

The Gathering Committee is very pleased to report a highly successful Gathering on October 6, 1996. We met all the goals we set in April 1995 when we began this project as evidenced by the attendees' evaluations:

\*Attendees' feedback to determine the need for future Gatherings: over 300 evaluations were completed (we ran out!), and they were universally positive about the speakers, the topics, the event, and repeating it in the future. We will improve many things, BUT THE

AUDIENCE LOVED IT!!!

\*Attendance: over 350 ribbons sold, and 243 persons attended, even though the day was one of the prettiest in a lovely fall season. This is the highest attendance of any Legacy-type program in NNJSDA history (previous LUST record was 208 in 1986, with 156 in 1992, and 65 in 1994) in spite of the NNJSDA experiencing the lowest membership in history. The attendees were a good cross-section of the membership: dancing an average of 9 years, ranging from 1-44 years (!), with 46% dancing less than 5 years; 28% dancing more than 10 years; and 65 attendees (27%) were presently club officers.

\*Topics: a broad range was presented, including information for both officers and non-officers; the 8 sessions, covering 21 topics, attracted a minimum of 45 attendees each; over 500 people attended the 8 sessions. The speakers did an outstanding job. The handouts are still available from many of the sessions and

topics and we will put them out at the Association dances.

\*Stimulate Reflection: the Keynote Address by Bob Carpenter drew rave reviews. The Keynote Address was printed by the Porters and given to the



\*Evening Dance: planned as a reward for the hard work of learning and thinking all afternoon, it was soundly enjoyed by both Mainstream and Plus dancers; Jack O'Leary did a sterling job. Unlike previous years when we had 35-40 people attend the dance who had not attended the education sessions, this year we had about 50 people who attended the sessions but who could not stay for the evening dance.

\*Location: Centrally located, easy to find from all points north, south, east and west; attendees agreed without reservation that Parsippany was a good location. The average distance traveled was 30 miles; the average travel time was 50 minutes; some were as close as .2 of a mile and as far as 243 miles.

\*Publicity: in addition to our ads in *Grand Square*, we were published in both the *Freedom Valley Dancer* and the *Hudson Valley Dancer*. Officers of over 100 clubs in New Jersey, New York, and Pennsylvania received flyers. We had attendees from all three states, as well as Maryland, Massachusetts, Connecticut, and Virginia.





Excerpt from the Keynote Address by Bob Carpenter. . .

Apparently, and interestingly, not much has changed over the last 30 years. Understand that we haven't been around that long, having danced for only 18 years — I began at age 6 — but Ed Foote, writing in the Northeast Square Dancer, states that "people ask me what is different about all the problems in square dancing, today compared with 30 years ago, and the answer is that things are very similar. We read articles in

magazines today about all the problems in square dancing, but it was exactly the same 20 and 30 years ago. Beginner classes too short, clubs rushing people through class, lack of friendliness toward new graduates, too many experimentals... when *Swing Through* and *Spin the Top* came out in 1964, people said, 'Too many new calls; these calls will mark the downturn of square

dancing.' Instead they were the forerunner of a great boom."

This time, though, something is wrong: Dance attendance, at least in New England, has steadily dropped over the past 5 years from 95 to 86 to 81 to 75 to 69 dancers, as measured in a careful survey done by Jim Mayo. Some people argue that we've simply been in a slump and that these things are cyclical. From my perspective, the "slump" has now lasted for 18 years, because the largest classes and largest attendance at a New England Convention happened our first year as dancers. Faced with such information, the most cautious interpreter would probably conclude that we're in a downward spiral. What's going on? We haven't changed; what's wrong with everybody else? Why doesn't America get with the program?

Well, I have a few theories, and later on some thoughts on where we need to go. If we look at the generation we claim we want to recruit, we see them labeled

# FOR NEW DANCERS, THE FINE ART OF LISTENING

by Dick Mazziotti, Caller/Teacher

At one of the class-level dances we attended when as students, the caller quite firmly directed us all to do a "Rah ta lethoo!" Our first reaction was that we had been teleported to a Hindi Bazaar. We quickly discovered any number of dancers around us finishing a perfectly executed "right and left through!" Huh?

