



the Mainstream clubs with the day and week they dance. After you find a club dancing on the day you wish to dance, look next for the Advertisers' Index on the inside back cover to see on what page that club's ad appears. In addition, **Grand Square** has a dance calendar showing dances by date. Attend as many Mainstream dances as you can. The more you dance, the better you will be able to dance and the more fun you will have.

'ONE SQUARE IS FAIR'

- Starting June 23, 1993 and for the following 10 weeks, the NNJSDA (your Association) will be sponsoring Mainstream dances in air-conditioned halls. The next issue of Grand Square will have all the details.
- 5. What about vacations out of state? Yes, you can dance in all the states and selected countries around the world and all the dances are called in English. The source of this information is the "National Square Dance Directory." Many clubs have the book available for their members to use. Ask the president of your club.
- 6. The National Square Dance Convention is in St. Louis, MO, June 23-26. You can dance there too.
- 7. There are weekends. Look for ads in **Grand Square** and flyers that specify Mainstream dancing.

So.... the opportunities are there for you. Go out and make the most of them. Thanks to your angels, your teacher, and the club who sponsored your lessons, you have all the knowledge you need to go out and enjoy our wonderful activity. These people deserve a world of thanks for bringing you along and helping you over the rough spots. You are reading **Grand Square**, the Official Publication of the Northern New Jersey Square Dancers Assocation (NNJSDA).

What is the NNJSDA?

It is an organization of dancers who belong to member clubs. These clubs send Delegates who attend 3 meetings a dance season, usually the 3rd Sunday in September

and January, and the 1st Sunday in May. Anyone may attend a meeting, but only Delegates can vote. Each club has one vote. Every spring, the Delegates elect officers for the coming dance season.

What area is covered by the NNJSDA?


Half of New Jersey from Mercer County north to the New York border, the counties of Richmond, Kings and Rockland in New York, and the counties of Monroe and Pike in eastern Pennsylvania.

How do I become a member of the NNJSDA?

You automatically become a member when you join a member club. There are currently 36 member clubs.

What does the NNJSDA do for you?

- 1. Publishes Grand Square five times a year, free of charge, which provides club and Association news, a dance calendar, interesting articles, as well as information on the many other facets of the square dance activity. Look for copies at your club.
- Provides insurance for the dances and classes of member clubs (exception: New York clubs).
- 3. Holds a special Summer Mainstream Dance Program for new graduates, beginning the last Wednesday in June and continuing for 10 weeks.
- 4. Has a Freeloader Program for new dancers which is earned by attending 8 of the 10 Summer Dances. The Freeloader entitles you to attend 6 Association Dances free during the next 2 years. A blank Freeloader card is in your graduation packet. Have it signed by the Treasurer at every summer dance you attend.
- 5. Has a **Patron's Award** for visiting 26 member clubs on their regular dance night. A blank Patron's card is in your graduation packet. When you visit a member club, have the treasurer or president sign and date the card.
- 6. Has a "One Square is Fair" Award (presented twice a year) to member clubs who have at least one square in attendance at Association Specials and Summer Dances. Continued on page 6


- 7. Holds Special Plus Dance Programs on the 5th Fridays or 5th Saturdays of the dance season, usually with national callers and cuers.
- 8. Holds a Mini-Festival, featuring Mainstream, Plus and Advanced programs, every November for a full day of dancing. Next Mini-Festival is Nov. 14th.
- 9. Sponsors a biennial Leadership Program, called L.U.S.T., in even numbered years. The next L.U.S.T. is scheduled for October 2, 1994.
- 10. The Association makes available instruction booklets for Mainstream and Plus classes and diplomas for graduation.
- 11. Assembles special packets of information for new graduates which are presented at graduation by an Association Officer. The Association also awards a special dangle for perfect attendance at classes.
- 12. The Association provides Dance Clearance, through the Recording Secretary, of all special club dances to prevent conflicts.
- 13. A Blood Bank Program, #9192, provides coverage for all members and their immediate families.
- 14. Sponsors a Poster Contest (see page 7) every year to foster interest in square dancing, and distributes publicity packets.
- 15. Provides a forum for discussion and dissemination of flyers at Delegates Meetings.
- 16. Has a NJ State Dress Chairman who has the pattern and the fabric for the green and white vest that is a part of the NJ outfit. This outfit is worn at the National Square Dance Convention for the parade of states as well as other special occasions to identify the dancer as being from NJ.

