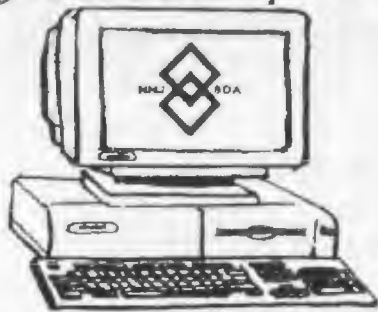

FROM RT 80 EAST OR WEST

Rt. 80 to Rt 287 South to Rt. 202-20 South (Exit 13) to Rt. 22 East. Proceed 2-1/2 miles to Finderne Ave./Manville Sign. Turn right on Finderne Ave., pass light, and turn right onto Foothill Road. Proceed 1.1 miles (you will go over Rt. 22) to Merrivood Rd. Make a left onto Merrivood Rd. Proceed into school driveway. Drive around school to side and front parking lots. No parking at yellow curbs. Park in lined areas only.

FROM RT. 78 EAST OR WEST

Rt. 789 to Rt. 287 South to Rt. 202-206 South and follow directions above.

FROM RT. 287 NORTH

Rt 287 north to Rt. 22 West (merge to right lane on Rt. 22). Proceed approximately 1 mile. Make a right onto North Gaston Ave. (this is a small street, Midas Muffler is in center island opposite N. Gaston Ave.). Follow N. Gaston to "T" (Somerville Rd.). Turn right and proceed for one long block. Turn right again onto Merrivood Rd. Follow directions from Merrivood Road above.

This report could include a sick list, but by the time this is published, they'll all be well again. Hope summer was good and you're ready for an active fall.

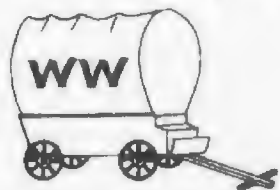

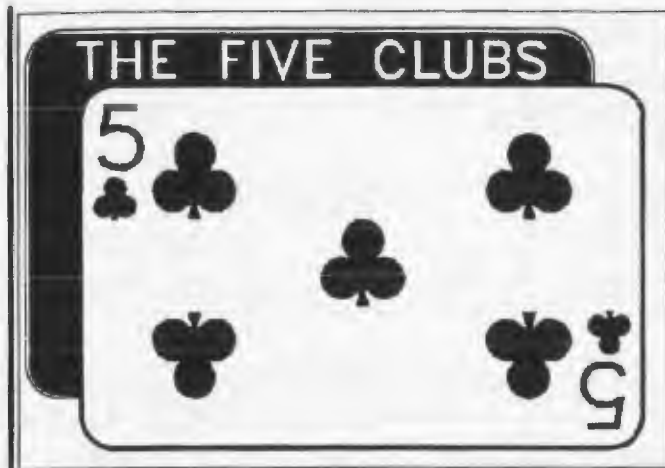

COMMUNICATION. . . HUH?

by Dick Mazziotti, Caller/Teacher

A successful marriage is grounded in good communication. So are we headed for Divorce Court? One of the major reasons the Northern New Jersey Square Dance Association has been more successful, especially at fostering, nurturing and maintaining Mainstream clubs, than other areas around us must be credited to *Grand Square*. The legacy of quality communications developed so well by the Tirrells, and refined by the hard work of Charlie & Kathy Porter and all their unsung staff, has maintained communications between clubs and clubs, clubs and dancers, association and dancer, *et al, et unitum*.

The value of this connection we have all enjoyed, albeit with little thought or recognition of the gargantuan efforts of a few dedicated people, is the timely and mostly accurate information made available to anyone looking for a dance. How many time have we all heard during announcement, "Look in *Grand Square* for details." Looking for a dance? "Honey, where the latest *Grand Square*?" Driving to a new club and need directions? "*Grand Square*."

Due to the fact that the editors, after many years' dedication, want to have life, and the fact that replacements able to do the job have not come forth, the Porters have agreed to stay on, but with a reduced number of issues.

So here's the problem, and some offered solutions. How do we make up for the lost issues and the resulting out-of-dateness of much of the information?

