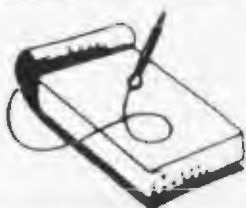

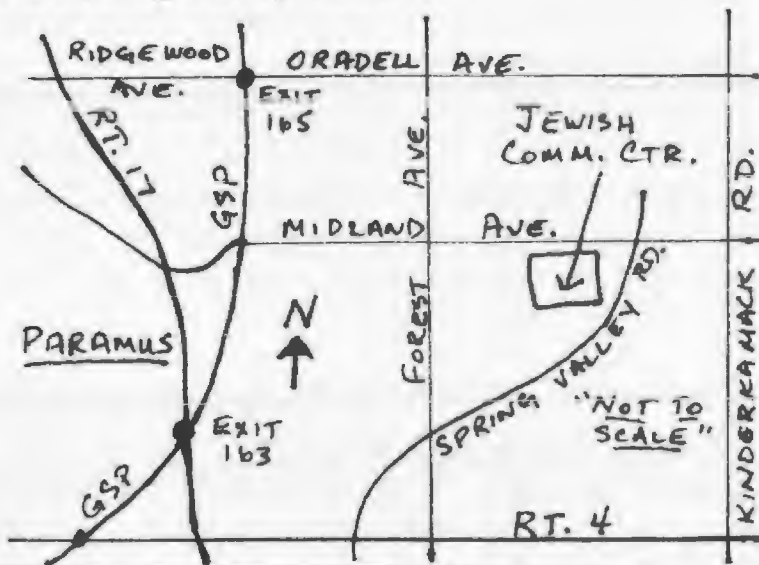

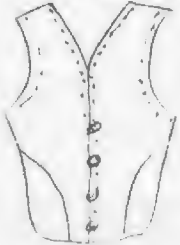

Our State outfit consists of the following:

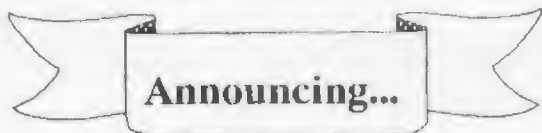

For the ladies - also a green vest, but a fitted style, with the same top-stitching and map. Ladies wear a white skirt and blouse or a white dress. There is also an optional overskirt to be made in green, trimmed in eyelet and includes a map also.

Patterns are available for both vest and overskirts at \$2.50 each plus \$.60 each for postage. Please include your size. Pattern includes star, initials and map design and directions. Each pattern gets drafted from a

master pattern so allow a little time. Also available are the green and white poly/cotton broadcloth for making vests, skirts, blouses and overskirts at \$4.00 per yard plus \$.50 a yard postage. SPECIAL RAID PROGRAM

Due to the overwhelming success of the Raid Program, the Executive Board has voted, with one small change, to offer it for the 1993-1994 dancing year. If you complete your Raid Card, no dues will be payable to the Association for 1994-1995.

Twenty-seven clubs have completed their Raid Card. Is your club one of them? If not, why not? It's easy! It's fun! And you meet the nicest people.

Please note the change in Rule 2:

1. A club must make 7 raids to 7 different NNJSDA clubs between September 1993 and May 1994.
2. Must make at least one raid to a member club **out of your state**.
3. A raid must be made on a regular dance night, not a club special or dinner dance etc., to qualify.
4. A club must raid with one or more squares. However, a club with larger membership should bring more than one square.

5. Your NNJSDA raid card must be signed and filled out by an officer of the visited club.

All NNJSDA member clubs are eligible to participate. Special Raid Cards were sent to the Presidents with their notice of the September Delegates Meeting. Please contact John & Joan Berg, NNJSDA Presidents, if you have any questions about the program or do not receive your raid card.

