Roy and I have worked for the Convention Committee in one job or another for all 10 previous Conventions. We are happy to help to create this event. What bothers me is that so many dancers seem to take the Convention for granted and find excuses not to attend. Each year callers and cuers of NJ and surrounding states DONATE their time to the Convention. Many dancers serve on the Committee, or donate an hour or two at the Convention to help with Security, etc. To all of them, I say, "Thank You!!!"

To those dancers who don't attend because, "I don't like the floor in the ARC," or "The BEST callers aren't hired," or "I've done that," or, "It will there next year," I say WAKE UP and see what you are missing. Several dancers missed the announcements last year that a LIVE square dance band would be performing and therefore missed the fun. Well, all is not lost; we are planning for LIVE MUSIC again this year. About the floor in the ARC, it is hard to dance on, but the Committee rotates the hall from Plus to Mainstream to give all the dancers a chance to dance on a better floor. If you can't dance on the ARC, why not:

- watch the clogging or another demo group
- shop

#### **WELCOME NEW DANCERS**



You are reading *Grand Square*, the Official Publication of the Northern New Jersey Square Dancers Association (NNJSDA).

What is the NNJSDA?

It is an organization of dancers who belong to member clubs. These clubs appoint Delegates, who attend 3 meetings a dance season, usually the 3rd Sunday in September

and January, and the 1st Sunday in May. Anyone may attend a meeting, but only Delegates can vote. Each club has one vote. Every spring, the Delegates elect officers for the coming dance season.

What area is covered by the NNJSDA?

NNJSDA's area begins in the south with Mercer County, and goes north all the way to Rockland County in New York State (Rockytops and Rockland Promenaders). In the east, the area begins in Brooklyn (Al'e'Mo Squares and Kings Squares) and continues west to eastern Pennsylvania's Pike County (Dingman Dancers).

How do I become a member of the NNJSDA?

You automatically become a member when you join a member club. There are currently 31 member clubs.

What does the NNJSDA do for you?

1. Publishes *Grand Square* five (5) times a year, which prints club and Association news, a dance calendar, regular and guest columnists, as well as information on the many other facets of the square dance activity. Look for copies at your club.

2. Provides insurance for the dances and classes of member clubs (exception: New York clubs).

Holds a special Summer Mainstream Dance Program for new graduates (see

page 6 for schedule).

Has a Freeloader Program for new dancers, which is earned by attending 5 4. of the 7 NNJSDA Summer Dances. The Freeloader entitles you to attend 3 Association Dances FREE during the next year. A blank Freeloader card is in your graduation packet. Have it signed by the NNJSDA Treasurer at every Summer Dance you attend.

Has a Patron's Award for visiting 26 member clubs on their regular dance 5. night. A blank Patron's card is in your graduation packet. When you visit a member club, have their treasurer or president sign and date the card.

- Has a One Square is Fair Award (presented twice a year) to member clubs 6. who have at least one square in attendance at Association Specials and Summer Dances.
- Holds Special Plus Dance Programs on the 5th Fridays or 5th Saturdays of 7. the dance season, usually with national callers and cuers.
- Holds a Mini-Festival, featuring Mainstream through Challenge dancing, 8. every November for a full day of dancing. Next Mini-Festival is November 9, 1997.
- Sponsors a biennial leadership program, The Gathering, in even-numbered 9. years. The next Gathering is scheduled for October 4, 1998.

The Association makes available instruction booklets for Mainstream and

Plus classes and diplomas for graduation.

Assembles special packets of information for new graduates that are presented at graduation by an Association Officer. The Association also awards a special dangle for perfect attendance at classes.

The Association provides Dance Clearance, through the Recording Secre-12.

tary, of all club dances and specials to prevent conflicts.

Sponsors a *Poster Contest* (see page 8) every year to foster interest in square 13. dancing, and distributes publicity packets.

Provides a forum for discussion and dissemination of flyers at the Delegates

Meetings.

Has a NJ State Outfit Chairman, who has the patterns and fabrics for the green and white NJ State Outfit (see page 36). This outfit is worn at National Square Dance Conventions for the parade of states as well as other special occasions when the dancer wishes to be identified from NJ.

