## '94-'95 RAID PROGRAM

At the September Delegates Meeting, the rule changes for the '94-'95 Raid Program were presented and the new Raid Cards distributed.

A club raiding seven (7) NNJSDA member clubs in one dancing season will earn a free NNJSDA membership the following year.

Requirements:

- 1. Must raid seven (7) different clubs between September and May.
- Must raid at least one club from each Area (see below for Area list).
- 3. Must raid a regular dance (not a special or dinner dance).

4. Must raid with one or more squares.

5. Members may not raid with more than one club per dance.

6. Must have Raid Card signed by an officer of the raided club. For the dancing season starting September 1994 and ending May 1995, the

#### DRESS POLICE?!!!

My wife, Rusty, and I have had some unusual comments about being the NNJSDA State Dress Coordinators. I think the best comment has been from a dancer who, although a good friend, misunderstood our function and asked if we were the "dress police." As State Dress Coordinators, we don't police your styles.

What the State Dress Coordinators actually do is make people aware of the state outfit and provide help with patterns. The outline of the state on the vest is my favorite part of the outfit. The star on the state tells people where you are from (those from NNJSDA clubs in Pennsylvania and New York can put their star just outside the NJ state outline). You wear your state outfit wherever and whenever you want to be recognized as a NJ square dancer, such as state and national conventions, weekends, special dances, and even a raid if you don't have a club outfit. The state dress outfit is a nice way to break the ice wherever you go.

As square dancers we do have some ideals though:

First, men should wear long-sleeved shirts, and women should wear pettipants. Everyone should wear soft-soled shoes (we are guests on many wood floors). These three things make you a caring square dancer concerned with your fellow dancers' comfort and concentration.

Second, square dancing is supposed to be fun. We love to get dressed up in matching outfits (it is even more fun to square up with three other couples in the same color combinations and dance in front of the caller). But, we don't get upset if someone wears jeans, or rushes in after work without "appropriate"


move, and we hope you will be too.

Sue & Sonny Hummer, formerly from this area and now residing Florida. visited our club in September. They were accompanied by two couples from Eastonairres.






condolences if you did not.

## WHAT IS A SOFT-SOLED SHOE?

A man or woman's shoe, specially made for dancing, with a sueded leather bottom is a soft-soled shoe. So is a sneaker or other shoes with rubber bottoms. Leather street shoes are not soft-soled and are not permitted on gym or hardwood floors. Cowboy boots and high-heeled shoes are strictly prohibited.

### THE SEWING CIRCLE SQUARED



Let's discuss belts this month. It is the one accessory that can really turn a contrasting two-piece into a coordinated outfit by pulling it together colorwise. (It also pulls it together, literally, by keeping the top in the skirt; it can keep a petticoat from drooping, and a dress figure-chic without being too snug for dancing.) It is important to remember that a belt that contrasts

highly will draw attention to whatever it is wrapped around—making it either a liability or an asset. Matching a belt to the skirt of an outfit that has contrasting top and bottom makes the figure taller; matching it to the top can make the outfit (and the figure) appear disproportionate.

Let's explore the excuses we commonly use to explain why we never seem to have a belt that goes with the outfit we want to wear:

