SD LICENSE PLATES
At this time, ALL plate applications are being processed and approved by the NJ Motor Vehicle Department. They are also in the process of making the die for the plates, including a silk screen of the dancers to improve their clarity. Presently the plates are scheduled for February 1993 distribution. However, it is possible that they may be ready for distribution as early as late January.

As of January 1, 1993, all new applications for the square dance license plates will now cost $\$ 30.00$. Any NJ resident wishing to apply for the plate may still do so. There are plenty of application forms available in this area. Bob \& Gloria Wyman (201-569-9120) have been manning a sign-up table at all NNJSDA events. Call them if you need an application form.

And now square dancers are discovering other dance forms that are done to the same music (thanks to Club Dance on the Nashville notwork). Were also discovering that there are only 7 days in a week in which to do it all. Wire also concerned about what to wear, wherever we are going. This is not as confusing as it might seem. And since I do try to do it all (Square Dancing, Country Western Dancing \& Clogging) let me try to be of assistance.

Gentlemen - you can go from a square dance straight to a Country Western club without any change at all. But if you want to "get with it" a bit more, change into cowboy boots (leather soles dance better than composition or rubber soles) or the ankle high boot-looking shoes. A cowboy hat is a nice touch if you can "take the heat". It gets warm real warm - under a hat if you dance a lot.

Ladies - you may wear your square dance clothes but the slip will be best left in the car. Your shoes are acceptable at a Country western club, but you too may want to put on some cowgirl boots. The way I go from a short square dance skirt to the long, elegant Country Western skirt (which looks best when it at least meets the top of your boot) without changing, is to take off my square dance slip and replace it with my basic white (or black or whatever color you prefer) $30^{\prime \prime}$ long, ruffled poly/cotton slip. I make these by first making a 6 (or more) gored, full circle S.D. skirt (my normal length) of the $p / c$ and then adding a $p / c$ ruffle which $I$ cut $10^{\prime \prime}$ wide. By the time I've joined my $23^{\prime \prime}$ and the $10^{\prime \prime}$ with a seam and taken up a hem, I'm somewhere near $30^{\prime \prime}$ in length.

The reason the slip should be gored is because when you add the weight of the ruffle to a plain circle sizirt cut without seams or with only 2 side seams - then the bias parts of the fabric will pull down and stretch with the extra weight and look like this $\longrightarrow$


This one basic slip can be worn under many of your square dance skirts. I like a plain circle skirt of either a print or a solid color. And because they are both full

Everybody asked Somebody to do the jobs that needed to be done. Somebody did the job time and time again until Somebody noticed that Everybody wasn't doing their share. Somebody then asked Everybody to pitch in and do their part or else Somebody would let Nobody do the jobs. At clubs like these, people come to classes to angel, not as a duty, not just to socialize, but to help the new dancers see the enjoyment of the activity, which helps the new dancers learn

## HELLO NEW DANCERS

Welcome new dancers to the wonderful, wacky world of square dancing! This article is directed to you brand-new dancers, who are still taking classes. Warning! It should not be read by anyone who has already graduated and knows how to square dance.

Are your classes thoroughly confusing you yet? Have you heard of Raids, L.U.S.T. and Callerlab? Are you convinced there is no caller except your instructor that you can understand, and even him/her not very well? Have we confirmed to you that call names are chosen with obfuscation paramount? Did you know that more than a quarter of the 62 Mainstream calls start with the letter " S " and that over a third are four-letter words?

While we who have been dancing more than 6 months try to be encouraging and tell you, "Smile, don't worry. You'll get it," the truth of the matter is, "Yes you WILL get it," but you have set yourself a daunting task. You are more than half-way through the Basic/Mainstream list. These past months you have learned much more than you might think, and there is lots more to learn.

But, by now you shouid have learned some of the essentiais of square dancing, and we don't mean "do-sa-do." By now we hope you are learning to have fun: fun socializing; fun breaking down (we have learned to call it "interpretive" square dancing); fun starting to go to other class-level dances; fun meeting likewise thoroughly confused new dancers from other clubs; fun achieving a higher skill level (remember when "square thru" brought tears to your eyes and silent curses to your lips). The entire purpose of a class is to bring you to a skill level where you can enjoy ALL the other benefits.