Pigeon Force: Each club is responsible for training a corp of carrier pigeons that will be encouraged to fly to neighboring clubs with announcements, changes in dance information, etc. Note: until bio-scientists develop a larger bird, only about 1/2 a single flyer can be sent this way. Be succinct with your messages please.

Club Crier: As in medieval times before the advent of e (for egregious)-mail, clubs and associations will have to bear the cost of hiring club criers to travel the dance circuit proclaiming their club's wares. Be sure they are BMI/ASCAP licensed please.

Telephone Net: Each club member is designated to call a certain number of dancers from other clubs to dispense important information. Be careful with this one. There have been a number of cases reported of massive depression by net callers who can't handle the rejection of constantly getting the totally mis-named "answering" machines.

Call-A-Caller: This program, discovered in the minutes of the next CCNJ meeting, allows clubs to mail important notices to the callers in the hope that the callers will (1) remember to take it with them to their dances, (2) be able to read the information intelligibly over the microphone without setting off the dreaded "I can't hear yous," (3) fill in or correct the missing, incorrect, misspelled, and occasionally vulgar statements, dates, and directions.

Remember, when all is said and done, there will still be somebody who says it and does it again.

Dancers, we need your help. Please be pro-active in getting out the messages about your club's dances, association dances, and even dare we say it other club's dances. **Ask** for flyers from your club to take to other dances. **Take it upon yourself** to make announcements about your club's dances during announcements at other clubs.

Dancers, more than ever, we need your personal recruiting to bring in new dancers to Mainstream clubs. Plus and Advanced program dancers, here's the

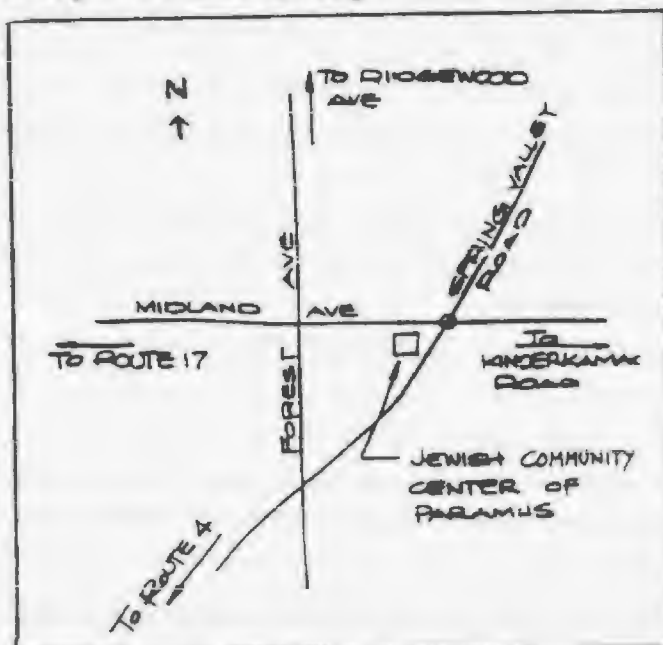

A tie has long been the thought of as the only way some sewers had of making their partner's clothes "match". They are easy to make, but should not be the only thing you make for him! An "outfit" is defined as matching clothes for both partners; it is not just a pretty dress for her and a matching tie for her partner! However, with a little imagination, a tie can be a very creative work of art.

First make the tie. Choose fabric that has an interesting pattern if possible. While solid colors easily match a dress, they are usually worn over a solid color shirt, and tend to fade into the shirt. Using a print, especially one with large enough design to be seen from across the square, gives more visual appeal.

Take a strip of fabric, cut on any grain to show the pattern most favorably, 5" wide and about 45" long; avoid the selvedge, because that tends to shrink badly when washed. (The current fashion says that a tie reaches to the bottom of the shirt pocket when in a tie clasp, so cut it a little longer than that.)



