Hi! I hope you all had a great holiday. I think I gave all the best gifts I could find and afford to my family. I also am starting a tradition for myself to follow for Christmas, Valentine's Day, Mother's Day and my birthday. To insure that I' ll get a gift I really want I am going to give myself a present. That way if I can afford something nice, Ill give it to myself and don't have to worry that the receiver will feel the need to reciprocate in like manner. And if I'm broke at the time, I'll get myself something small and I won't feel like a cheapskate or feel the need to apologise. of course Ill still give to my family just like before, I've just added me to my shopping list, Who best knows what I want or need?

This year I bought myself a new sowing machine for Christmas. Nothing very fancy, I only spent $\$ 230.00$ but this Singer SPARTAN machine has a free arm, a serger attachment, makes ruffles without an attachment, sews leather and sews thick denim along with zig-zag and hem stitches. And it goes evenly from one thickness of fabric to several thicknesses without the problems I had with my 24 year old Singer Golden Touch \& Sew 630 model.

However, if you are still working with a machine that gives you trouble, like breaking sewing machine needles when you back into thin sections from thick (or going into thick from thin) because the foot angles up in the front and the needle no longer lines up with the slot in the foot, try this.

Fold some junk mail to the thickness of your sewing project, lay it behind the material as you backstitch, and push and pull the paper along with the fabric as you sew. One of the times this always seemed to happen was when I was attaching thick trims. Another was when I was trying to knot the beginning of my thick seam by back-stitching before sewing forward. Even if you accidentally stitch into the paper it won't bend the needle like metal or plastic might, and it is easily trimmed away without cutting the threads.

By the way, if you do get little snagging hooks on the ends of your needles, you can file them to a nice smooth point with a metal nail file.

are going to be urged to, "Get out and go to dances!!!" This is not a plea by Exxon stockholders to spend money on gas. These are the words of wisdom, the tablets from the mount, the Veda, Koran, Torah, and Bible of square dancing. If, during these next few months, you attend many of the available student or class-level dances, you will learn to dance, you will enjoy the activity, you will continue to dance. If you only attend class, if you do not go to available dances, if you do not dance to other callers and with other students and Angels, you will have wasted at least one complete semester of work.

In this day electronic imagery, flying bits and bytes of information, optical cable and laser disks, the square dance world, communicationally speaking, has barely discovered steam. We communicated through a system of hand delivered, often hand drawn, sometimes legible, often inaccurate pieces of decorative paper called flyers. In each club, one blind and deaf person is designated to produce an informational sheet telling where, when, and what dances are taking place. At every dance, in every club, there will be a table of flyers that you can look over, take, and use, to attend student dances. Each club welcomes student dancers with open arms. You don't have to be a perfect dancer. You do have to smile. You don't have to know all the calls perfectly. You do have to get into a square and try. You don't have to understand every direction of every caller. You do have to experience as many as you can.

So here is Mazziotti's Suggestion of the Month: Club member, invite students to go with you to dances. Students, get together with other students and car pool to a dance. Drive carefully and remember, any club-prepared map is guaranteed to get you within 5-10 minutes of the dance! Good luck to all of you, and I hope I have the pleasure of calling for you, and dancing with you.