Brian became our club caller in 1988. His pleasant singing voice and the ability to call patterns that kept the dancers on their toes made our dances fun



DIDN'T THE FLYER SAY SQUARE, ROUND, AND LION DANCING?"



A lot of what we sew for square dancing has gathers and ruffles. Let's look at them from the perspective of making them easier and faster.

Firstly, what is the difference between "ruffling" and "gathering"? Gathering is what is done to the fabric to make a longer piece of fabric fit into a smaller area (called the base), and in the case of a square dance skirt, to make it full and flowing; a ruffle is a gathered strip which is added to a garment. The "ratio of gathers to base" is determined by the thickness, the crispness or stiffness, and the weight of the fabric; the length of the gathered piece; and how much fabric you desire to coax into a given area. For example, a 4" ruffle

added to the bottom of a 22" long gored skirt would typically be a 2-2½:1 ratio, or 2 or 2½ times as long as the base it is being sewn to; this translates to 2-2½" of ruffle fabric for every 1" of base fabric. The circumference around the bottom of a 22" long full circle skirt is usually about 180", so a ruffle would start with a flat strip 2 or 2½ times that long, or 10-12 yards long.


Gathering is typically done by sewing 2-3 rows of very long straight stitches down the length of a piece and pulling the bobbin threads up; use a different colored bobbin thread, preferably a heavy-duty thread if you are gathering yards of fabric; loosening the upper tension makes the pull thread less likely to break and the fabric slide along easier. (When you use a heavier thread in the bobbin, you automatically cause the bobbin tension to tighten, so you don't need to adjust it.) Another way is to zig-zag over a heavy cord or fishline, secure one end of the fishline, and pull the other end to gather the fabric. However, these techniques are very time-consuming and often frustrating, because the gathers must be evenly distributed around the base, pinned, stitched, the gathering stitches taken out, etc. You choose the ratio you desire before you cut the fabric, but you can't "preview" the look.

There are also two attachments that can be used to quickly to produce a gathered strip using regular thread--called predictably a Gathering Foot and a Ruffler. A Ruffler is a very complicated-looking device that does many more things than we will ever know, since most of them were designed for the commercial trade around the turn of the century (yes, nearly 100 years ago!!), and while they haven't changed much over the years, they NEVER seem to come with instructions! They are wonderful tools, though, and not hard to use. For instance, did you know that the Ruffler can both gather the fabric and sew it on the base AT THE SAME TIME? Did you learn to put piping on with yours, or pleat or shir with it? The best information I have ever seen on using a Ruffler is in the September issue of <a href="https://doi.org/10.10/10/10.10

The Gathering Foot is a relatively new foot. It is a very simple little thing about 3/4" square that uses the pressure of the presser foot and the speed you sew to gather. It won't let you sew the ruffle on at the same time you gather, and it won't do fancy tucks, but it is easy to use and gives a great ruffle. (Ask your sewing dealer if there is one available for your machine.)

With either of these feet the most important thing is to learn to set the ratio; it will depend on the weight of the fabric, the grainline you are sewing on, the way the foot and the machine is set, the speed you sew at—each ruffle is different. To make a trial piece, start with a 3ft long strip of the fabric you are ruffling, as wide as your finished ruffle will be. Lay it on a flat surface and, with a magic marker, make heavy black marks every 12" along its length. Then set your ruffler the way you think it will give a 2:1 or 2½:1 ratio. Start ruffling your trial piece, and when you pass the first 12" mark, measure the piece; a 12" piece gathered to 6" is a 2:1 ratio, a 2½:1 ratio is 4½-5". Sometimes you need to gather the full length to "preview" the effect; a 2:1 ratio is 18" long, and a 2½:1 ratio is 14-15" long. Look at the ruffles and choose the one that is pleasing to your eye. With heavier fabric, sometimes a 1½:1 ratio works, but the fuller the ruffle, the richer the look. If you are not pleased with the ratio, just grab each end and pull—the stitches will break, the piece will straighten out, and you can start over with new settings. (Once you get the setting for cotton/poly batiste or broadcloth, write it down; it will be a very handy starting place the next time.)



# NEW CALLERS: WHERE DO THEY COME FROM AND WHAT SHALL WE DO WITH THEM?

When we started dancing, there were callers and there were dancers. While some callers danced occasionally, they were mostly all up on stage, mysterious figures who always knew exactly what they were doing. They were all great.

