From the computer of...SAL & MARY ALESSI, NNJSDA PRESIDENTS




The 23rd NNJSDA Mini-Festival held on November 9, 1997 in Bridgewater, NJ, as reported by our Registrars, was a social and financial success. We had approximately 535 dancers attending. This was a slight increase from last year's 507 dancers. Of the 30 NNJSDA member clubs, 25 made "One Square is Fair." We want to thank the delegates for their efforts and all the dancers for their attendance. A special thank you to the Executive

Committee for their hard work, especially our Registrars, Norman & Audrey Bolin, and Past Presidents, Jim & Joyce Kelly.

It was brought to our attention that round dancers believe the cuers did something to alienate the NNJSDA and this was why we did not have round dancing at the Summer Dances. We want to clear up this misconception. The Summer Dance Program was conceived for the benefit of new graduate dancers. A few things were tried like rotating round dancing and line dancing. Due to the decline in the number of graduates, we tried an alternating Mainstream/Plus Program on Saturdays, hoping to encourage supporters of the new dancers to attend. To include round dancing with this program would allow too little time for the new graduates to square dance. The Saturday dances were financial successes. The Wednesday dances were financial disasters. We hope this dispels the misconception.

RUMOR CONFIRMED: NJ CONVENTION POSTPONED FOR 1998




It's true! In 1998, the Square Dance Council of NJ will forego holding the State Convention. Refunds will be mailed to dancers who pre-registered for the Convention.

The Council is foregoing the Convention to sponsor a "Docking Dance" in support of the 49th National Convention scheduled for Baltimore in the year 2000. Regional dances in support of a National Convention are held to increase awareness of the Convention and raise the all-important, up-

front money needed to finance such a huge event.

The Docking Dance will be held on Saturday, August 1, 1998 from 1:00 to 9:00 p.m. in Crestwood Village, Whiting, NJ. The program will feature Mainstream, Plus, Advanced, Rounds, and Contra dancing in three airconditioned halls. The program features 12 callers, 5 cuers, and other leaders.

Tickets are \$10 per person in advance and \$12 at the door. Look for flyers or call Rich & Georgi Flandera at 973-427-2889.



LETTERS TO THE EDITORS...

Having been in square dancing for a combined 70 years (Betsy, 45; Roy, 25), we literally have no close friends who do not square dance or did not square dance at one time or another. We have always known that square dancing isn't just about the dance, but about the people who make up the activity.

1997 has been a year that we would like to forget, but is one that we will always remember. Medically, we would like to forget 1997. In April, at the age of 46, Roy had to have one knee replaced (the last hope after a long string of previous surgeries), and in July, Betsy started an ordeal from which she is still recovering. She spent 7 weeks in the hospital (4 weeks in intensive care; 1 week on life support), 2 more months at home, and she lost a large portion of her pancreas. Emotionally, we will always remember 1997, not because of our personal ordeals, but because the outpouring of love, prayers, concern, support, and help was absolutely overwhelming.

While Roy's surgery is fairly commonplace, he still received an abundance of cards, letters and phone calls. Clubs called to make sure he didn't rush his recovery just to cue a dance, and fellow cuers called to make sure his dances were covered. People still ask how the knee is doing.

It was Betsy's ordeal however, that has truly humbled us. She received close to 400 cards and letters, 15 flower arrangements, and 4 fruit baskets. There were phone calls from every part of the USA and Canada. People in the tri-state area offered Roy help with food, transportation, housing, and financial assistance. Friends helped keep other friends informed with phone and Internet networks. When Roy was seeking advice on transferring Betsy from one hospital to another, he received phone calls from surgeons (who square dance) in Texas, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, and North Carolina. When Roy was arranging substi-





NNJSDA POSTER CONTEST





DIRECTIONS FROM ROUTE 287 N or S: Take Exit 53 in Pompton Lakes. Turn Right at the bottom of the ramp. Not counting this traffic signal drive 5.5 mi through 12 traffic lights (follow Hospital signs). Immediately after passing through the 12th light turn Right into the Church Lane Jug-Handie, cross over Hamburg Tpke (Civic Center will be on a right diagonal) and turn into the Jug-Handle on the opposite side of Hamburg Turnpike. Go 3/4 of the way around this second leg of the Jug-Handle and turn left into the Civic Center parking lot.

Len Anfinsen is teaching our Mainstream class this year. Our students are doing well and looking forward to the big Student Christmas Dance.







I am frequently asked where to get square dance skirt patterns, and my answer may dismay some: I make them. Wait, wait--if I tell you that, it's because it's something you can also do!!

I start with two sheets of newspaper, an old measuring tape, a pencil, and a pin. Place both sheets of the

newspaper on top of each other, and work through two layers. Lay them down on a surface you can stick a pin into (or place a magazine under the corner of them.) Using your measuring tape as a compass, poke a hole in the end of the tape measure and push the tip of the pencil through; stick a pin into the tape at the 6" mark, and push the same pin in exactly at the corner of the newspaper (point "A"). Draw an arc across the corner 6" from point "A".



