





DELEGATES MEETING - JANUARY 20, 1990

Meeting called to order by President, Jim Kelly at 2:10 PM. Roll call was taken. Those clubs not represented were Colonial Squares, Isle Squares, Staten Square Set, Sussex Spinners and Warren Wheelers. The minutes of the Sept. 16, 1990 meeting were approved. Jim explained the change in the meeting format starting with this meeting. The Education Portion will now be part of the meeting rather than preceding it as it had been in the past. Hopefully, this will bring more participation to the most important item on the agenda, Education,

The Tirrells are in charge of Education and the NNJSDA Constitution and the BMI/ASCAP situation were the topics. Links of chain, with the center link colored red, were passed out to each Delegate. The links represent the link between the NNJSDA and the clubs and we are only as strong as our weakest link. The Delegates are the link of communication between the Association and their clubs. The Grand Square Editors are also a link between the NNJSDA and the clubs. "What is your NNJSDA I.Q.?" questionnaires (to be reprinted in a future issue) were distributed and discussed. Each Officer was introduced and the duties explained. Peg & Doc then went on to explain the BMI/ASCAP situation. All music that is not in the domain is copywrited and anyone who uses music publicly must have a license to do so. Roundalab and Callerlab have known about this problem for some time and formed a committee to



investigate. After much discussion and negotiation with BMI/ASCAP, a settlement was reached. A graduated scale of fees was set up for each caller and cuer. Starting April 1, 1991 the fee structure will be : 50 dances - \$52.50; 51-150 dances - \$75; 151-300 dances - \$105; over 300 dances - \$140. These fees do not cover festvals and weekends and there is an additional charge. Everyone belonging to Roundalab and Callerlab must obtain their license by April 1st. Doc explained that BMI/ASCAP have never lost a court case involving copywrited music. The fine for use without the license is up to \$20,000. Many questions were asked and following was explained:

BMI/ASCAP are going after malls, those hiring musicians, those who play music in their businesses and any other public use of copywrited music. A grandfather clause is being sought to prevent callers and cuers from being sued for past use of music. It is best to ask you r caller and cuer is they are a member of Callerlab or Roundalab before booking them. A separate license will be obtained for the State Convention. Steve Forman (a caller) stated that he paid a \$200 licencse fee for a weekend he is holding. The NNJSDA will considered a club. If a caller or cuer asks for more than an additional \$1.00 to offset his/her license fees, that is too much. Fees collected are royalties to composers of the music. BMI and ASCAP are policy and collection organizations for composers and writers. Clubs need not worry about license fees as long as their callers and cuers are members of Callerlab and Roundalab. There was a short recess.

NEW BUSINESS: Based io the report of the 3rd VPs, Ray O'Neill & Joan Daniels, the Executive Board voted to recommend that the Delegates approve the membership of Dingman Dancers. A motion was made and seconded and unamousily voted to admit Dingman Dancers as a member of the NNJSDA. Dingman Dancers President, Charles Scholtes and Dingman's future Delegate were introduced.

A letter was received from Ramapo Squares saying they have suspended activities. A phone call was received from Montville Squares saying that they were temporarily suspending activities until the fall. Jim Kelly expressed regret and said he was afraid we lose these dancer. He said that this is a lesson for the future and the we must welcome new dancers and not exist as "invitation only clubs."

A letter from See Saws was received regarding callers holding dances in conflict with member clubs dances. We do not have jurisdiction over the



WELCOME NEW DANCERS

You are reading **Grand Square**, the Official Publication of the Northern New Jersey Square Dancers Assocation (NNJSDA).

What is the NNJSDA?

It is an organization of dancers, who belong to member clubs. These clubs send Delegates who attend 3 meetings a dance season, usually the 3rd

Sundays in September, January and April. Anyone may attend a meeting but only Delegates can vote. Each club has one vote. Every April, the Delegates elect officers for the coming dance season.

What area is covered by the NNJSDA?

The northern half of New Jersey, the counties of Richmond, Kings and Rockland in New York, and the cities of E. Stroudsburg and Dingmans Ferry in eastern Pennsylvania.

How do I become a member of the NNJSDA?

You automatically become a member when you join a member club. There are currently 39 member clubs.

What does the NNJSDA do for you?

