





The program was then extended to the Summer Dance Program with a separate award for "One Square Is Fair" at the Wednesday evening dances.




The response to the Raid Program has been overwhelmingly positive. Proof positive of this statement is the participation in the program by 29 out of 36 NNJSDA member clubs.



THE SEWING CIRCLESQUARED

September is National Square Dance Month. It is also National Sewing Month!!! What a wonderful month to start writing a column for my fellow dancing fabricaholics. Judy has done a fine job with it for many years, and has set a fine standard. We wish her ever more success with her Country & Western teaching.

Why me? Well, perhaps I should start by telling you a little about myself. HI! MY NAME IS RUSTY, AND I AM A SEWER. I could call myself a seamstress, but I hate titles that can only be used for one gender. I do qualify as a tailor, but most people think that it refers to a man (it is actually ANY person who makes or repairs tailored garments), and besides, square dance clothing is not exactly "tailored." 

take the strength of two people to pull apart, and they never go back together without a gap, even with pliers. Always TWIST one side sideways slightly. They twist back together easily and without a gap, AND without breaking a nail. It is so quick you can do it on the dance floor. I also found this today in the current issue of *Threads Magazine*: put one side of the ring in the slot of a plain screw and twist; the screw gives a better grip on the tiny ring than just your fingers, and no tools are needed. Simple?

By the time you read this, we will be weeks away from the October L.U.S.T; we have a session for sewers planned. I look forward to meeting you all. See you in THE SEWING CIRCLE SQUARED.





ON BEING AN EXPERT

(or, How to Earn Your Wings in Advance of the Pearly Gates)

by Dick Mazziotti, Caller/Teacher

As usual, this column is directed at the newly graduated dancers. Warning, reading this column after dancing for more than a year can cause hair loss in men and anatomy droop in women.

So you've danced your knitted footwear off all summer long, you are supporting your home club, and classes are about to start again. A whole new crop of eager-eyed, young, pliable and impressionable new dancers are gathering. Your caller is preparing his or her notes on how to teach calls in the most confusing ways. Class coordinators are gathering water jugs and roster sheets (100 lines apiece in anticipation of a large class), and YOU have been approached to help with the new class as an ANGEL!

Here comes your chance to show off, to explain, to be the expert, to guide and form these malleable minds into the proper frame to be a TRUE SQUARE DANCER. Well guess what? It's untenable bubble expansion time!

Let me describe the **Perfect Angel** ("PA"). The PA smiles always, but allows no other words but "THANK YOU" to cross his or her lips. When dancing, the PA is always in correct position and completes his part of each call properly, ending each call at the proper place with hands up ready to touch his neighbors. A PA never talks in the square. A PA NEVER, NEVER tries to explain a call. A PA is perfectly willing to attend every class, stand quietly to the side if not dancing, but be ready to leap joyously into any square any time when asked by the teacher. There are very few PAs.

There are other kinds of angels:

Brightly Stimulating: The BS angel talks, and talks, and talks. The BS angel is capable of ignoring interruptions by the caller such as explanations or actual calls. Continued on page 67



Freebie: This angel is here to take the class again since he has not danced all summer long, has forgotten any calls ever learned, and does not want to pay to take the class as a new student again.

Get Rough And Shove People: The GRASP angel yanks and tugs and pushes new dancers. Dancers leave his square with bruises, contusions, and fingermarked anatomical appendages.

Another angel/devil related issue is when to join a square. Angels often hold back from squaring up, ostensibly to "make sure all the new dancers get into a square." Unfortunately, what this politeness looks like to the new dancers is, "They don't want to dance with us!" Because of this, we now use computer squares for our classes. Each angel couple and new dancer couple alike gets a computer slip so everyone is expected to square up immediately. Grossly unbalanced squares can and should still be straightened out by the caller.

