK, CA, ID, MA, and IL. Many other states are on the verge of having their bills signed and many more have had the bills introduced to the legislatures.

LEGACY X will be held May 16-19, 1991 at the Milwaukee Marriott in WI. Speak to any LEGACY about becoming a member. Early plans indicate that this will be a super conference and can be of benefit to all who attend.



The Annual Meeting of the SDCNJ was held on Saturday, October 20, 1990. Roy & Betsy Gotta were re-elected Chairmen and Dave & Wendy Roberts were re-elected Vice Chairmen. Continuing to serve their terms are Secretaries, Tex & Margaret Shipman, and Treasurers, Charlie & Kathy Porter. A beautiful clock was presented to Peg & Doc

Tirrell in recognition of their service as past Council Chairmen. The 5th Convention Chairmen, Manny & Gail Amor, reported that the attendance goal was 2,000 and that job descriptions were being finalized. More than 19,000 flyers have been printed and distributed as well as ads placed in many square and round dance publications across the eastern seaboard in addition to "American Square Dance" magazine.


Bucks-Trenton and Penn-Jersey Districts will both have Student Newsletters again this year, underwritten by the Council. The Bucks-Trenton "Dance Around Program" was voted an additional \$260 to defray expenses.

The possibility of the Council underwriting extensive radio advertising of square dance lessons in late summer and early fall was explored by the Gottas. A committee will be formed to make recommendations to the Council.

May Chapman, a local artist, designed a proposed state logo for square dancing. Frank Cavanaugh recommended that the Council present it to the State as an official seal.

Each member organization was reminded that they are entitled to 8 delegates. They were strongly urged and challenged to get more people involved in the Council as well as the Convention.

The Council voted to keep the dues at \$15.00 per organization. The next meeting is scheduled for February 23, 1991 at 1:15 PM, following the Convention meeting.



BMI/ASCAP

CALLERLAB and ROUNDALAB have responded to the flood of notices sent by BMI to over 7,000 clubs, callers and cuers requesting a licensing fee. A CALLERLAB/ROUNDALAB Committee has accepted the responsibility and are are now negotiating for a general license. Since licensing clubs is not a satisfactory solution, the license will be with the callers and cuers for classes, workshops and regular dances. These negotiations have been friendly. BMI and ASCAP are understanding. They realize where the callers, cuers, clubs, dancers, etc. all fit into the picture. The organizations of BMI and ASCAP are really just protectors of the rights of composers who deserve to be reimbursed for their talents if callers, cuers or clubs are making money from the composers' talents. We should pay for that privilege. If someone buys a record, that only gives that person the right to listen to the record, but not the right to use it to make money. BMI and ASCAP are protecting the talents of its members. When the BMI/ASCAP negotiations are completed, the CALLERLAB/ROUNDALAB Committee will prepare a press release appraising the dancing public of the decisions made.


Because in the early days of Western square dancing, figures generally took longer to execute, callers had more time to throw in a few of their favorite lines in almost every tip. Sets were spread out slightly more than they are today and so a grand right and left or a promenade took a few beats longer. The dopaso and some other variations of the old dosido generally afforded the caller the best opportunity for extended patter. Dancers would continue to turn partners left and corners right until the caller would call another figure. Some of my favorites are:

> If you wanna get to heaven, I can tell you you how to do it, Just grease your feet in a little mustard suet. Slide right out of the deviled ham And slide right into that promised land.

Said the little red rooster to the little red hen You ain't laid an egg since I don't know when. Said the little red hen to the little red rooster, I don't get around any more like I use ter.

Well I got an old cow, she's soft as silk She eats green grass and she gives white milk. The harder you squeeze, the harder you pull The quicker you get that bucket full.