As we danced some more, we started to develop a little snobbery as we found that callers from other areas called things we had never heard before, and it was exciting. Eventually, we developed our snobbery to the point where the first question asked was not, "Who is going to the dance?" but "Who is the caller?"

This kind of snobbery, while possibly inevitable, negates the whole idea of square dancing as a social and leisure-time activity rooted in pleasant friendliness and skillful execution of the dance. As we strive to improve our attractiveness as an activity to the public, we should concentrate on the social fun of dancing together, rather than the egotistical aspect of dancing to the "best" callers.

Did you know? Callers do not spring, full-blown from Burpee Caller Seeds. We are very fortunate in our area in this regard. We have several new callers trying their hand (and, incidentally, working their hinder parts off to do so), and our more experienced callers and the Callers Council of New Jersey (CCNJ), all support their efforts. This is not always the case in other areas.

What can you, as a dancer, do to help foster the growth and development



of new callers in our area? First, attend their dances. If you are a good dancer, square up in front of them to give them a square they can sight on that will correctly execute the calls. Give sincere praise where merited, especially if you see improvement in a caller's development. If you are a really experienced dancer and notice something awkward being called over and over, feel free to offer a comment—after the tip please, not during it. Indicate approval while dancing by smiling. I was devastated at one of my first dances to see a dancer, whom I knew was experienced, dancing right in front of me and shaking his head disgustedly as I fumbled my way through some calls. Turned out later that he had a twitch, but I was crushed.

It is really funny to me to see dancers who were perfectly willing to accept calls from any caller while they were learning, suddenly become "too good" to dance to those same callers. The work of local callers, who see the same dancers over and over, is often a matter of desperately trying to come up with new ideas and fresh movements. The most difficult dance for a caller to call is the one at his or her own club. The easiest is to call a dance for dancers who have never heard the caller. Clubs need to support their local callers, all of them, by hiring them for dances, and by supporting new callers by attending the dances they call.

When learning time, preparation time, equipment and record costs, travel time and costs are all counted up, callers work for approximately 42 cents an hours. New callers work for about nothing an hour considering the time, effort and sweat expended. Just as the callers supported you when you were a new dancer, please support your new callers. We all work better together.



As we cheerfully put away the mittens, caps, and other winter garb, we cast our thoughts to spring and all the good things that it brings. Just around the corner is the New Jersey Square & Round

Dance Convention, which is celebrating its 11th Anniversary. Dave & Wendy Roberts are programming rounds and that ensures it will indeed be a great line up. Their plan is to allow ample time for all Phases and various abilities while maintaining a distinct and enjoyable variety of dance rhythms. Judging by past performance of this multi-talented couple, a grand time is in store for all. The round dance program has always been an enjoyable one and this is sure to follow

Many of your square dancing friends have been meeting through the year to plan for this occasion. It takes a good deal of work to have it develop and become the wonderful happening we all share. Remember, this affair cannot succeed without your support and that's not much to ask when the return is so high.

Seasoned round dancers will likely observe novice round dancers on the floor. Be sure to introduce yourself and share fond memories of your own fledgling inauguration. You are also encouraged to square up with novice square dancers and welcome them in joining this great sport of ours. You will probably meet some great folks, and perhaps build new friendships. At the least, we should do our best to support and to stimulate the new dancers.



spring in Kansas City.

One general session will be devoted to progress reports from other national and international square dance organizations including Callerlab, Roundalab,

#### SEMINARS AT THE 46TH NSDC

Roundalab, in conjunction with the National Executive Committee of the NSDC, will present daily two-hour educational seminar at the NSDC in Orlando, FL. These

seminars, which are mainly lecture and discussion periods with a lot of audience participation through question and answer periods, are slanted to dancers, round dance teachers, and square dance callers interested in the round dance as a part of the overall square dance activity. rounds in schools, as well as young adults and senior citizens.

The 46th NSDC has defined the single person in our couple activity as "Half-A-Pair." The session on Saturday will discuss round dancing as it relates to this Half-A-Pair, the dancer without a partner and the teacher without a partner.

The seminars will be presented every afternoon from 1:00 to 2:45 p.m. in the Conference Room at the Convention Center. The seminars are a supplement to the educational program planned by the 46th NSDC Education Committee.