- (2) Stiff belts pinch and ride up. (2) Elastic belts are always more comfortable.
- © I can't ever find an elastic belt of the right color © Belts are a cinch to make (sorry, couldn't resist that!). Make one out of matching or contrasting fabric: cut elastic 2" shorter than your waist measurement; this allows comfortable snugness and 1-1½" of elastic to be turned back at each end to hold the buckle. Cut a strip of fabric 2½ times as wide as the elastic and 12-15" longer than your waist measurement. Fold right sides together and sew the length of fabric into a long tube ¼" wider than the elastic. Turn right sides out and pass the elastic through the tube, centering the seam on the inside of the belt (not on an edge); stitch or serge across elastic and tube on each short end to hold the elastic in place.
- ② I don't have any/enough elastic. ② Buy 1½"-2" wide elastic. Have several yards cut at once, or buy 10-25 yd lots (available in catalogs). Even 25-yard lots, which make at least 25 belts, will usually cost less than \$18. Then you'll always have some available. As a last resort, buy the more expensive elastic pre-packaged in 1-2 yard packages, but expect some waste. Have several short pieces left over? Zig-zag several of the same width together and cover.
- ② If you'd told me about this before I cut the dress out, I could have done it. Now I don't have anything but fabric scraps left. ⑤ Sew the scraps into a flat strip the right size; the extra 12-15" is needed to allow for stretch, but it also disguises stray seams. Or, make the piecing an obvious fashion detail--embroider over each seam with contrast or metallic thread.
- ⊜ I can't find the right buckle. © Fashion buckles that are "folded" into the belt end are available in fabric stores, but they cost about \$10 each; buy your favorite and move it from belt to belt. You'll certainly get your money's worth out of it for a little effort each time. (If your buckle isn't "movable," put snaps or Velcro on the belt ends, and just unsnap them to remove the buckle.)
- ③ I don't want to keep moving buckles around, and I can't afford expensive buckles. ⑤ So shop for belts at flea markets—you know the boxes everyone else avoids (25-50¢ a belt or less.) Select buckles that fasten without prongs, because these don't work well with elastic. Also look for elastic belts; if the elastic is long enough to fit you, the elastic can also be re-used inside your next belt. Shopping in a retail store? (See that hot pink belt with the 3-ball buckle your favorite square dance shop reduced to \$2.50?) Look for any belt that has the right buckle; if it is elastic, cover it to make it match; if not, just use the buckle. Really swell buckles can be found on the most outrageous belts, often at reduced prices. Grab it, cover it, and reattach the buckle. Buckles can be up to ½" wider or narrower than your elastic and still look fine.
- That hot pink belt is too wide for me. 
   One popular square dance belt has several rows of stitching down the middle for stability; since you are covering it completely, you can cut away some of the width if necessary, and still not have it unravel inside the casing. (Don't bother to take the fabric off—it is a terrible chore and an absolute waste of time.)
- So do I have to sew all those rows of stitching down mine? ☐ Not unless you like extra work-and don't mind when the elastic stretches permanently out of shape. If you do prefer this style, buy the 1½" sport elastic that has unbraided rows in it; this is designed not to "grow" when decorative rows are sewn along it, but since it is designed for pajamas, it is less firm than regular elastic.

What? No more objections? So, all right, go to it and do it!!!





## THE HOLIDAYS ARE UPON US (REFLECTIONS ON THE DANCE)

There I was the other day, traveling down the information highway, about to write this column aimed at the newer dancers among us, and a thought interrupted me (sort of like a swerve to avoid electronic roadkill). It was, "Things ain't the way they used to be. And what's more....they never were!"

For example, at almost every dance lately, it seems someone proclaims loudly, "I can't hear" It always seems to come out loud enough to drown out the next three calls so any hope that their square and the two immediately beside them had of continuing to dance or of recovering goes down the porcelain fixture. It is only good manners and breeding (and the fact that Laurie would kill me) that

keeps me from shouting back, "Well...try listening!!"

See, it used to be that the caller had the possibility to call the dance in a manner that can be understood by at least half of the floor half of the time...mostly. And the dancers had the responsibility of making a half-hearted attempt to comply with grace, good humor and closed lips. Advice to the dancelorn (that's like lovelorn, does anybody know what a "lorn" means?): If you miss a call, look around quickly and see if you can get a clue from what other dancers are doing instead of yelling at the caller. Of course, if you really get lost, yelling at the caller is often the best way to breakdown enough squares that he or she will start over. Mission accomplished.

Concerning things not being the way they were, it would be really nice to reinstitute one of the old traditions. It was called "politeness." It had several

guises.

Immediately after a tip people used to clap for a minute before grabbing hands, bowing down and loudly proclaiming, "Thank you" (or "Thank goodness,"





harder and harder to please, but I know of one on whom it works.

It also used to be taught that you joined the first available square you came to rather than hunting all over for the "perfect" square upon which to bestow your favors. Some go as far as to dance the whole night long with the same people. Borrrring!!! Well, all I can say is that Laurie and I, and most of the people we've danced with, have had more hoots and hollers and laughs over breakdowns and near-breakdowns than we ever had with "perfect" squares. Let us try, just for one evening, all joining the very first unfilled square we come to.

And another thing (he said, firmly astraddle the soap box), it used to be that a caller's spouse was asked to dance at every tip at every club. Lord knows that they are often forced to dance either part often enough just to fill in a square. They mostly do it with good grace and smiles all around. And there are still some old-time gentlemen and ladies who try to make sure the caller's spouse is not sitting and knitting the whole night long. It would be nice to see clubs start that

as a policy.