1993 POSTER CONTEST RULES


Object of the contest: to stimulate interest in square dancing.


- 1. Anyone is eligible to enter whether or not they are square dancers.
- 2. Any number of entries may be submitted.
- ALL posters MUST be 11" x 17," done in black ink on white paper or poster board.
- 4. Subject may be any square dance theme, but MUST include:
 - a. National Square Dance Month September
 - b. Sufficient space left for each club to fill in their own class or open house information.
- 5. Avoid "localizing" the poster to any one geographic area as it will be used in New Jersey, New York and Pennsylvania.
- Mail or deliver entries to the 3rd VPs, Frank & Carol Homer, Box 149, Long Valley, NJ 07040 (Tel: 908-876-3029).
- All entries MUST be received by Saturday, May 15, 1993. Judging will be May 23rd by the NNJSDA Executive Board.
- 8. All entries become the property of the NNJSDA and may be displayed at National and State Square Dance Conventions.
- 9. The winning poster will be reprinted by the NNJSDA and distributed during the Summer Dances for use in promoting classes.
- 10. The winning poster will be featured on the cover of the September issue of Grand Square.
- 11. The winning artist(s) will receive appropriate recognition at an NNJSDA Summer Dance.

GRADUATES, DID YOU KNOW???

You may join ANY club after graduation, but you should always remain loyal to your "mother" club. Be an angel next year. Tell all your friends about square dancing and encourage them to take lessons in the fall. Every club needs new members. Be an active and helpful member of your club. Help set up and take down chairs and tables; offer to bring refreshments; volunteer to help decorate. Do you have skills that would help your club such as creating ads or flyers? Do you have access to a copy machine? Offer to run copies of flyers. Your club needs you!

CENTURY CLUB PIN

You can earn a Century Club Award (pin) by obtaining the signatures of 100 different callers. A Century Club Book is available at most square dance shops and badge makers. You may have as many as 3 callers sign your book in one day. If you forget the book, you can use a blank piece of paper and insert it later. Tip: the first page is usually reserved for your instructor.

Twenty-one lively Western Wheelers raided our Holiday Dance in December and raised the level of our fun from great to super.



Lenny S. from Merri 8s called to ask about yokes. Thanks for the column idea Lenny!

Newcomers may wonder why we dress so colorfully and creatively. I think the main reason this probably started is to help the caller. Let me tell you from my new experience as a student in Betsy Gotta & Dan Koft's beginners Caller's classes that it is difficult keeping track of who belongs where if the caller is sight calling. Those wild and crazy outfits are an enormous help.

Most times the lady is lucky if she can get her man wear a solid color shirt that matches her outfit. She to is really lucky if she can get him to wear a tie that is made of a print from her outfit. She is truly blessed if her partner likes to have his shirts made of the same material as her outfit. Now somewhere between the tie and the shirt

is the compromise of a vest or a shirt yoke. I haven't looked in pattern books lately (because I make my own patterns), but I would think with the popularity of Country Western music there would be several shirt & yoke patterns available. I know years ago Quik Sew patterns (which I found at the Mill End fabric store on Rt. 18) had both western shirts & just shirt yokes (with several varieties in one pattern envelope).