Concerning bad habits: It seems that it takes about 1/4 of a student dance before new dancers start to pick up bad habits. ANNOUNCEMENT TO ALL ANGELS: Please attend your class when the call, "Circle to a Line" is taught, so you can learn once again how to do it. Slap 'n slide is NOT Circle to a Line, should not be done at all, and surely should not be done with new dancers. Yet many angels seem to feel slap 'n slide is a mark of becoming an experienced dancer. It isn't. It is a sloppy and mis-timed way to get into the same position as the real call. Please join me in a campaign to relearn Circle to a Line.

Having said all the above, we callers also all too often forget to say "THANK YOU" to the angels who do a good job, who do come faithfully, who dance the Plus or Advanced programs, yet completely support Mainstream classes. You are the real "heart" of square dancing. You help inject levity, show (not teach) styling, and help the new dancers' transition to the club. From callers everywhere to angels everywhere, "THANK YOU!"


The only current Plus Quarterly is **Double Your Neighbor.** Connect the **Diamond** was voted to be dropped.

Chase Chain Thru was voted as the Advanced Quarterly Selection for the September-December 31, 1994 period. Starting formation: lines back-to-back; action: Chase Right, but the original beaus make a wave in the middle when they meet. In the wave, Swing, Slip and Swing, then Extend. Ending formation: parallel waves; timing: 14 beats. Checkover and Scatter Scoot remain on the list and Chisel Thru was voted to be dropped.

"Lost Squares" is the method of returning a broken square to dancing and should be taught to all dancers: **Dancers' Responsibility:** 1) Return to home position. 2) Head ladies take their corner's hand; head couples will back out to form lines at the sides of the square. 3) On the caller's command, "Everybody go forward and back," they enter into the dance program. **Caller's Responsibility**: 1) Recognize a number of squares have broken down and formed lines. 2) Place the dancing squares into lines that are in normal boy/girl arrangement. 3) Give the command, "Everybody go forward and back," in a bold voice.



NEW DANCERS BILL OF RIGHTS

A new square dancer has the right:

- 1. To a class experience that is both educationally and socially enjoyable.
- To patient and dignified treatment by the class instructor(s) and sponsors. 2.
- 3. To gain experience dancing to other callers and, if possible, with dancers from other classes, prior to graduation.
- 4. To receive advice and assistance in acquiring appropriate clothing for square dancing.
- 5. To instruction and practice using the approved definitions, timing and styling for each listed call (Basic, Mainstream, etc.).
- To information about the history and heritage of our present square dance 6. program.

The above Bill of Rights was approved by the entire Callerlab membership. We encourage all callers and square dancers alike to put the fun and friendliness back into square dancing.

The 44th National Square Dance Convention (NSDC) booth in Portland was very busy registering dancers for 1995! As of July 15, 1994, there are 3500 dancers registered. You can obtain a registration form by writing to Registration and Housing, PO Box 610409, Birmingham, AL 35261-0409 or by calling 205-833-NSDC. If this is your first Convention, well guess what? There will be many firsttimers to keep you company.

The last time Alabama hosted the NSDC was in 1985 with an attendance of 17,781. For many dancers, this is a once-in-a-lifetime experience, since it takes place close to home approximately every 10 to 12 years.


When you register for the Convention, be sure to order a Program Book and a Bus Pass. The Program Book costs \$3 (increases to \$5 after April 30, 1995, subject to availability). The Bus Pass is essential to getting around town and costs \$15 (\$25 after April 30, 1995). If you pre-register, both will be in your registration packet when you get to Birmingham in 1995.

Carefully fill out your registration form, write a check (including any additional amounts for tours, program books, bus passes, RV parking, etc.) and send it back. You will receive confirmation of your registration.

There will be 17 dance halls including the Civic Center, the Ballrooms of the Sheraton, and Boutwell Auditorium. All dancing will be under one roof except for the Singles and Country & Western, which will utilize the Boutwell Auditorium across the street from the Civic Center.

The dance floors will include 9,558 square feet of carpet; 73,499 square feet of tile; and 146,510 square feet of cement.