- 1. Publishes **Grand Square**, which provides club and Association news, as well as information on the many other facets of the square dance activity.
- 2. Provides insurance for the dances and classes of member clubs (exception: NY clubs).
- 3. Holds a special Summer Mainstream Dance Program for new graduates, beginning the last Wednesday in June and continuing for 10 weeks.
- 4. Has a FREELOADER Program for new dancers which is earned by attending 8 of the 10 Summer Dances. The Freeloader entitles you to attend 6 Association Dances FREE during the next 2 years.
- 5. Holds Special Plus Dance Programs on the 5th Fridays or 5th Saturdays of the dance season, usually with national callers and cuers.
- 6. Holds a Mini-Festival, featuring Mainstream and Plus, every November for a full day of dancing.
- 7. Sponsors a biennial Leadership Program, called L.U.S.T., held in September in even numbered years. The next L.U.S.T. is Sept. 1992.
- 8. The Association makes available booklets for Mainstream and Plus classes, diplomas and special packets of information for new graduates. The Associaton also awards a special dangle for perfect attendance at classes.

Some of my favorite blouses are the ones made out of T-shirt knit fabric. My customers have seen them on me and have asked for them so I've been making them for the "rack". The fabric is warm in winter and cool in summer because it is a nice poly/cotton blend that "breathes" on the

body but also has thermal qualities.

A couple of dancers commented that they've tried sewing on this type of fabric but the stitches don't stitch right. They wondered if I had a special sewing machine. The answer to the machine question is - No - I still use my Singer that I bought in 1968. It was the top of the line that year (a Golden Touch & Sew delux zig-zag model 630), and I have had to send it in for repair several times in recent years (because I use it A LOT), but it is just a regular home type, oldie but goody, sewing machine.

The mystery of why my stitches on knit fabrics stitch properly has nothing to do with my machine. The solution to this mystery is in the sewing machine needle you use. You need ball point needles made for knit fabrics in the right size. They make all kinds of needles - for several woven weights, several knit weights, leathers, denim & jeans - not to con you into spending money on unnecessary extras,

but to help you do the job the easiest way possible.

And you don't really need a zig-zag machine for these kinds of knits. Most of my seams and even hems can be done on a straight stitch machine. The zig-zag is great if you have it, on rolled hems, such as on the neck and at the bottom hems because you will only have to fold over the fabric once instead of twice.

However, some knits stretch out too much when you zig-zag on them. If I'm using that kind of knit then I run a straight stitch around the edge first, then fold over and

zig-zag.

You can even buy ready made T-shirts and cut the necks down lower. When I do this, I put the shirt on, mark the lowness with chalk, then take it off, finish sketching my chalk guideline, and, before cutting, straight stitch on the chalk line. Then I trim away the high neck 2" above the

stitches and fold over and in, and zig-zag the rolled hem.
You can add narrow trims or lace to "feminize" You can use fabric paint if you're artistic the T-shirt. and patient enough. Or you can embroider a fancy edge or When I make my T-shirt blouses I woke design.

make full sleeves with elastic in the hems for that pretty peasant look.

By the way, these are great for traveling, because they fold and pack well without needing a lot of pressing. Hope you'll be traveling to the convention. Jud 12







Most dancers used the buzz swing and swung much longer in the early club dancing years than they do today, allowing the caller more patter opportunities. Some swing patter:

Swing your honey just a little bit harder
Don't look now, there goes my garter.
Swing your honey and keep on goin'
Your shirttail's hangin' and your petticoat's showin'.
Best shirt's hangin' on the old clothes line
You swing yours and I'll swing mine.

Some patter served as trailing patter for the grand right and left and leading patter for the promenade, such as:

Big white horse and little red wagon Hind wheel broke and the axle draggin' This one's pretty, that one's sweet Grab the gal with the great big feet And promenade.

Some trailing promenade patter:

Promenade with your pretty little maid
If she don't like whiskey, feed 'er lemonade.
Promenade on the ole cowhide
Like a bowlegged groom and a knock-kneed bride.
Promenade and around you go
You ain't a raggin' now like you wuz awhile ago.

BMI/ASCAP

Where does your club fit in the BMI/ASCAP picture? Representatives from both Callerlab and Roundalab met with representatives from BMI/ASCAP during the fall and early winter months to negotiate a licensing agreement between the organizations. It was determined that it would be less expensive (and thus better for both activities) to secure a blanket license for callers and cuers rather than place the promoters of any dance events in the position of having to seek individual licensing. The cost for a club or other event sponsor to obtain appropriate licenses for just ONE event would be between \$22 and \$30 per dance regardless of the type of dance.

Both Roundalab and Callerlab are requiring 100% participation of ALL U.S. members. The licensing will be effective April 1, 1991 through March 31, 1992. If your callers and cuers are members of Callerlab and/or Roundalab, the club is covered.

PLEASE PUT IN MORE ROUND DANCE NEWS IN GRAND SQUARE!!!

