Hello, square dancers! From the many comments we
 received from square dance leaders across the country (as far away as Seattle, Washington), we in Northern New Jersey are not alone in our concern over the future of square dancing as America's \#1 leisure activity. We only hope that we have started many of you thinking about ways you can help your local clubs.

Each year thousands of new square dancers across the country graduate Mainstream dancers, many of whom also purchase the "funny clothes" we wear. Yet, if you were to take a survey one year later, more than $50 \%$ of the graduates have stopped square dancing. This tells us that we must be doing something wrong. What are these new dancers expecting that we are not providing? Could it be friendship? Are we paying enough attention to the new dancer? Do we make them feel at home, or do we make them sit alone?

Joan \& I would like to start a new program. Until we find a better name for it, we will call it "Adopt-A-Dancer." Let us all take a new dancer under our wing. Let's call this individual or couple when we are going to a dance; let's be there to help them; let's answer any questions they may have, but most of all let's prove to them that: "Square dancers are the friendliest people in the world." By now many of you are saying, "But I dance Plus, Advanced of Challenge." This may be true, but we need new dancers in all programs and we can't forget where it all starts. Joan \& I would be interested in any comments you may have.

On November 13, 1994, the NNJSDA held their 20th Mini-Festival. Once again through the efforts of Dick \& Shirley White, General Chairmen, and Norman \& Audrey Bolin, Registrars, it was a sellout with $85+$ squares in attendance. Everyone enjoyed the calling of Tony Oxendine, Roy Leber, and

Each time I report, I write about how much fun it is to dance at Spinning Wheels, all the friendly people we have dancing, and the great callers we have calling. We also have delicious food and I thought l'd give you my mother's cheesecake recipe, which so many of you have enjoyed when you have come to Spinning Wheels.

GRANDMA'S CHEESECAKE
Crust: $\quad 1$ package of a 3-package box of graham crackers 1 teaspoon cinnamon
6 tablespoons melted butter or margarine
Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Crush graham crackers in food processor. Melt butter or margarine and mix in a small bowl with crackers and cinnamon and press into a greased cheesecake pan.
Filling: $\quad 3$-eight ounce packages of cream cheese
1 cup sugar
4 eggs
2 cups sour cream
1 cup heavy cream
2 tablespoons lemon juice
1/2 teaspoon vanilla
Soften cream cheese in a large bowl. Gradually beat in sugar until fluffy. Add eggs one at a time beating well after each. Beat in remaining ingredients. Pour into prepared crust. Place cookie sheet with water on lower shelf of oven below cake. Bake in preheated oven for 1 hour. Turn heat off. Let cake remain in closed oven for 1 hour longer. Let cool at room temperature and then refrigerate overnight. Enjoy! MS - 1 Sat. Sept-June Old Stone Ch. Ed. Center PL - 3 Sat. Sept-June 500 East Saddle River Rd.

## THE SEWING CIRCLE ${ }^{\text {squared }}$

We had a marvelously productive sewing session at LUST. The sewing group brainstormed things that we would like a Sewing Circle to do for us. We came up with great ideas, including flyers about sewing for square dancers! (The first of these, about the SEWING CIPCLE ${ }^{\text {Squareo }}$ Semintars at the Nj State Convention, went out in December.)

We decided to start to put together a network of sewers in our area. We want it to include contact names in each club or area. We would use it as a notification/contact list for seminars and other happenings of interest. Another way it might be used is as a sort of "help" line for a sewer who is stuck on a particular project; we could each list our special interest/skills, and a phone number if we wouldn't mind answering questions from another sewer nearby. (And if we really fantasize, maybe someday someone would like to turn it into a newsletter.) Even as a simple list of names, however, it will be a real resource directory for all of us.

It should also include the names of any sewers who sew for pay (or barter) who would like to be put on a referral list-we are all frequently asked for this information.

There will be a flyer this month about this network. Look for it, fill it out, and send it in. The completed list will be sent to all the sewers on it. If you are on the list, even if you are not interested in being contacted by other sewers, you will find it valuable.

The "tools of the month" are some wonderful new pens we found:
$\checkmark$ Iron-on transfer pens: just draw around the back side of any design you want to turn into a transfer, and iron the design onto your fabric. Then paint, sew, or applique over the design lines. Each one can be reused 3-4 times, and can continue to be reused indefinitely by going over the same lines when it gets faint. You can create stunning designs from any source, including large lettering in different fonts from a computer or a magazine. You can use it to recycle old iron-on designs that have lost their "oomph", too.
$\checkmark$ Textile marking (paint) pen with fine line and brush-tip: with these you can write names or draw/paint designs on fabric without the messiness of paints--and it dries instantly. These are available in craft stores (Michael's or Rag Shops, for example), in a variety of colors and from different manufacturers.

Several of us keep this list handy to answer silly questions about our "stash". (Thanks to Rose Ericson, YSquares, for the starter list of 5.) If your favorite is not here, send it to us.

## TOP TEN REASONS FOR BUYING FABRIC

1. It doesn't need to be fed or walked, and it's quiet--neighbors don't complain.
2. Someday l'll have kids (grandkids, nieces or nephews, neighbor kids... ) to sew for.
3. It's great insulation when I stack it neatly around the room.
4. It's more versatile than wallpaper and it doesn't need to be "hung," just stacked creatively.
5. it was on sale.
6. It provides employment for many people.
7. If I can get the stack high enough, I won't have to bend over to reach it.
8. It's always a perfect fit.
9. It's going on sale tomorrow, and someone else will buy it all.
10. I like it and someday I'll find a use for it.

