WELCOME NEW DANCERS



You are reading **Grand Square**, the Official Publication of the Northern New Jersey Square Dancers Assocation (NNJSDA).

What is the NNJSDA?

It is an organization of dancers who belong to member clubs. These clubs send Delegates who attend 3 meetings a dance season, usually the 3rd Sunday in September,

January, and April. Anyone may attend a meeting, but only Delegates can vote. Each club has one vote. Every April, the Delegates elect officers for the coming dance season.

What area is covered by the NNJSDA?

The northern half of New Jersey, the counties of Richmond, Kings and Rockland in New York, and the cities of E. Stroudsburg and Dingmans Ferry in eastern Pennsylvania.


How do I become a member of the NNJSDA?

You automatically become a member when you join a member club. There are currently 35 member clubs.

What does the NNJSDA do for you?

- 1. Publishes **Grand Square** five times a year, free of charge, which provides club and Association news, as well as information on the many other facets of the square dance activity. Look for copies at your club.
- 2. Provides insurance for the dances and classes of member clubs (exception: New York clubs).
- 3. Holds a special Summer Mainstream Dance Program for new graduates, beginning the last Wednesday in June and continuing for 10 weeks.
- 4. Has a FREELOADER Program for new dancers which is earned by attending 8 of the 10 Summer Dances. The Freeloader entitles you to attend 6 Association Dances FREE during the next 2 years. A blank Freeloader card is in your graduation packet. Have it signed by the Treasurers at every summer dance you attend.
- 5. Has a PATRONS AWARD for visiting 26 member clubs on their regular dance night. A blank Patron's card is in your graduation packet. When you visit a member club, have the treasurer or president sign and date the card.
- 6. Has a "One Square is Fair" Award (presented now twice a year) for member clubs who have at least one square in attendance at Association Specials and Summer Dances.

- 7. Holds Special Plus Dance Programs on the 5th Fridays or 5th Saturdays of the dance season, usually with national callers and cuers.
- 8. Holds a Mini-Festival, featuring Mainstream, Plus and Advanced programs, every November for a full day of dancing. Next Mini-Festival is Nov. 8th.
- 9. Sponsors a biennial Leadership Program, called L.U.S.T., in even numbered years. The next L.U.S.T. is October 4, 1992.
- 10. The Association makes available booklets for Mainstream and Plus classes and diplomas for graduation.
- 11. Assembles special packets of information for new graduates which is presented at graduation by an Association Officer. The Associaton also awards a special dangle for perfect attendance at classes.
- 12. The Association provides Dance Clearance, through the Recording Secretary, of all special club dances to prevent conflicts.
- 13. A Blood Bank Program, #9192, provides coverage for all members and their immediate families.
- 14. Sponsors a Poster Contest (see page 7) every year to foster interest in square dancing, and distributes publicity packets.
- 15. Provides a forum for discussion and dissemination of flyers at Delegates Meetings.
- 16. Has a NJ State Dress Chairman who has the pattern and the fabric for the green and white vest that is a part of the NJ outfit. This outfit is worn at the National Square Dance Convention for the parade of states as well as other special occasions to identify the dancer as being from NJ.

1992 POSTER CONTEST RULES

OBJECT OF THE CONTEST: To stimulate interest in square dancing.

1. Anyone is eligible to enter whether or not they are square dancers.

2. Any number of entries may be submitted.

- 3. ALL posters MUST be 11" x 17," done in black on white paper or poster board.
- 4. Subject may be any square dance theme, but MUST include:

a. National Square Dance Month - September

- b. Sufficient space left for each club to fill in their own class or open house information.
- 5. Avoid "localizing" the poster to any one geographic area, as it will be used in New Jersey, New York and Pennsylvania.
- 6. Mail or deliver entries to 3rd VPs, Joan Daniels and Ray O'Neill Joan: 31 Oban Street, Staten Island, NY 10312 (718-984-6642) Ray: 31 Buel Avenue, Staten Island, NY 10304 (718-987-0257)
- 7. All entries MUST be received by Friday, May 29, 1992. Judging will be May 31st by the NNJSDA Executive Board.
- 8. All entries become the property of the NNJSDA and may be displayed at National and State Square Conventions.
- 9. The winning poster will be reprinted by the NNJSDA and distributed during the Summer Dances for use in promoting classes.
- 10. The winning poster will be featured on the cover of the September Issue of Grand Square.
- 11. The winning artist(s) will receive appropriate recognition at an NNJSDA Summer Dance.