What on earth, we thought, was the matter with that man? And with all the other difficulties we were facing as new dancers, did we now have to learn a new

language?

Well, the answer we found out was, "No, of course not," and "Yes, in a way." Ever since mankind started dancing, there have been no clear-cut answers to such weighty questions as: "What is life?" "How high is up?" "Who is really my

partner in an Ocean Wave?"

While we are all taught the same moves and responses to the same calls, in actual practice, each caller has his or her own presentation and style. Each caller stresses different parts of each call, of even different parts of individual words. The result for a new dancers hearing a different caller for the first time can be cacophony, dissonance, gibberish, or white noise, all signifying absolutely nothing to the baffled dancer's brain. We each become quite accustomed to our own caller/teacher's voice, patterns, mannerisms, pronunciation and delivery. Then along comes some other bozo with a whole new set of baggage and he or she expects our poor addled brain to made the adjustment.

Well, that's true. That is exactly what is expected. If we all had punch cards for brains, we would not be expected to adjust. But the biological computer with which we all come equipped can and will adjust. Callers who are barely intelligible at the beginning of the dance, magically get quite a bit better by the

end of the dance.

Those dancers who mostly dance to the same caller will always have difficulty

#### I WENT TO A STUDENT DANCE, THEN WENT HOME AND SHOT MYSELF

by Dick Mazziotti, Caller/Teacher

The hall is festive. The new dancers apprehensive but all smiles. The angels, some of whom have been dancing for at least two weeks, are looking smug. The caller is personable and happy. The music starts. As instructed, the new dancers leap into the first available square. The caller starts calling...and the square goes nowhere! Can't even circle! Corners remain entirely elusive! Right and left become foreign concepts! Previously adequate hearing goes stone deaf! Brains turn into toothpaste! The caller looks and sounds nasty! The sun disappears! Why, oh why, did we ever come here?!

The above, unfortunately, can be a new dancers' first dance experience

outside of class. How can this happen, and what can be done about it?

The very first thing everyone, angels, new dancers, callers and hangers on need to make sure of is that all understand and realize: THIS IS A SOCIAL AND RECREATIONAL ACTIVITY. Flowers will not die because a square went down. Quite often, the most fun is had when squares do break down. As one good dancer I know puts it, "I can break down at any level."

For some strange and eerie reason, new dancers, who in other lives run corporations, drive aggressively, raise families, decide on major purchases, and dress themselves without much help each day, one and all assume they are the ones who make an egregious error and broke down the square. The newer the

dancer, the more this assumption approaches the certainty of gravity.

HELLOOO! There are other reasons than one's own abject dumbosity that squares go down. I am now going to let you in on secrets we callers have sworn

variously and somewhat differentially as "Generation X," the "Me-First Generation," and the "Baby-Boomers," characterized (and sometimes caricatured) in general by instant gratification, enormously enhanced electronic and media sophistication, rather loud and very showmanship-oriented music, and peopled significantly and pervasively by the recumbent creature known rather uncharitably as the "Couch Potato." What do we offer them?

Well, for the instant-gratification folks, we have one-plus years of lessons per level. For the media types, there are the 45s and the turntable spinning '40s-era music. For those interested in showmanship and spectacle, we offer square dance garb and halls festooned with cardboard turkeys and shamrocks; for the couch potato we offer exercise. Now we can make light of all this, and admittedly there are times when all you can do is laugh a little, but we need to realize that if we are to bring these folks in, we need to meet them at least halfway and then some. We need web pages, contemporary music, western clothing, instant success and baby-sitters, for openers. If we're unwilling to do this, we'd best stop kidding ourselves, take the path of intellectual honesty, and mine for recruits among the "follicly challenged." We can't realistically expect a generation weaned on a culture foreign to our ears as well as our intellect to embrace our ways in order to join us on the square dance floor. It won't happen.