Remember, a SEWING CIRCLE is just a big zero until it is shared -- and ${ }^{\text {squared. }}$

## FUN AT DANCE

by Dick Mazziotti, Caller/Teacher
This column is dedicated to New Dancers. it is mostly unintelligible and quite uninteresting to those experts who have been dancing for more than a year.
"Are we having fun yet?" Like all things in life that are worthwhile (thin, money, hair), learning to dance can be hard work. But hard work need not be grim. Callers; New Dancers, angels, -- LIGHTEN UP! We've got to remember to have fun, first, last and always. Did you know there is a club actually dedicated to having fun? Ask the member of F.A.D. Squares what their club name stands for.
"But Dick, we don't want to take the square down," I heard a New Dancer say. Here is the Revelation-of-the-Day folks. It isn't always the new dancer who takes the square down.

Angels, trying ever harder to help New Dancers complete the calls, can sometimes be so absorbed that they lose their own place in the square. Any resemblance to dancing goes west for everyone concerned. Callers, trying ever harder to be helpful, wait for a slower dancer to complete a move, thereby throwing off the timing of the calls that is so important for smooth dancing. The resultant stop-start-stop is not dancing; it's just uncomioriabie, and makes it more difficult for you to dance. And (please don't tell any other caller you heard this from me) callers very occasionally will call something that is awkward or even, dare I say, impossible to do!

Another of the gremlins that afflict new dancers is simply getting used to a different caller. As you go out to dances at other clubs, you will start to hear other callers. Their patter, help words and cadence may be different than what

you are used to with your caller. It takes some getting used to. We used to tell New Dancers, and perhaps it is time to revive the practice here, that when you go to a new club or have a new caller, there is nothing wrong with sitting out the first tip just to listen. Some callers deliberately start a dance with one or two singing calls just to make it easier for dancers to get used to their particular cadence and style.

We recently heard of a caller complaining that dancers could not keep up with his neat stuff when his home club was able to do it. Well, maybe his home club was used to his neat stuff. Or maybe his timing was off. Or maybe there was a full moon. We all go for walks at the strangest times!

The point is New Dancer, don't assume that all the problems of the world fall onto your shoulders as soon as you walk into a square. There are hundreds of reasons for a square to go down. Square dancing is not contest between the caller and the dancers. If it were, the caller would always win the battle by calling difficult or impossible stuff, and the dancers would win the war by staying home.

Instead, let a smile be your umbrella, pack up your troubles in your old square dance bag, keep on the sunny side of the square, and smile, smile, smile. Happy dancing all.

## LETTIERS TO THE EDITORS . .

While I don't have Dick Mazziotti's way with words, I'd like to attempt to express my concern about another type of pyramid (not the food one).

A pyramid normally has a large base, which I used to think of as Mainstream. As it gets narrower toward the top, the base supports Plus, Advanced, and Challenge.

Let's experiment with some numbers. if we have 19 Mainstream clubs as a Base, our pyramid could probably accommodate 12 Plus clubs, 6 Advanced clubs, and 1 Challenge club. But that assumes each club has the same number of ACTIVE dancers, not just names on a list who pay dues but dance rarely.

It would be interesting to survey average attendance at each program of dance. From what I saw at the recent Mini-Festival, it would appear that Advanced attracts about $40 \%$ of dancers in our area, while Plus attracts about $45 \%$. That leaves only $15 \%$ for Mainstream and Challenge. WHERE IS OUR BASE?

Our pyramid cannot stand; it will topple over! Surely, the Advanced dancers must - sooner or later - recognize the need for them to provide a place for new dancers to learn Mainstream, and to provide Angels as well. It is up to all of us to attempt to widen our base. None of us are "above it all."

Sponsoring Mainstream classes should not be solely up to Mainstream clubs! Perhaps we should omit club sponsorship entirely and have the NNJSDA sponsor Mainstream classes, in the 5 geographical areas outlined for the new Raid Program. Callers could cooperate (even though that sounds unusual) and share classes in their area. For example, caller " $A$ " would teach the first week of each month, during the first 10 weeks of lessons, caller "B" the second week, etc. Then if there are more callers in that particular area, caller " $E$ " or " $F$ " could come

on board for the second set of 10 lessons, releasing caller "A" for some time off. We have a new Mainstream Teaching Order, which most callers have adopted, and there is no reason why revolving instructors should not work, as long as we are consistent with "every 3rd week" for example.

It would be up to the NNJSDA to advertise, find suitable halls, collect fees, and pay each caller on a per student basis, only ( 18 students $=\$ 36$ per class session). Assuming the NNJSDA charged each student $\$ 3.50$ per class session, the remaining $\$ 1.50$ per week would have to cover hall rental. Advertising would be consistent in all geographical areas, and fees to callers would be fair, if based on a per student method. Or course, angels could come from any local club, even Advanced dancers.

How about opening our eyes to a different way of conducting classes? Instead of club/callers competing with each other, we would have cooperation WOW.