Mainstream clubs designating the day and week they dance. After you find a club dancing on the day you wish to dance, look next for the Advertisers' Index on the inside back cover to see on what page that club's ad appears. Attend as many Mainstream dances as you can. The more you dance, the better you will be able to dance and the more fun you will have.

4. Starting June 24, 1992 and for the following 10 weeks, the NNJSDA (your Association) will be sponsoring Mainstream dances in air-conditioned

halls. The next issue of Grand Square will have all the details.

5. What about vacations out of state? Yes, you can dance in all the states and selected countries around the world and all the dances are called in the language you have learned. The source of information about where to dance is the "National Square Dance Directory." Many clubs have the book available for their members to use. Ask the president of your club.

6. The National Square Dance Convention is in Cincinnati, Ohio, this year

June 25-27. You can dance there.

7. There are weekends. Look for flyers with Mainstream dancing specified.

So.... the opportunities are there for you. Go out and make the most of them. Thanks to your angels, your teacher, and the club who sponsored your lessons, you have all the knowledge you need to go out and enjoy our wonderful activity. These people deserve a world of thanks for bringing you along and helping you over the rough spots. This club, YOUR CLUB, always deserves your support and help because it is the club that brought you into the world of square dancing.

Up until now we have been talking to this year's graduates. The next

paragraph applies to all dancers.

From our first lesson, there is always someone giving so that we may enjoy dancing. If someone does this for us, shouldn't we be doing our share for someone else? Remember to pull your own weight. No one is ever weightless. We always need to do something to keep our activity afloat. At the September Delegates' Meeting we talked about paddling a large boat full of many people. The smallest paddle and the largest paddle are important in making our boat (the Association or your club) go forward. If you are in the boat, use your paddle. The smallest paddle helps (attendance at club and Association affairs). A larger paddle is even better (bring refreshments, help decorate, tell someone they did a good job). Or... you could take the big paddles to steer the boat (take a leadership office when you are needed). Everyone needs to do something every year so we can all have fun and fellowship. What are you doing next year?

Now that dancers are graduating from nine months or so worth of "How-on-earth-does-he-expect-us-to-remember-that?" classes, and visits to other club dances are starting to become a regular thing, a word is in order about club dancing etiquette.

All of the more experienced dancers, of course, already know all these things and need not read further...hmmmm. While square dancing has strong traditions and is steeped in the past, it is also a living and breathing social activity that changes daily. You see this in some of the newer calls being added


and in the different types of music being used.

Dancing at a new club usually involves getting there. Before travelling any distance to a new club, call to be sure the dance is still on and in the location listed. It is one of the unbreakable traditions that square dance club maps will very definitely and very clearly get you within 5-10 minutes of the hall, so give yourself an extra 10-15 minutes when visiting a club for the first time. It would help to have a road map of the area and be sure to take the contact telephone number with you in case you have problems.

Once at the dance, join the nearest open square. It is not good form to run past a square to join friends on the other side of the room. And it is a definite nono to leave a square once you have joined it. One tradition that is quite nice is that the gentleman in the number one spot (back to the music) says hello and shakes hands with all the others, making everyone welcome in the square.

During the dance, smile, smile, smile. Better to be thought of as a little daffy

Meeting called to order by President, Dick White at 1:35 p.m. Executive Board members present were:

Dick opened the meeting by welcoming the Delegates. Dick asked for a roll call of the Delegates. Two clubs were not represented: Al"e"Mo Squares and Ocean Waves. Besides the delegates and alternative delegates of our 35 member clubs, there were 9 Club Presidents and 5 Class Coordinators in attendance.

He then asked for approval of the minutes of the Delegates' Meeting of September 15, 1991. A motion was made that the minutes be accepted. Motion carried.

OFFICERS' REPORTS:

Treasurer's Report summarized: Checking Account Balance as of 12/8/91, \$7,009.75; Receipts 12/8/91 to 1/19/92, \$3,705.50; Disbursements, \$837.54. Checking Account Balance as of 1/19/92 \$9,877.71. Treasurer's report filed for audit.

1st VPs report summarized: Hal distributed a list of the upcoming specials. Flyers were distributed for NNJSDA Specials of 1/31/92 with Cliff Brodeur, and 2/29/92 with Jim Mayo at St. Aloysius Hall, Caldwell, NJ. Callers and cuers have been contracted for Summer dances, 1992. Hal suggested that flyers be marked in the upper right hand corner with a letter (CL, B, M, P, A, C) indicating the program of dance, as he has done on the flyers for the special dances.