This is Sussex Spinners 25th year in existence. When you hit this kind of milestone, you should be very happy, and we members of Sussex Spinners are very proud of our accomplishments over these 25 years. We would like to take you on a trip down Memory Lane.

Back in 1967, one pioneer couple was introduced to square dancing while vacationing in Florida. They and another couple endeavored to figure out the instructions and calls that were on an early "Sets in Order" record. That pioneer couple, who brought square dancing to Sparta, was Andy & Hazel Lertora.

It was finally decided to start a class and by word of mouth, in the fall of 1967, about a half a dozen squares started taking lessons. Our first class instructor and club caller was introduced, and he is still calling, Dick Pasvolsky. On May 23, 1968, 19 couples graduated into the wonderful world of square dancing. In the years since that first class, many couples have enjoyed the fellowship, fun and enjoyment of being able to relax and unwind for a couple of hours of square dancing.

Sussex Spinners has always been a fun club and over the years our officers and dancers have always been involved in promoting square dancing, and it really worked as we were able to get many people to join square dancing. But lately other forms of activities have taken its toll.

We have had quite a few firsts: we were one of the first clubs to have a non-alcoholic New Year's Eve Square Dance Party; we were the first club to have class-level dances for the students; in order to honor the Presidents of the various clubs, we instituted the Presidents' Ball.

We were also very instrumental in the Northern New Jersey Square Dancers Association as well as the National Square Dance Convention. A member of Sussex Spinners was the Hospitality Chairman for the 26th NSDC in Atlantic City in 1977. With their involvement and much help given by most of the northern NJ square dancers, the Convention was a huge success. Over the years, Sussex Spinners has had two couples become Presidents of the NNJSDA, with many others assuming other executive and committee responsibilities.

The Poster Contest was a brainstorm of Sussex Spinners with two couples having their posters shown on the cover of **Grand Square**. The current insurance program, which is now offered to the member clubs of the NNJSDA, was also a Sussex suggestion and implementation. When the Freeloader and Patron Programs were initiated, Sussex Spinner dancers were among the first

We have not mentioned the names of many other people who were instrumental in the life of Sussex Spinners, but rather than risk missing someone, we kept the list very short. 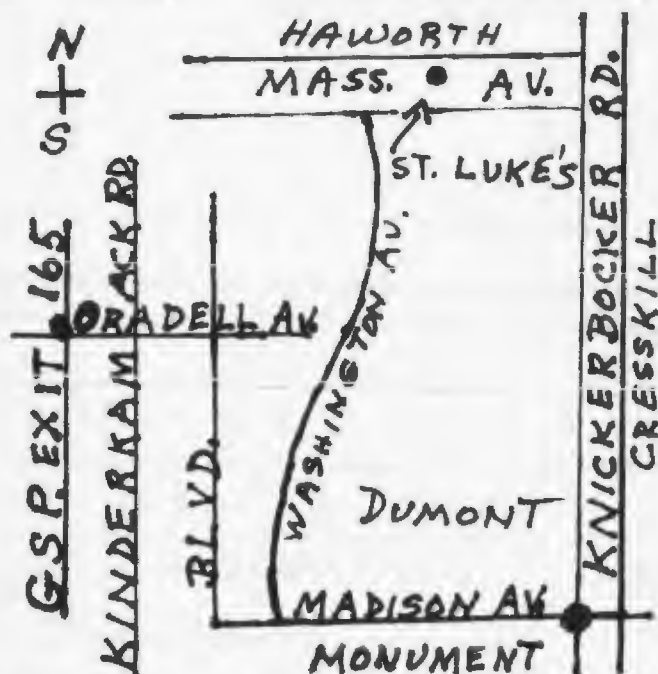
Hammer, our Moonlight on the Hudson Dance was a great success. We wish Ros & Phil much happiness in their life together.