Cut a 5" triangle off each end, both points on the same edge of the fabric. Fold the strip in half (see the diagram) and taper the center down to 2" at the fold. Finish the edges with any hem that strikes your fancy—serged, rolled, hand-rolled, or attach a fine braid or machine embroider around in a subtle design. (Just be sure the finished tie will fit through those ridiculously narrow tie clasp loops.)

Then pleat the center down to $\frac{3}{4}$ ", and stitch lengthwise 8" along the folds. By the way, convention says the tie is worn with points together, not in a "V" shape—for whatever difference that makes

Now the creative part: if you had to use a solid color to get a coordinated color match, don't stop there. Take a small piece of the print and applique a flower, etc. onto the tie ends. Take a fabric pen or paint (there are hundreds of colors now) and trace the fabric design on the tie; don't try to recreate the whole design by covering all the lines, unless you do have artistic talent—even an abstract outline is enough to bring the dress design into the tie. (Maybe HE has an artistic talent?) Or if you are creating a theme outfit, get fabric appliques in the crafts stores and iron them on the tie ends.

Everyone loves a monogram, and letters/initials (of the wearer, the sewer, the club, the event, the theme, etc) are always welcomed, painted or sewn. Jewels or sequins are also nice, but again, be sure it will fit through the tie clasp. Try any idea that interests you. See you in a square.

Remember, a SEWING CIRCLE is just a big zero until it is shared -- and SQUARED.

