

GRAND SQUARE IS CHANGING!!!

We are staying on as Editors! But *Grand Square* is changing. As per the vote of the Executive Board, *Grand Square* will be published only three (3) times a dance season, beginning with the next issue. Please note the following:

DeadlinesPublicationThemeJuly 17, 1997August 30, 1997Fall IssueNovember 17, 1997January 18, 1998Winter/S

November 17, 1997 January 18, 1998 Winter/Spring March 17, 1998 May 3, 1998 Grads/Summer

Revised Reporter and Ad Maker Forms will be sent in June after the NNJSDA Questionnaire has been returned to us.

Advertising Rates - will remain the same for member and non member advertisers, but there will be NO discounts offered for multiple issues. (Without the discount, a club taking three 1/2 page ads saves \$39.00 a dance season.)

<u>Subscriptions</u> - will be reduced to \$5.00 for three (3) issues. All existing subscriptions will be extended to honor their remaining number of issues.

<u>Dance Calendar</u> - will run for 4+ months instead of 3. The additional dates may require that we reduce the font size.

Poster Contest - the winner will still be the cover of the Fall Issue.

Printing Costs - will not be impacted. It currently costs \$1,908 with tax to print a 64-page issue.

Assessments - will remain at \$1.00 per mother club member.

We realize that there will be a period of adjustment and that the first few issues will require more than the usual number of phone calls. We think this is a viable alternative that will keep Grand Square alive for a few more years.

HAL & FLORENCE MARGO HONORED BY Y SQUARES




Florence was presented with a bouquet of roses, and there was a beautiful cake for every-




Most of the things we talk about in this column are quickie shortcuts: one page gives us little room for in-depth design, and we have books available for more extensive ideas. It's the simple idea that usually tickles our fancy, and gives us an "Ah-hal!" Richard recently came up with one that I'd like to share.

I was making a Belles & Beaux raid outfit when he walked in and spotted the green and white fabric and got pretty enthusiastic that we'd have a St. Patrick's Day outfit. When I told him it was for B&B, he immediately asked why it couldn't be for both---"and more than just a green shamrock tie would be nice!" (Since he's taken to wearing more and more bolos, my quickie matching scheme, a tie for every occasion, has gone flat as New Years' punch.) Which set me to wondering how to make removable or reversible yokes.


Turned out to be so easy I made it BOTH removable AND reversible! I placed the shirt flat on the table, put a piece of newspaper over the back yoke, and drew around it. Then I drew around the front yoke. I knew I had to make the removable yoke longer than the original, so it would look like it was part of the shirt and not an afterthought, so I added about 2" to the original yoke bottom edges, front and back. I added only a 5/8" seam allowance to the armhole edges, the shoulder seams, and the collar edge. Then I cut two sets of front and back yokes with the new pattern, using two different pieces of fabric that I thought would be interesting to wear—in this case one was shamrocks and the other a holiday print I "fell in love with, but didn't have enough to do anything with"—you know what I mean!!

The rest is easy. Sew the fronts to the backs at the shoulder seams first; then lay the two yokes, right sides together, and sew all around the outside, except for one 6" area along one armhole edge. Leave this open so it can be turned right side out. Turn it, press it, and whip the opening shut by hand. VOILA--a yoke!!



To make it look "real" I put pearl snaps on the points in the front and across the back.

These were just for looks, though--I attached it with tiny safety pins on the inside of the shirt, at each yoke point and at the shoulder seams, being careful to catch only the under layer so they wouldn't show through. If he had been wearing it (and laundering it) several times, I could have tacked it on with thread, but safety pins worked fine.



Here's to bright ideas that work!!



But should we think about making our activity more attractive to the upcoming generation? I think it is time to consider that what we offer, particularly to the untrained mind, may have all the attraction of a dentist visit (Please don't write to tell me that dentists too can be nice people. I agree. This was poetic license.)

The essence of our activity, the friendliness, the continual physical and mental exercise, the low-cost entertainment value—these are the things we need to emphasize and try to show. These are the things we should never compromise. These are the real traditions of square dancing.

Can we change a little? Is there room for us to make our activity more attractive while retaining the very valuable and necessary essentials? The answer is up to you, the dancer. If each dancer comes to his or her next club meeting with one idea for attracting younger dancers, we will have 1500 suggestions in the Northern New Jersey Square Dancers Association area. If only 10% of the ideas are worthwhile, we will have 1500 new ideas! The numbers game is real.

If, on the other hand, the majority of dancers feel that coming to an occasional dance is all we are willing to invest, then the truth is, we really don't have much to offer. Our "friendliness" is not universal; it extends only to our own little group. Instead of closing in, as any group tends to do, we are going to have to open out, stretch our arms wide and embrace the younger generation, with all its prairie skirts and natural foods. Let's see if there are ways we can make room for people to whom "recycle" means separating glass and plastic rather than ends cross fold while centers follow them around in a 3/4 loop ending side-by-side as partners.

The time to recruit for next year's classes is NOW. Talk it up. Drag them in. Bring an espresso machine to the next dance!