NO FEARS OF TIERS

If you've spent any time in the Southwest of our beautiful country (or even if you haven't yet) you may be hooked on the colorful Southwestern Indian print fabrics that are now so abundant in fabric stores. I know most of them look like all-over prints to you, but try looking at them as border prints. Usually the design repeats every 6" to 18", and usually you can pick one of the divisions as dispensible. I.E. if you cut border strips then you are going to need seam & hem allowances. So figure out which area of the design you can do without and that's where you cut the "borders" apart. Next comes the high math (and you wondered why you studied math in school). To tier a skirt, decide how many tiers you're going to use. 2 or 3 seems best for S.D. (Square Dance) skirts and 3 or 4 for C.W. (Country Western) skirts. I use the "border" for only 1 tier - sometimes the bottom & sometimes the middle (so I can alter the finished length without ruining the "border" design). Please note that the following numbers are only guides for estimates. Some fabrics are too bulky to use this much, and some are so lightweight that you may want to increase the yardage to make it look "rich" instead of "cheap".

For 3 tier skirt
double each meas.

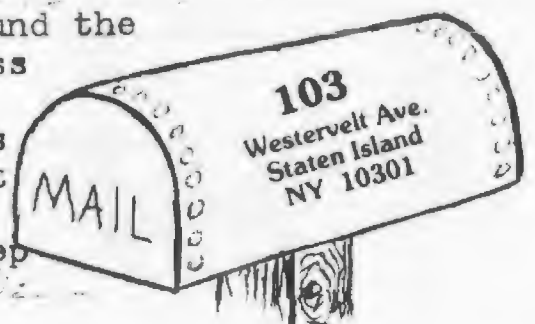
For 4 tier skirt add approx.
3/4 of previous measurement



As for length of each tier, you have to start with the finished length of the skirt desired, and subtract, divide & add. (Hmm, and some people think seamstresses don't have to be smart!) For instance, if I want a finished length of (C.W.-31") S.D.-23".....

You can do with less than 5 yds. around the hem of a S.D. skirt, but anything less doesn't spin out as nicely with the full slips we wear. As for C.W. skirts there is something very elegant about a mid-calf length skirt (at least 7 yds. around the hem) waltzing & 2-step turning across a dance floor.