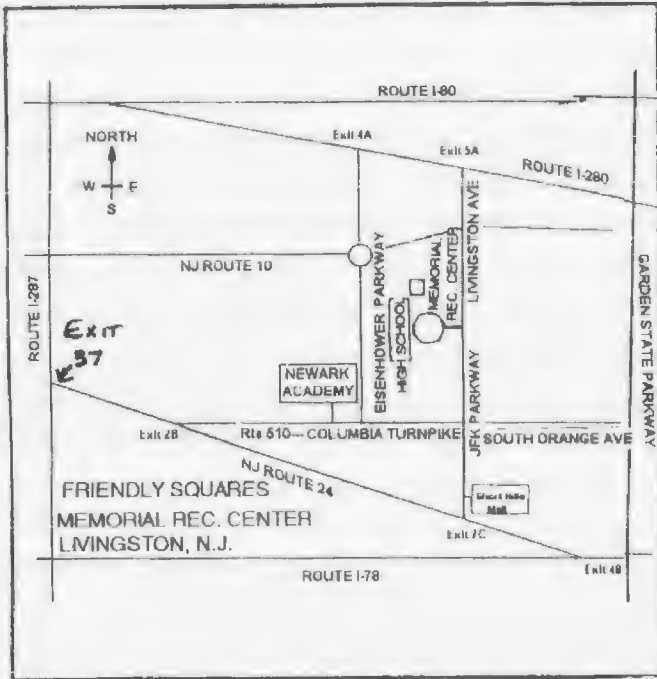

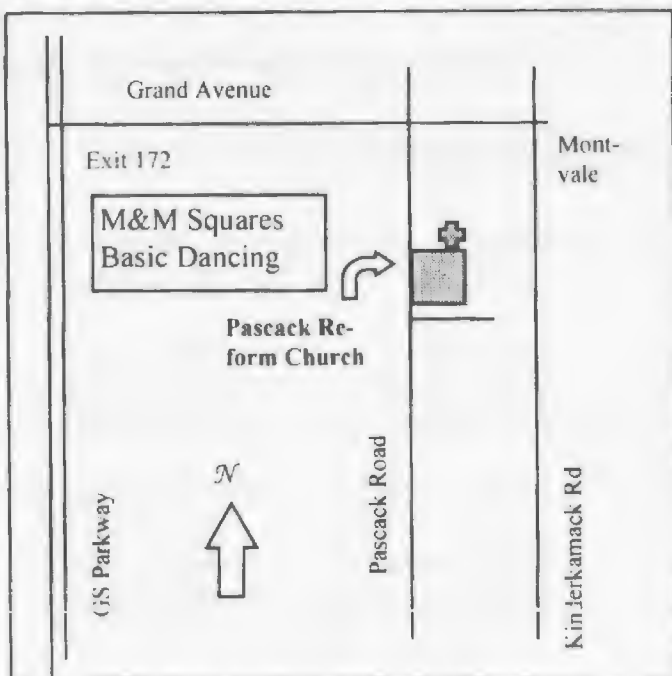

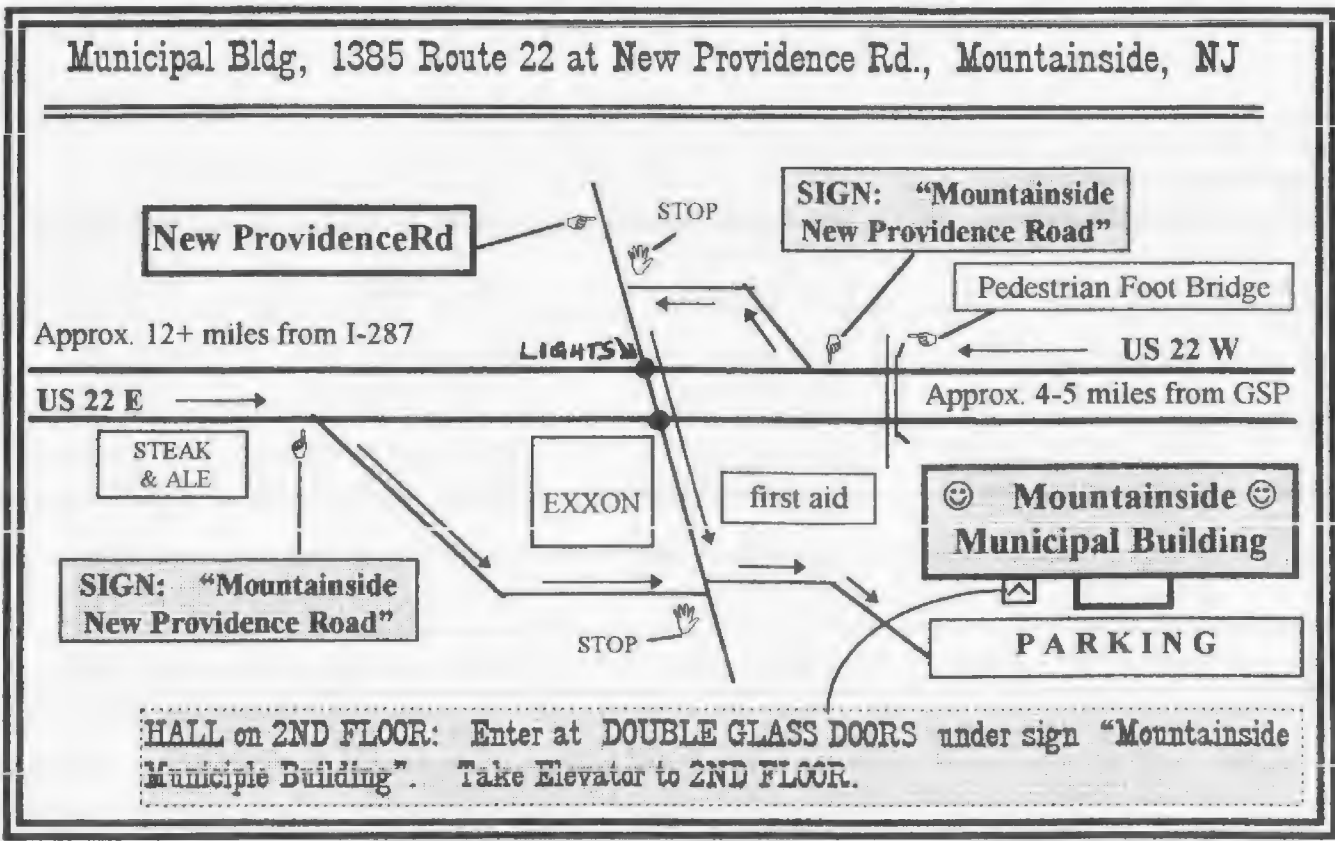