On the other hand, at least some of the futurists' crystal balls seem to leave an opening for us, if we will seize the opportunity. There are those among the younger generation who are evidencing a desire to affirm their traditions and values, who prize stability, and who genuinely wish to preserve existing cultural norms. Paul Saffo, Director of the Institute for the Future, a trend-forecasting organization specializing in advising corporate clients about shifts in population

Reynote Address Excerpt continued from page 47 and technology, sees the next decade as increasingly dominated by increasingly sophisticated technology, on-line shopping, the agendas of Baby Boomers and the "reinvention of retirement communities." There is both a chance and a message here if we are to be successful into the 21st century. The chance is there to use technology to access and entice the "Boomers," especially as they begin to reach their retirement years. The message is, rather starkly, that the information age and all that it brings with it is a train that has already left the station, is rapidly accelerating, and that we can either hop on or let it run over us.

\*Cost: the cost of renting Parsippany Hills High School was over \$2,300, but because of the support of the NNJSDA member clubs, CCNJ, and sales of ads in the Program book, we still managed to bring the event off under \$1,300 in the red. (Red ink for previous LUSTs has ranged from \$50 in 1978 to a high of \$1,500 in 1992.) The co-support of \$650 from the Square Dance Council of New Jersey is very gratefully acknowledged. The Council not only voted to support 50% of NNJSDA's liability this year, but to support the 1998 Gathering as well.

There were some great ideas generated for fundraising for the 1998 Gathering by the attendees. We are committed to keeping the liability for the next Gathering as low as possible. While 40% commented that they agreed with and actually preferred the "One Square is Fair" approach used this year with each club buying 8 ribbons each, there were many other ideas: have fundraisers at each of the member clubs to cover the cost of the ribbons for their officers; sell sodas at dances; special 50/50s at each club dance; sell candy; have a car wash; have a dance next fall to raise money and interest; contribute a pot-luck supper and charge for it; charge each dancer a surcharge of \$.25 at each member club dance, all with proceeds to go into the NNJSDA treasury for the Gathering Fund. These ideas will be passed along to the clubs.

We will need to remind the member clubs of the October 4, 1998 date for the Gathering. It is a reserved date on the NNJSDA calendar, as per the 1990 Delegates vote, and cannot be used for other club activities. We also will encourage fundraising in advance. Ribbons will have to be in the mail to the clubs by April 1, 1998 in order to give everyone lead time. We regret that this was not possible this year.



when another caller come along. At our class, we bring in different callers during the year to enable our dancers to get used to other voices. All new dancers are especially urged to go to every student-level dance available. Not only will you be able to realize the full potential of your own dance satisfaction, but you will confirm and reinforce your abilities dancing and getting used to other callers.

What are "Student Dances?" Most clubs, especially those with classes, put on special dances for new dancers. Angels from clubs all over join new dancers for a fun afternoon or evening. ALL new dancers are welcome at ALL "student" or "class-level" dances. The area callers use the same general teaching list, and all the classes are roughly at the same place at each dance. The callers doing the student dances know you are not experts yet, and are quite able to explain or help with any difficulties. Attendance at these dances will enhance your dance pleasure immensely. Please try to make as many as you can. We look forward to seeing you on the dance floor. Happy dancing.

an oath never to reveal. Please don't report me.

- 1. Sometimes new dancers do the moves correctly, and the angels don't.
- 2. Dancers who glare are often culprits in square breakitis.
- 3. Dancers who smile a lot almost never do anything wrong.
- 4. The caller's timing greatly affects the dancers' ability to correctly do a call.
- 5. Some callers are clearer than other callers.
- 6. Some sound system set-ups, or hall configurations, contribute to difficulties in hearing and understanding.
- 8. Sometimes callers screw up.

What can a new dancer do when there seems to be a problem? First of all, try to get back dancing as soon as possible by forming facing lines in the patter part of the tip. If you don't know how to do this, please ask your instructor or any caller at the next dance. During a singing call, square back up and listen for "swing your corner" or "swing your partner" and join back in. If a particular call is causing difficulty, go up to the caller as soon as the tip is over and ask for help.

In all cases, zip thy lip. Calls are most often missed, and dancers left standing when they could be dancing, by the dancers discussing the missed call and who's fault it was. Rule of the dance: FUGEDABOWT fault! Blame it on the caller! Alternative reaction: Try to imagine what the square would look like to your kids, then fall down laughing ... that's what they would do! Have fun. It's still recreational! See you on the dance floor.