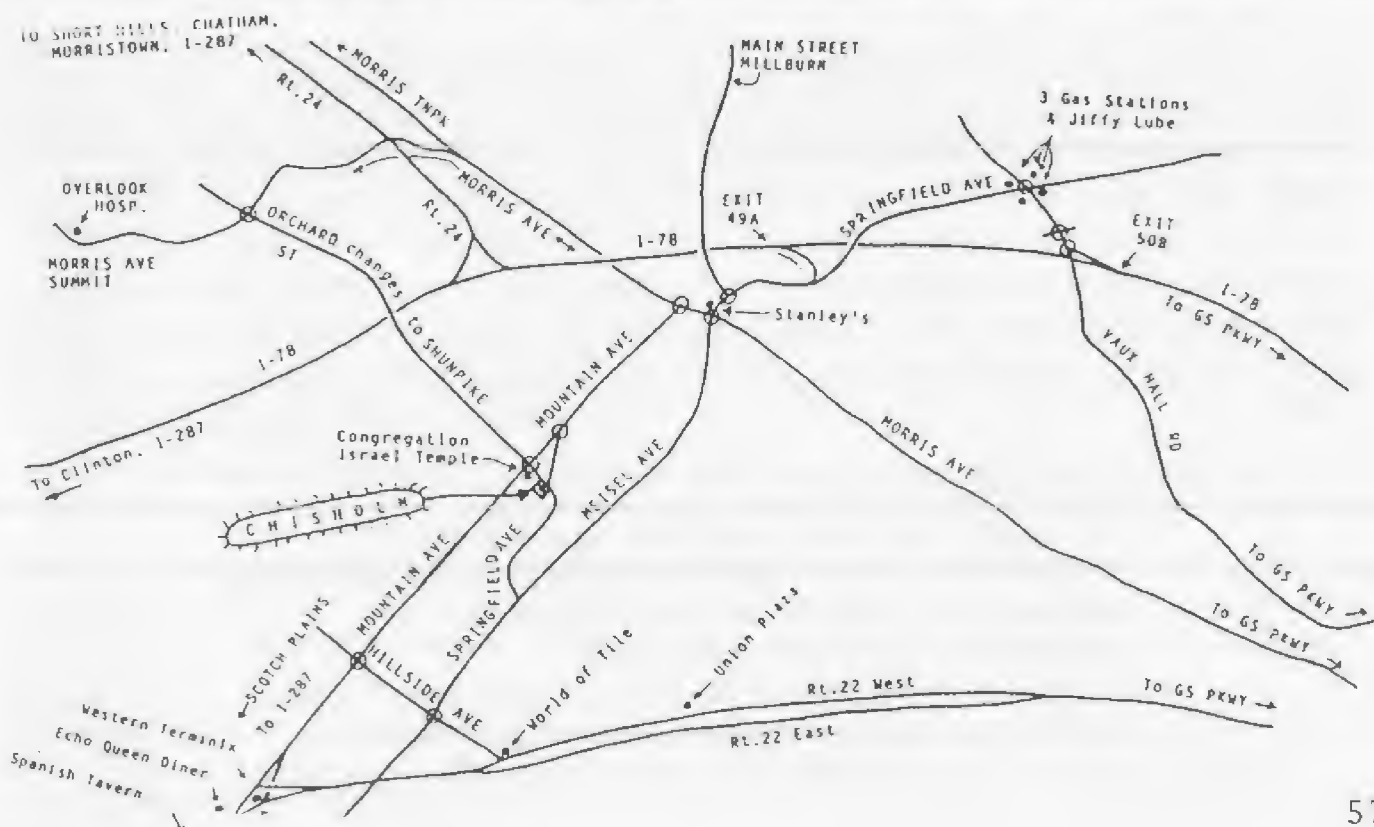

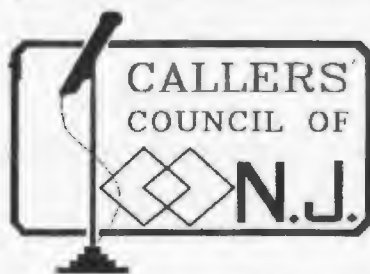

In my short time as a caller, I have already had people from our own club come up to me and ask, "How is your class this year?" Well folks, I'm going to let you in on one of the best-kept secrets of square dancing -- **the caller does not get the class. The dancers get the class.** In previous years we have asked our class members how they found out about the class. While our survey produced 20 different answers from 18 different people (two people didn't remember answering and responded twice), the common thread was that other dancers were involved. This should be a clue for successful recruiting.

You are responsible for bringing in new dancers!

A Story:

Charlie Stranger and Mable Wannadance went to their local fair. As they were snaring flies with their cotton candy, they heard an announcement that Flows & Blows Square Dance Club was giving a demonstration. Off they went to see the show. Here's what they saw: a group of old people, all grim-faced, dressed in outlandish clothing, doing impossibly complicated routines. I wonder why we have trouble recruiting at demos?

Charlie, notoriously shy, was then grabbed by a predatory lady, dragged out in front of his friends with a couple of other hapless people and 3 small children, and had proven to him with great hilarity that he doesn't know left from right. I wonder why he didn't sign up?

At the end of the demo, Mable had a question she wanted to ask the dancers

because, in spite of it all, she thought the music was nice and was interested. But the dancers had all retreated to one side and were talking with each other about an upcoming weekend, so she decided not to try and break in. I wonder why we don't get anybody to sign up at demos?

