

### L.U.S.T. is FREE and open to all dancers!




Dear Readers,

### NJ STATE SQUARE DANCE OUTFIT Our State outfit consists of the following:



### LETTERS TO THE EDITORS .

There seems to be an ever-increasing trend to dance when and where we please, without wearing a club-affiliated badge. That way there is no responsibility.... Where will it end?

If we have no raids, the club attendances fall off, as do the funds. Without funds we cannot pay the caller, cuer, hall, etc., and the next step is--another club has folded.

It certainly is true that we cannot have all things, but if everyone would do one small part and do it well, then the end result would be accomplished. Why is it okay to have someone else do for us and not do something in return? Is it too much to ask plus dancers to give two nights a month to dance with and support a mainstream club that gave them their roots? If all dancers move to plus, then who is there to run the mainstream club? Surely not the new dancer?

We all enjoy the extra touches that some clubs do at their dances, but when some suggestions are made at their clubs to try some of these, suddenly everyone fades into the woodwork.


Thanks for sending us information about square dancing in your area. It contributed to the success of our 6-week square dancing trip.

I have already referred to the "In This Issue" item to look up something I wanted to call to Sol's attention.

Sila Dell'Angelo had suggested I read the letter, "My Opinion" by Judy LaDuca, that you reprinted from *Dance Magazine*. Sad to say--but it had to be said. I hope that those women who are guilty of "gross" conduct will see themselves and act accordingly. After reading the article by Dick Mazziotti, I was reminded of an incident that took place many years ago when we were presidents of the Association. 



Another year of lessons has passed by so quickly. New round dancers will be joining us enjoying our great activity. Some will be apprehensive (remember?) and the encouragement you will be

### SAY WHAT???

### by Dick Mazziotti, Caller/Teacher

So you've graduated from a Mainstream class, gone to a few local dances, and are about to travel on summer vacation, bolo and crinolines packed. In other words, look out other clubs, here we come!

First, how do you find local clubs in Aberdeen, Scotland (there is one and some of the men dance in kilts, giving new meaning to "sashay"), or Tupelo, Mississippi? The National Square Dance Directory is published each year and is available at square dance shops or often through local clubs. It lists names and phone numbers, nights and program of dancing for all clubs everywhere. Also, many caller or club associations take ads in the local Yellow Pages under "Dance, Square." So please enjoy one of the fruits of square dancing, the universality of the calls you've learned, to dance anywhere in the world.

No matter where you dance, the calls are in English and they have the same meaning. Once you can dance Mainstream, you can dance Mainstream anywhere.

Having said that, even Callerlab, the arbiter of call definition, recognizes that there may be "local variations." Aha! Here is a "local variation" story. Our head angels, the year we took Mainstream lessons, went out west on vacation, found a large club dancing on a convenient night, and went to the dance. There is a Plus call, "track two," that here in the East elicits a loud and universal "TOOT TOOT" from the dancers. Of course, our friends, wanting to be known as accomplished Plus dancers, upon hearing the caller direct, "track two," both gave out with a loud...and solo... "TOOT TOOT!" An entire floor of 15 squares stopped to look at them! Arrrgh!

Here are some local variations that you might run into:


-- Arm turns: In "swing thru," for example, we teach a "hands up" palm-topalm touch. Other areas use arms at waist level with the hand slid part way up the opposite arm, as we teach for "turn thru" or "allemande left."

--Dosado: Arm around the waist, or two hands around, or a simple two-hand touch and back away are among the many variations used in other places.

--Star thru: Many Advanced program dancers get used to just tapping hands rather than holding the man's right and lady's left throughout the call.

--Weave the ring: There are probably as many variations on this call as there are dance clubs. By the way, one acceptable way of not getting involved in the slap-pull-push-twist-bump-throw-your-hip-out moves on this one is for the men to grip their belt buckle or back pockets, and the ladies to take two handfuls of skirt while weaving in and out.


This is not meant to be a treatise on local variations, but you should be aware that they exist, and not be totally thrown by some small variation. Some you will like. Some are just plain dumb. However, you have been taught the "correct" and universally acceptable way to do all the calls. At a new club, watch, listen, and, where possible, go with the flow. And remember our motto here at square dance camp: "SMILE ANYWAY."