How long is your favorite petticoat? Measure its length from beneath the waistband to the hem. Add ½" and this is the length your finished skirt should be (22" in our diagram). Add 6" to this measure, move the pin to this mark of the tape (28"), and draw your second arc across the newspaper.

All that's left now is to add 1" to 2" to the hemline, depending on your hem finish, and then 5/8" to


the waist for the cutting line. Voila—you have a gore pattern for a quarter circle; cut it in half for an 8-gore skirt, or tape two together for a half-circle. If you are making 8 gores, however, add 5/8" on each side of the pattern piece for seam allowance, or the skirt will not be a flat circle.

Keep in mind when cutting the fabric that the grainline should go straight down the center of the gore from waist to hem—this way the bias will be along the seams and the hemline will not sag.

There is much more about skirts, both gored and tiered, that we could discuss if space permitted. Look for two (updated) Sewing Circle^{SQUARED} flyers this month in your delegate's stack of flyers from NNJSDA. See you in a square!

Remember, a SEWING CIRCLE is just a big zero until it is shared -- and ^{SQUARED.}





Since beginning this column for *Grand Square*, dancers have started coming to me with their pet gripes, some in the hope that I'll mention their names, some in fear of same. In order to be fair, and avoid nasty run-ins with legal representatives, all gripes will theoretically come from A. Nonimoose, a Native American dancer.

Dear Dick: Why do dancers form set squares, and why do they sometimes stay in those squares all during the dance?

Dear A: This is a form of self-preservation practiced by dancers who are afraid they cannot make it on their own. Think of those set squares as small self-help groups.

Dear Dick: Why do some dancers shy away from dancing with me? When they see me coming across the floor, they scatter. What's wrong with me?

Dear A: Could be B.O. Note to A. and all other dancers, if you go to a dance, please put on deodorant. And for those who think they personally do not need that, have your nose checked—then shower before the dance and put on deodorant anyway. Dear A: Hmmmmm. How can I put this? Maybe we're trying to keep dancers dancing who are not proficient at the announced program. Put another way, I don't know many callers who cannot call a higher level than the dancers can dance. But I have a question for you:

Dear A: Why do dancers insist on going to more programs when they are not proficient at Basic or Mainstream? Huh?

Those were the main gripes for 1997.

THE NEW DANCE CLASSES



While our area is not exactly rolling in a wealth of new dancers, basic classes have been running at several Mainstream and at least two Plus clubs that I know of. It remains a strong disappointment to see the lack of support club members give their own classes. And no less a disappointment to see the lack of support Plus and Advanced clubs give to the new dancers. Put another way, if YOU are not helping out at one of the Mainstream classes occasionally, YOU are not supporting this activity.

The retention of new dancers is so important for the continuation of our activity that it cannot be glossed over by writing "nice" or "funny" columns or articles. Considering that the lack of new dancers has been the major factor in the decline of the number of clubs, in the demise of Association student dances, in the poor attendance at student dances, we should be treating them like gold. Instead, we ignore them, hoping that this year, like last year, there will be enough dedicated people "like" that sort of thing, dancing with them, and enough callers teaching them. Then the really good ones can be recruited into the Plus and Advanced program.

One club this year has gone begging to find callers to teach their class. At least three other clubs that I know of have classes which are composed of two-three squares, mostly of new dancers, instead of the 5 or 6 squares, with just two or three new dancers per square, that it should be. Then the callers could spend the evening teaching and having fun with the dancers rather than continually having to straighten out confused squares.

NOTES

Cherry Ridge has two dance halls, both with wooden floors.

An "X" appearing in the column labeled "RD" indicates that the resident cuer – Mary & Jack Pickett – will be cueing rounds between Square Dance tips. They will also provide a half hour of rounds prior to the Friday and Saturday night evening dances plus a teaching session Saturday afternoon.

you good dancers to come to the classes. We don't NEED more dancers to go to hot-dog weekend (although these too are declining in a major way). So please, don't ever ask me how "my" class is coming. You are liable to get a rude answer. Instead, come once or twice and see how it's going. Come and meet some of the new dancers. Come and dance with them.

LETTERS TO THE EDITORS...


Many square dancers cannot realize how serious our problems are. Our numbers are constantly shrinking, and there are two basic reasons:

1. Attrition is going on as it always has: (a) people move to other places as they get older; (b) people die; (c) people develop physical problems that slow their ability to keep up with the current pace.

2. Classes are few and small. Young people are not available. They work hard and do not have time to attend weekly classes. This occurs today in many other endeavors, and with a few exceptions, the new dancers are older people.

The new graduates (senior citizens) and the veteran dancers (senior citizens) are having a tough time at the current pace. We are 20-year veteran square dancers, and are typical of many others who are having problems. We realize there are some who prefer to dance at a fast and intricate pace. Just a short while back we did too. Square dancing survival will require that we dance at a slower level to keep new graduates and the old veterans.

We suggest that there be shorter patters, or else eliminate them altogether and have two singing calls. This will cut down on the physical activity and make square dancing more fun. There are thousands of good old songs that are never heard at a square dance. Let's cut out the mediocre songs and have great songs. This could be a way to save square dancing and revive the wonderful songs that are so precious.