Mable's friend, Wanda Twinkletoes, did corner one of the dancers to ask about learning to square dance. She was told, "Oh yes, we'd love to have you. The classes start sometime soon, but I'm not sure when. Wait, I think we have a flyer here. Oops, I can't find one, but check around and yes, we'd love to have you." I wonder why they don't sign up at demos? *End of Story.*

Concerning another aspect of recruiting, we must recognize that we are getting older (I'm not, but the rest of you are). As we age, the people with whom we are in contact, and thus the population from which we recruit, are also aging. The rejuvenation of square dancing means re-youthing, getting people involved who will have some juices left and who can get enthusiastic about a new idea. Now please don't write me mad letters about the very youthful older dancers we have. Our last class had some sterling examples of very "young" older people. Nevertheless, to brighten the future of square dancing, we need to reduce the average age of the dancers. Somehow, we have to plug into the young marrieds, the teenagers, school groups, church and synagogue youth groups.

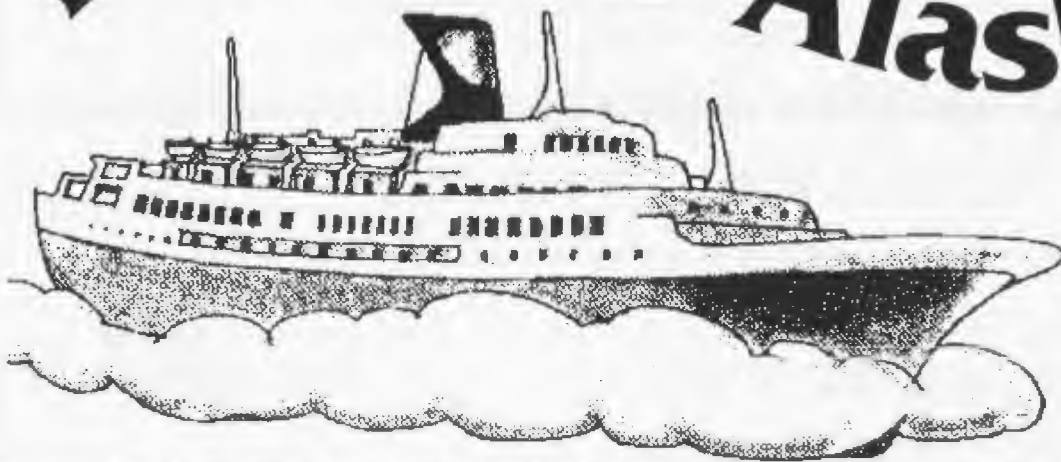

The Mainstream Quarterly Selection Committee has selected **Acey Deucey** for the period beginning September 1, 1993. Start: Ocean Waves (most common), Two-Faced Lines, Lines (less common) other formations where there are ends that can circulate without becoming centers. Ending formation: from Ocean Waves, the result is waves; from Two-

Faced Lines, the result is Two-Faced Lines; from lines facing out the result is Lines Facing In (ending position depends on starting position). Action: Ends Circulate as Centers Trade (If centers are both facing the same direction, this is a Partner Trade; if ends are both facing in the same direction, they will usually pass someone.). The other current MS Quarterly Selections are: **Cross Roll to a Wave**, and **Single Circle to a Wave**. The MS Emphasis Call is **Fan the Top**. The Plus Quarterly Selection is **Transfer the Column**. The Advanced Quarterly Selections are: **Shakedown**, and **Checkover**.

Proper program designations help dancers find a dance where they can be most comfortable and can have the greatest enjoyment. Dancers should be able to dance, in accordance with their definitions, the number of basics or movements as shown below:

Basic (B)	Numbers 1-50 on the Callerlab Program.
Mainstream (MS)	Numbers 1-67 on the Callerlab Program.
Plus (+)	The MS Program and 28 calls on the Plus Program.
Advanced 1 (A-1)	All the above programs and 40 calls on the A-1 Prog.
Advanced 2 (A-2)	All the above programs and 79 calls on the A-2 Prog.
Basic Challenge (C-1)	All the above programs and 71 calls on the C-1 Prog.
Extd. Challenge (C-2)	All the above programs and 71 calls on the C-2 Prog.