To make your own pattern just lay his shirt down flat (first the front then the back) and, on paper, trace the neck & arm seams, the shoulder fold line (I make a seam here) &, if you already have a western shirt, the yoke shape. I cut the yokes longer & sometimes, especially the backs, in different western shapes (working with fabric print designs). Then add seam allowances. For the front you only have to trace one side & cut 2 (making sure you face the pattern opposite when you cut the second one). I do not worry about copying the original shoulder seam because it's going to be covered anyway. Clip curves, then stitch shoulder seams, right sides together. (Try this with muslin before using good fabric in case you have to adjust your pattern.) Mark





center back of shirt & yoke & pin right side of yoke to right side of shirt in this up-side down position. (Fig. 1.) Use a zipper foot & sew yoke around bottom of collar. Fold under, pin & stitch all remaining edges (this is not easy, be patient) - or - roll under bottom of yokes & stitch

(without sewing to shirt) & just sew shoulder & arm seams to shirt. (Fig. 2.)

Anchor bottom point of all yokes, perhaps with decorative conches. This is stylish & easier. -JUCIE

WELCOME NEW GRADUATE DANCERS




Welcome to the paradox of "graduation!" You have just graduated from your very first square dance class, and are looking forward to being a "dancer" instead of a "student." Sorry Charlie.... and Mabel and Joan and Irwin. With this graduation, you have just received your LICENSE TO LEARN!

Here's how it works. Remember when everyone told you that after graduation you'd be able to dance anywhere in the world? Well, maybe so and maybe not. You can join a square anywhere. However, you are just beginning to learn to dance. Each dance you attend, each caller to whom you dance, each corner with whom you dance, each new position from which you do a call.... all add to your experience, all make you a better dancer. And the real run in the pettipants is that <u>you are never done</u>. The up side though, is considerable: the real fun begins now.

Mazziotti's Law says, "The more you dance, the better you feel." Kaltenthaler's Korollary to Mazziotti's Law says, "The better you feel, the more you enjoy dancing." (John always was a wordsmith). Koft's Komment on John's Korollary is, "If you dance lots, you'll dance good." (Not a rhymer in the bunch.) A wise man once said, "If you want to get square dancers to dance well, you must first get their attention." He went on to say, "A two-by-four is an appropriate instrument."

All of which goes to say, you have "graduated," you have not stopped learning. Classes only teach you the calls. You "learn" to dance by dancing, not by attending classes. Please go to every Mainstream dance you can over the summer. It is very important. Continued on page 51

On another note, and at the risk of earning the undying enmity of several callers and Plus clubs, I strongly urge you to dance Mainstream for at least a year and to only take additional lessons for additional programs of dance when you are sure you can do all the Mainstream moves from all the positions with great certainty. In Sweden, where callers universally agree they are the very best dancers, they dance <u>basic</u> for at least one year before going on to Mainstream, and <u>Mainstream</u> for at least another year before going on to Plus. Please stick with Mainstream until you really know it. Remember our motto here at Camp Recycle, "First out, last in... the well-trained worm always gets the apple" (interpretations welcome).

Next column we'll deal with how to cope with sour-faced dancers (there are only a few), and more on dancing etiquette. Happy dancing and it'll be a pleasure to dance with you this summer.







This issue, let's talk about next year's lessons. Before this class graduates, talk to your current class instructor about how things are going with the class and when the next class will start (assuming you want the instructor back - if you don't, please explain why). This will allow

the instructor to plan for the coming season. Now is a good time to start thinking about your club's recruitment efforts for the fall (that is if you haven't made recruitment a year-round activity). This will allow all concerned parties (caller[s], club members, other organizations) to participate. If you wait until late summer to plan these efforts, you may find that some important people have already made other plans.


The more a class instructor is involved in what affects a class, the more successful the class is likely to be. If you hold an open dance to recruit new dancers, think about asking your class instructor to participate. Who are you planning to get to call your demos? Do you ask your class instructor to participate in club nights the class can attend? Have you ever asked your class instructor to call the graduation (or the first club night after graduating at the class)? Admittedly it may not feasible for the instructor to participate in everything, but increased involvement will ease the transitions from non-dancer to class and from class to club. The goal is better and larger classes and the key is for everyone to work together.


