Youlll need $\frac{1}{4}$ yd. of heavy iron-on interfacing \& 1 yd. of $45^{\prime \prime}$ fabric (cut across in (3) $10^{\prime \prime}$ widths) or $374 y d$. of $60^{\prime \prime}$ fabric (cut across in (2) $10^{\prime \prime}$ widths). The extra $0^{\prime \prime}$ or $7^{\prime \prime} \times 45^{\prime \prime}$ or more is for the man's tie winich Ilil repeat in the next issue. (see Fig. A s. B.)

Jith right sides together, sew the strips end to end making one long strip. Jress seams open. Cut your interfacing into (2) $9^{\prime \prime} \times 22 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ pieces. One strip at a time, iron 2 layers of the interfacing (sticky side to the wrong side of fabric) on the center of your long strip, allowing $\frac{1}{2}$ " on both long edges. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise, right sides together. Stitch as shown in Fig C or D stooping about 4 " before interfacing. Trim the diagonal points off \& turn each end right side out. ress, folding the raw edges of the center section to the inside. Topstitch opening very closely to the edge.

This is a double wrao length. Wherever you want the bow to be (front, back or side-front) is where you must center the sash and start the wrap. Experiment with wrapoing