NEW DANCERS' BILL OF RIGHTS

The following New Dancers' Bill of Rights was developed by Callerlab and adopted at the 1988 Callerlab Convention:

A new dancer has the right:

1. To a class experience that is both educationally and socially enjoyable.
2. To patient and dignified treatment by the class instructor(s) and sponsors.
3. To gain experience dancing to other callers and, if possible, with dancers from other classes, prior to graduation.
4. To receive advice and assistance in acquiring appropriate clothing for square dancing.
5. To instruction and practice using the approved definitions, timing and styling for each listed call (Basic, Mainstream, etc.).
6. To information about the history and heritage of our present square dance program.

Callerlab encourages all callers and square dancers alike to help put the **Fun and Friendliness** back into Square Dancing.

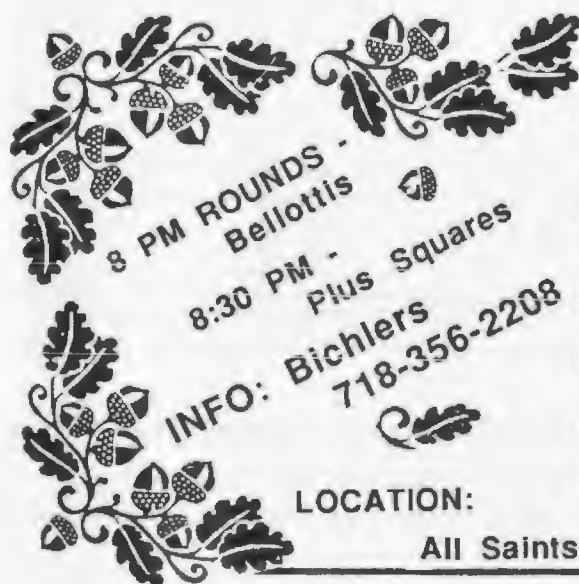

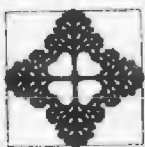

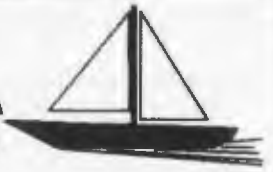

Thank you to all the clubs who sent in their Booster Tag money. We especially want to thank Lakeland Squares and Circle Eights, who held special booster dances. Many thanks to Cross Trail Squares, who sent an additional contribution, and to CCNJ for their **very** generous contribution. There were a number of clubs who donated more than they collected from the sale of the Booster Tags (in line with our request for \$1.00 per member) and many individuals who sent contributions. Unfortunately, there were some clubs who sent significantly less than the \$1.00 per member, or who sent nothing.

The time, effort, and expense of the Booster Tags is overwhelming, even with the help of the 3rd VPs to send reminders and make phone calls, not to mention the burden on the Delegates to "sell the tags." So, based on our recommendation, the Executive Board has voted unanimously to drop the Booster Tags. Instead each club will be assessed, in January, \$1.00 per member based on their membership roster. Non-member clubs will be assessed according to the number of copies they receive. We will still print the same number of copies; distribution will remain the same; copies will be available for students; and you may ask for additional copies anytime. **Grand Square** continues to grow and change. This issue is an all-time high of 76 pages. We are committed to giving you as much square dance information as possible, but we still have to pay the printer. We can no longer count on "donations" to keep us solvent. If the proceeds of the Booster Tags gave us the \$1.00 per member we requested, we would have been in the black. This assessment will insure that everyone contributes their fair share.

New this issue: the maps now will appear in the September issue; and all classes will be listed from beginner to challenge and round dancing. It was quite a feat, but we are sure that as the dancing season begins you will be happy to have the information. **Please save this issue and keep it for future reference.**