2nd VPs report summarized: Student Mid-term dance will be held on Sunday, January 26, 1992, 2-5:00 p.m. at St. Aloysius Hall, Caldwell, NJ. Eleven callers are scheduled. The Graduate Questionnaires have been distributed. Return deadline, February 29, 1992. Student Spring Fling to be held Sunday, April 26, 1992, 2-5:00 p.m. at Hillside School in Bridgewater, NJ. Sample packet was distributed to Class Coordinators.

3rd VPs: No report. They have not received any materials from clubs for the scrap book to be displayed at the National and State Convention. Each club is allotted two pages, which could include snapshots or anything else that shows the activities of the club. Included with the delegates' flyers is a letter to the Club President requesting these items. Booster Tags-Ray asked that everyone support the drive by each dancer purchasing a tag for \$1.00, rather than each couple buying a tag.

Corr. Secy report summarized: Thank you note was sent to Bob and Gloria Wyman for the donation of \$100.00 to the Association from the former Club, Cloverleafs. Invitation was sent to Hunterton Flutterwheels to join us at the Delegates' meeting. Dangles and badges were ordered and received. As of this date two clubs have not submitted rosters: Al"e"Mo Squares and Ocean Waves.

Rec. Secy report summarized: Granted 2 requests for clearance for special dances; wrote 6 letters on various matters.

Past President/Mini Festival report summarized: Mini Festival 11/17/91, at Bridgewater, NJ. was very successful, with 72 3/8 squares attending. Joyce & Jim Kelly thanked everyone who helped and especially the delegates. Plans are underway for the 18th Mini-Festival to be held 11/8/92. Registrar, Mini-Festival: Norman & Audrey Bolin. Report summarized. Norman reported that the Mini-Festival was a financial success, with 551 paid square dancers. The Festival showed a profit of \$1,425.26. This was the second best attended Mini-Festival. Norman thanked the delegates for

their help in the ticket sales. **Advisor**: No report.

Grand Square report summarized: Winter issue of Grand Square and Booster Tags are being distributed at this meeting. Next issue (Graduate's Issue) is due out March 8th, 1992. Deadline was Continued on page 48

in the head for smiling all the time, than to be a sour puss. Since none of the experienced dancers are reading at this point, I can say this (in a quiet voice). When you find an experienced dancer in your square frowning, it is more likely that the dancer has just zigged when he or she should have zagged and they are not frowning at you. There are seven other dancers responsible for the square, not you alone.

Breakdowns are a fact of life. The reasons include: the other dancers couldn't hear; variable gravity; mental attack by Martians, etc. How they are handled is a function of training. Get into facing lines as quickly (and quietly) as possible for a patter, or into squares for a singer. Then wait to hear and be ready to react to any one of the following calls: "allemande left," "normal lines up and back," "right and left grand," "weave the ring," or "circle" and keep on trucking. So keep these tips in mind and get out and dance, dance, dance.

It's hard to believe that it is 1992. Seems as if we only began this season's dances and here we are halfway through.



I'm a"fabric junkie" and am surrounded by what some people would consider a small fabric store. I love fabric sales and the inspiration I feel in a real fabric store. I buy fabric the way Imelda Marcos buys shoes. I'm comforted by just having it there waiting for my creative flashes (as opposed to my hot flashes).


And yet there are days when I don't know what I want to make and am afraid that if I cut some great fabric that I found into some idea that comes to mind, then I'll regret it later on when maybe I'll think of something better I could have done. Do you have days like this?

I'm sure this has happened to you, too.

These are the times when I look at my "leftovers". (I don't throw decent size scraps away. By decent size I mean anything over 4" wide in almost any length or shape.) I have them stored in color families on shelves in my workroom. (You could use bags or boxes stored in closets or spare drawers. I use them for appliques, yokes, patch pockets, sashes, ruffles, sleeves and ---- depending on the size of your "leftovers" gored skirts (coordinating your colors).

If you don't have a pattern for a gored skirt but do have a pattern for a circle skirt, then just fold your pattern in quarters or thirds or whatever fits your "leftovers". Multiply the number of panels folded times the number of pieces of the original circle skirt that you would have needed and that's the total number of gores you will have to Before cutting add 2" on each fold edge for a seam allowance.