We've heard this request many times since we became Editors. But we can't report what we don't have. We really need someone who is interesed in Round Dancing to be a liaison to the NNJRDLC and to report on the Round Dance world at large.

LETTERS TO THE EDITORS ...

Solitaires was formed by this Association over a decade ago in recognition of the need in our area for a singles club. As some of you may remember, the Club flourished for quite a while, but during the past few years began to wane. They could no longer afford hall rental or callers, and were forced to stop dancing near the end of the season. I felt that this need still existed and decided to keep the club alive. A club for single dancers benefits all Association member clubs by providing their single members a place to meet other single dancers and to dance without feeling as though they are a burden to others.

At the last Delegates Meeting it was mentioned that, thanks to the efforts of Dolores Gesumaria, a hall was found in Oakland for Solitaires and their first dance of the season was announced. Two callers and two cuers performed at that dance to give the club a good sendoff. I was to be the regular club caller and agreed to run the club for the time being. At this juncture, a comment was made that since Solitaires had been dropped from NNJSDA membership, they were no longer covered by insurance and that dancers should be careful about attending dances on this account. I am sure that the statement was not made maliciously, but the effect was devastating. At least one club raid was cancelled as a direct result of that remark and who knows how many dancers were dissuaded who would otherwise have attended Solitaires dances (especially the opening dance). Actually, the statement was misleading to say the least. At that first dance more than \$4 million of liability insurance was in effect, as well as property damage insurance. Each of the leaders present were members of Callerlab or Roundalab and carried liability policies with those organizations as well as additional insurance with CCNJ. At subsequent dances, there was admittedly less insurance in effect, only \$2.3 million. I feel that this is adequate coverage. Since there are no club officers, the only responsible parties are the caller and cuer. I do not think there is any risk on the part of anyone attending a Solitaires dance.

As in years past, we **NEED** Solitaires, and Solitaires needs you. Support in the form of encouraging your single members to attend - perhaps even going with them can only be beneficial to everyone. Single class members should be made aware of this group and urged to join. Solitaires is not another club "competing" for your members - it is a utility, a service to you to accommodate your single members and allow them to enjoy this activity to the fullest without feeling compromised by having to rely on other couples splitting up to dance with them or hope that another single dancer shows up.

Dances have been scheduled on occasional Sunday afternoons from 2-4 PM. I have been careful not conflict with any other club's time slot and have tried to avoid special dances scheduled such as student dances. Our schedule is among your flyers. Please make your club aware of us, and support YOUR Solitaires.



The Lioyd Shaw era callers usually started a tip with introductory patter, such as those in the opening lines of this piece, and closing patter to wrap up the tip. Some other examples of opening patter:

Pick up the tail chain, throw in the sprague Whistle at the nipper and watch us rag. Crack the whip and jerk the line

Let's all start dancing and have a good time.

Some patter used to end a tip:

Ladies, salute your gents
Lock horns now arm in arm
Start up the trail, drift two by two
Refreshments have their charm.
All to the middle with a whoop and a holler
Now the girls come up and kiss the caller.

Most modern callers slip a few of these colorful lines into their patter, especially in some singing calls, but, for the most part, extended patter has gone the way of the somewhat elongated routines or dances popular 30 or 40 years ago. So . . .

Thank you folks, I've had a ball Hope you have too -- kenno, that's all!





ATTENTION KNITTERS

There have been many stories about the plight of thousands of orphans in Rumania. They are cared for under extremely poor conditions in governmentrun orphanges. Two or three babies share a crib and supplies are desparately needed. Recently, while I was on vacation, I was discussing this situation with a woman from England who is also a knitter. She told me of a group of women in her town who have decided to provide handknit blankets for these little ones using leftover yarn that often goes unused. One of her friends has agreed to sew or crochet the handknitted squares into blankets and then send them to Rumania. I offered to knit some squares myself and ship them to England. I hope you will be willing to help me out by knitting a square or two. I will even provide you with left-over yarn if you haven't any. You may use any size needles and varn weight but the square must be 12" x 12". Please use garter stitch throughout so the square will lie flat. Following is a pattern you can use: 12 " x 12" Square: worsted weight yarn (approx. 144 yards); size 8 needles

Cast on 45 stitches. Knit every stitch of every row until the piece is

12" long. Bind off. (That's all there is to it.)

My goal is to send 50 squares to England and I would appreciate any help you can give me. Please call me when you are done and I will arrange to pick up the squares. Thank you in advance for your help on behalf of myself and the orphans of Rumania. Lois Bichler 718-356-2208
