THESE ARE THE VOKES FOLKS
In the last issue I told you how I sewed yokes on to ready-made shirts. However, since then I have developed a new joke trick for saving money and sewing tire.

Because I teach Country Western dancing at a local honky tonk (as well as hold membership in all three Staten Island square dance clubs) I wear Western shirts quite a lot. Rather than buy half a dozen white shirts, half a dozen black shirts and a few each of red, turquoise, yellow, etc..-..... in order to put fancy yokes on them -.-II have one of each color that I like. And I've been making detachable, reversible, silk fringe trimmed yokes that I just safety pin on to my solid colored shirts. Although you could use other methods of temporarily connecting the yoke to the shirt, such as silver western looking buttons (with buttonholes on the yoke) or velcro or snaps, you then have to think about whether you might ever want to wear the shirt without any yoke, and what that would look like. Another advantage of removable yokes is that you can launder the shirts but not the yokes - that silk fringe sometimes doesn't survive washing machines, and pure cottons can fade, shrink or run. I made a Joke pattern by tracing over the shirts' neck, shoulder fold, arm seam and pre-existing yoke (you don't have to start with a Western shirt - all those "retired" business shirts can find new life this way) and lengthening the yoke bottoms (a little on the fronts, more so on the back). Or buy a simple yoke pattern like a plain V. Anything else could be hard to work with.

I usually use a wild print for one side and a complimantary solid color on the other. But you could use two different prints, plaids, stripes - whatever you like.

I sew each yoke at the shoulder seams, then press out seams (or stitch flat with a narrow zig-zag stitch), pin right sides of both yokes together and stitch all around, leaving the neck unstitched. Clip all curves, turn right sides out, fold in the two neck seam allowences and top stitch. Press, and stitch the fringe on one side around all edges except the neck and then stitch a narrow trim, such as silver or a contrasting color, on the reverse sides' edges (the neck too if you like). You don't need to use fringe. Two different trims or one bias binding will work too. This uses very little fabric you can make "His" s "Hers" shirts, it shouldn't take long, you don't nood that many different basic shirts and it's great for traveling too, much less bulk to pack.

The members of CCNJ welcome all the new graduates to the world of club square dancing. There are three things that you should keep in mind during the first year of dancing: dance, Dance, DANCE, Dance as often as you can, at as many different clubs, to as many different callers as you can. Dance around NJ, NY, PA, or anywhere you happen to go on vacation. You will find differences in calling styie, differences in club atmosphere, differences in just about everything that goes on at a dance; except that no matter where you go, you will find that the prevalent attitude to be one that you are not a stranger, but a friend they haven't met before, and that you will be welcome almost every where you go. Before going on vacation, check with your class instructor, club caller, or club officers about a square dance directory for the areas you will be going.

One thing that you can do to improve your dancing ability is to dance all the programs up to and including the latest one learned. All the initial classes that I am aware of in this region graduate their dancers knowing the Mainstream program (denoted sometimes as MS); many have also exposed their classes to the Flus program (sometimes noted with a + ). Other dance programs in this region are Advanced (A1 and A2) and Challenge (C1, C2, C3a, C3b and C4) each adding more calls on top of the prior programs. If you graduated Mainstream, avoid dances that are listed Plus program and beyond. If you know Plus, then attend dances listed as Mainstream or Plus programs, but avoid dances that are Advanced and beyond. In no way should you feel pressured to learn a new program prior to your being ready for it. The main idea of square dancing is to dance the program where you have the most fun.

## I WENT TO THE DANCE AND THEY DIDN'T SMILE!!! by Dick Mazziotti, Caller/Teacher

Read this warning: If you are a new dancer, please read on. However, if you have been dancing for a year or more, exercise caution as this article may be hazardous to your health.

All dancers are equal, but some are equaller than others. Square dancing is a social activity. We know 'cause we've been told so. But it is also an activity requiring a certain minimal amount of skill on the part of the do-ees. Square dancing skill levels are measured in "mill arounds." This is a unit of measure based on Newton's Law that objects in motion tend to stay in motion, while objects that make straight lines tend to get back dancing sooner. If, of an evening, you score lots of "mill arounds" while those around you are dancing. your skill level may need adjustment.
"Aha," you say, "Mayhap I just do need a leetle fine tuning of my skill level so as to avoid the dreaded 'mill arounds,' how am I to get it?" Well, 'l'll tell you (that of course being the whole reason for writing all this).

- Talk to the caller between tips and ask for another explanation or walkthrough of a call.
- The answer is, "practice, practice, practice." The question is, "How do I get to Carnegie Hall?" or "How can I raise my own skill level?" Get a group together and practice in a basement. Lots of new (and experienced) callers would love to have the practice, or buy some tapes.
- Ask some of the recognized better dancers to square up with you for a special tip. Note, however, it is not good form to "adopt" a couple by trying to get into the same square the whole night long.
- But most of all, go to dances! Put another way, the more you dance,

the better you feel. The better you feel, the fewer "mill arounds" you earn (sorry, my rhyming license has expired).

What to look for over the summer: First of all, look for Mainstream dances. There are lots of them and they are designed specifically to help polish your dancing skills. Secondly, join a club. Preferably it should be the club you have taken lessons with. However, resist the temptation to join several clubs unless you have all the time in the world and want to adopt square dancing as your entire life. It is not fair to join a club that you will not be willing to work for. "What? I heard someone say, work? What do you mean, work?" Well, Virginia, there is no Santa Claus and keeping clubs healthy takes lots of work on the parts of the members. However, one of the great joys of square dancing is the social enjoyment of helping run a happy and healthy organization.

## Etiquette at the Dance:

- If they frown at you, smile back. Remember, some people were born with lips that could bite the heads off nails, or it may be that they are frowns of concentration.
- When the needle gees down, square up immediately Do not walk past a square that is forming to join another square across the room. Get into the first available square and do so quickly.
- If the square does break down, either talk lots and score high in "mill arounds," or make facing lines and get ready to continue to dance. Your choice.
- Never, never, never walk out of a square. You can put up with anything for the seven minutes of an average tip.

And remember our motto here at camp, "When all else fails, blame it on the caller. " Happy dancing.

Answers: Yes, but we can't figure out why. Yes, but we can't figure out why. So far, but we keep losing them and don't know why.

I believe there is a solution, based on listenting to dancers from successful clubs eisewhere in the country. But it wouid require a radical change in thinking, and would only work if all the clubs worked together in a spirit of cooperation for the benefit of the activity. Hold class the same night as the club dance.

Can't be done you say. Why not? Some couples are unable to dance at a local club as often as they wish because the local club dance is on the same night as their home club's class night and they want to angel. Another club is unable to get enough angels for class because their dancers are already out three nights a week and don't want to give up another night. Many club officers are running themselves ragged, trying to be at every class, their own club, and visit other clubs. Students and new dancers see this and say not me. Try a positive approach instead. Hold class the same night as the club dance.

This has been done successfully in other parts of the country. Students feel part of the club from the very beginning; angels have another free evening; club officers don't have so much pressure.

Are we interested in the activity or just our night out? In a few years, will our favorite club still be there when you want it? Perhaps now is the time to take some positive action, radical as it may seem.
