Blend:


1 cup confidence



SPECIAL RAID PROGRAM

Due to the overwhelming success of the Raid Program, the Executive Board has voted, with one small change, to offer it for the 1993-1994 dancing year. If you complete your Raid Card, no dues will be payable to the Association for 1994-1995.

Twenty-seven clubs have completed their Raid Card. Is your club one of them? If not, why not? It's easy! It's fun! And you meet the nicest people.

Please note the change in Rule 2:

- A club must make 7 raids to 7 different NNJSDA clubs between September 1993 and May 1994.
- Must make at least one raid to a member club out of your state.
- A raid must be made on a regular dance night, not a club special or dinner dance etc., to qualify.
- A club must raid with one or more squares. However, a club with larger membership should bring more than one square.
- 5. Your NNJSDA raid card must be signed and filled out by an officer of the visited club.

All NNJSDA member clubs are eligible to participate. Special Raid Cards were sent to the Presidents with their notice of the September Delegates Meeting. Please contact John & Joan Berg, NNJSDA Presidents, if you have any questions about the program or do not receive your raid card.

NEW JERSEY SQUARE DANCE LICENSE PLATE ALERT!

We now report 443 square dance license plates on the the roads throughout New Jersey. The last 43 plates were issued to 27 people in South Jersey and 16 in North Jersey. The plates will not be available after 500 plates are sold (unless a new chairman is found), so there are only 57 more plates available.

Getting upset won't clean the problem. Quick washing with "Magic Wand" or a similar stick cleaner you can carry in your purse might work. In case it deesn't just say, "Oh, good, new I have a Heliday Skirt (or blouse, shirt, whatever)".
Of course I have other choices. Throw it out, use it for a dust rag or get creative. Since I rarely throw anything out - and dusting is not my hobby of choice - I get creative.

cover-ups if you are that capable and have the time. A quick fix would be to sew a button or 2 or 3 or more around said

stain and get busy making hang-ons.

Every heliday has theme fabric. You only need a remnant or a 1 yd. or a single panel for this. And there's a preduct called Wender-Under Transfer Web which irons on to the back of your "picture". You can then trim around the edges without fear of fraying. You could iron this on permanently, but --- lay your art over the buttons, mark the button lecations with pins and slit "buttonholes". Now you can change these for every dance & every holiday. You can also sew leeps (of yarn, ribben, stretch metalic string, etc.) en package decerations or even old greeting cards and button on your holiday hang-ons.

Of course you may not want to wait for stained clethes to happen. And colors other than white will also work. If you will want to wear the garment without the hangens then use matching solid colored buttens. If you'd rather flaunt it, then go for the glitter, or use those edd fancy buttons from your button bex. You can use this idea on

blouses and men's shirts too - on the back and





I realize that some revivals of great songs can be horrible, such as what was done to *The Dark Town Strutters Ball*, but this is what the caller will have to watch for. I'll be happy to discuss this with anybody.

"OREGON 'N' MORE IN '94"

Portland is fortunate to have all of the convention facilities within easy walking distance of each other. There will be 18 dance halls and many meeting rooms. CAME LATE--DANCED SOME--LEFT EARLY

by Dick Mazziotti, Caller/Teacher

As always, this article is directed at the newer dancer since, of course, everyone who has been dancing for more than a year already knows everything, and would probably be quite embarrassed to be caught reading this.


"ETIQUETTE" n. derived from the Old English "eat and quit" meaning "if you don't behave at my party, i'll throw you in the dungeon." The term has fallen into disuse during the latter half of the 20th century, but in its final form meant "oil that lets bodies be near each other with comfort" (taken from a document stuffed in a mayonnaise jar found near Old Pittsburgh).

In most cases, flyers announce the time of a dance, e.g., pre-rounds 7:30-8:00 pm; squares and rounds, 8-10:30 pm. The caller and cuer or line dance leader are hired to call, cue and lead during those times. In order for you, the dancer, to achieve full measure for the exorbitant fees charged by clubs, dancers should come early and stay late rather than the other way around. As you can see, paying the full \$6.00 or thereabouts, per couple, for a full evening of dance, and then leaving early, is an enormous waste of money.

It is recognized that some dancers come a fair piece to visit another club, and for them leaving a tip or so early can mean the difference in getting a good night's sleep. For them, insisting, especially on a weeknight, that they remain till the end can be a real chore. However, it is rare that club members themselves travel more than a one-half hour to their own club's dances. Being there for the scheduled dance time is as much a responsibility for the home club

dancers as are refreshments, greeting people, and running for office.

I would also suggest that clubs, especially those that dance weeknights, think about changing their format to close up a little earlier. While it may be true that no matter when you end the dance, some will leave early, I really think it is the lateness, especially on weeknights, causing some early leave-takings.

For example, if there are no rounds, it would not be a hardship for a dance to run from, say 8:00 to 10:00 pm, asking the caller to adjust the time between tips slightly so you would still get the more or less standard 7 tips in.

In the same vein, club announcements often take enormous amounts of time. Club officers should imagine that they are visitors at their own club. Club news and club business should be handled with a newsletter, handout sheets, or a business meeting, not during announcement time. This time should be reserved for acknowledging the visitors, timely announcements of dances and 50/50... period.

As a last point of etiquette at the dance, if you are there, please dance. It can be really frustrating to see, or to be one of, three couples holding six hands in the air to fill the square and having five or ten club members sitting and staring, or disappearing into the kitchen. Again, I feel that club membership brings with it some clear responsibilities, and **cheerfully** filling out squares, especially for visitors, is one of them. It might even help to wear a button I saw the other day. It said, "I AM smiling dammit!"

Blessed are they who can laugh at themselves, for they shall never cease to be amused.

This is another plea from a couple who loves Mainstream. We finished our DBD Plus lessons from Dick Mazziotti in August, and we enjoy Plus. But why did we take Plus? In desperation! It seems that Mainstream has become the forgotten child of square dancing. Mainstreamers get the worst hall, and the worst floors to dance on almost everywhere, including the National Convention; the Trenton [NJ] State Convention, where they rotate halls, has been the only exception, so far.

Dick Mazziotti insisted that we dance a year of Mainstream before going on to Plus. Well, in that year we have found out several truths: (1) Plus dancers who go right into Plus after graduating Mainstream break down more often--and usually to Mainstream calls; (2) people expect Mainstream to be boring; (3) long-time Mainstream dancers get nervous and upset at DBD Mainstream; and (4) after a couple of years of Plus, most people forget that they started as Mainstream.

Our desperation came from wanting to go to different festivals and conventions. What we found were Mainstream dances in cafeterias (while people were eating); dances on asphalt, on carpets, in the cold outside--while Plus had wood floors and nice surroundings. What would you do?

Do we have an answer? Yes, but it is an attitude adjustment. How many men can do a "Dixie Style to an Ocean Wave" with the women in the middle, or how many women can "Courtesy Turn" a man (or as my wife says, turning the refrigerator)? These are some of the exciting and new (?) things happening in Mainstream. Every Mainstream club should ask their callers to workshop DBD and do a DBD tip besides a Plus tip (I bet the DBD will be more challenging and everyone will be able to participate).

If Mainstream clubs will allow their callers to workshop DBD Mainstream and call exciting tips (every caller in NJ has done it when allowed), then four things may happen: (1) Mainstream will not be looked down upon as boring; (2) people will stay in Mainstream longer; (3) more people, Mainstream and Plus, will go to Mainstream dances; and (4) Mainstream may get equal halls.

Square dancing is a classless social gathering--let's get back to basics and have everyone enjoy the best social event going.