Also, be careful of cutting on the straight of the fabric. The straight should be up the center of each gore. (It's not impossible to use gores that are cut with the straight edge on a seam. It is just very difficult to get bias cuts & straight cuts to sew together easily without one stretching, and, if (2) 45° bias cuts are sewn together in one seam & (2) straight cuts are sewn together in the next seam, to hang properly without sagging at the hem.)



One nice look with gores is to make every other one the same solid color and put different coordinating prints in between. You could then sew a contrasting but coordinating color lace trim up each seam on the solid 103 Westervelt Ave. color. Pockets & zippers need to go in side Staten Island seams before trimming. Waistband (or bodice) NY 10301 and hem are done after gore assembly & trimming as if this was a regular circle skirt (or dress). I should have saved this column for a Halloween issue. 



January 17, 1992. Booster Drive will continue through February. Kathy reminded the delegates that she would like to get \$1.00 per Grand Square reader rather than \$1.00 per couple. In this way, Grand Square can break even. Approximately 2,000 copies are printed each issue and costs approximately \$1.00 to print. Advertising covers a percentage of the cost, but the funds raised from the Booster Tag sale are definitely needed to (almost) break even. Financial report, 1990-1991: Receipts \$8,059.50, Disbursements \$8,744.81, Loss, \$685.31.

Education: Len & Joan Anfinsen presented a program concerning the treatment of students. The theme was "Have you earned your HALO?" They asked the delegates: Do they smile often? Do they encourage them as often as possible? Have they asked a student to go to a dance with them? Do they advise the students to attend the NNJSDA Summer Dances? If you have done any of the above, you are on the way to earning a HALO. Joan and Len also discussed the different ways to make students comfortable at the dances by dancing with them and introducing them to other dancers. Len gave halos to the delegates that had admitted doing any of the above and many other little niceties for the students. They informed the delegates that Callerlab was offering a Community Dance Program with 24 basic moves, for people who do not want to make a long term commitment. Michael Rubinfeld, from Harmony Dancers, announced that their student class had been cancelled. COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Insurance Report summarized: Fred & Kathryn Hill. Fred thanked Hal and Florence Margo for preparing the CLAIM FILING PROCEDURE and NNJSDA INCIDENT REPORT, that he distributed to the delegates. Both documents are printed on shocking pink paper, so it will not get lost by club officers. Fred stressed the importance of reporting all incidents, of which the club officer has knowledge, immediately. He also emphasized that a club officer should not make any statements as to the club's liability.

SDCNJ Delegate's Report summarized: Norman & Audrey Bolin. No Report. Dick and Shirley White attended the meeting. They have \$7,600.00 in the checking account and a C.D. with \$8,600.00. They have formed a committee called "Investment in the Future Committee." Clubs can ask SDCNJ for funding on certain projects.

New Jersey License Plates Report summarized: Frank & Helen Cavanaugh. Frank stated that as of this date approximately 236 people have requested license plates. We need 500. He expressed that he was disappointed in the lack of participation by the members of the Association. He had asked for 6 members from each club to purchase the vanity license plates but has had a very poor response. He will be soliciting participation at the State Convention in April. If the response is poor, he will drop the project.

State Dress: Rich & Rose Ericson - No report.

Blood Bank report summarized: Donna & Bill Anderson. The drive was cancelled for today. She did not receive notification from the delegates for the required number of donors to have a blood drive. If we do not have the required number of donors, we will not be able to continue with the Blood Bank. She advised the delegates that they can donate blood on their own and we can get credit for it. The only thing required is that they send her (at the address shown in Grand Square) the blue carbon copy that the Blood Bank fills out and gives to the blood donor.

Even if, for some reason, they do not accept your blood, we still get credit for it, as long as you have the blue carbon copy. If you can volunteer for the platelet donation, the procedures takes 1 1/2 hours, we get credit for 10 units of blood. They are to give the Blood Bank our number, which is in **Grand Square**, #9192. Our plan is so liberal to family members of square dancers that we should not lose our blood bank status.





1. Ask the nurse or technician for the entire blue form.

2. Send it to Donna Anderson. We will still get credit for the donation.

We are working on scheduling our next donation in conjuction with L.U.S.T. on October 4th. In order to have the Blood Mobile on site, we must have 90 or more donors lined up. Therefore, registration is essential. As we come closer to the date, we will be asking the clubs to give us a list of donors.



THOUGHTS FROM THE PAST




