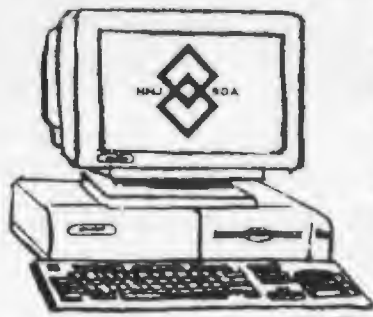

WELCOME NEW DANCERS

You are reading *Grand Square*, the Official Publication of the Northern New Jersey Square Dancers Association (NNJSDA).

What is the NNJSDA?

It is an organization of dancers who belong to member clubs. These clubs appoint Delegates, who attend 3 meetings a dance season, usually the 3rd Sunday in September and January, and the 1st Sunday in May. Anyone may attend a meeting, but only Delegates can vote. Each club has one vote. Every spring, the Delegates elect officers for the coming dance season.

What area is covered by the NNJSDA?

NNJSDA's area begins in the south with Mercer County, and goes north all the way to Rockland County in New York State (Rockytops and Rockland Promenaders). In the east, the area begins in Brooklyn (Al'e'Mo Squares and Kings Squares) and continues west to eastern Pennsylvania's Pike County (Dingman Dancers).

How do I become a member of the NNJSDA?

You automatically become a member when you join a member club. There are currently 30 member clubs.

What does the NNJSDA do for you?

1. Publishes *Grand Square* three (3) times a year, which prints club and Association news, a dance calendar, regular and guest columnists, as well as information on the many other facets of the square dance activity. Look for copies at your club.
2. Provides insurance for the dances and classes of member clubs (exception: New York clubs).

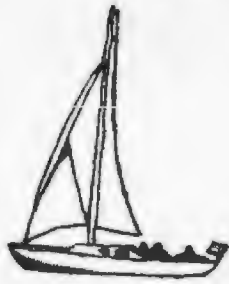

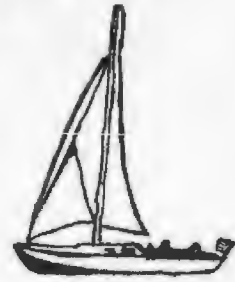

3. Holds a special Summer Special dance program for new graduates
4. Has a *Freeloader Program* for new dancers, which is earned by attending all 3 of the NNJSDA Summer Specials. The Freeloader entitles you to attend 1 Association Dance FREE during the next year. A blank Freeloader card is in your graduation packet. Have it signed by the NNJSDA Treasurer at every Summer Special you attend.
5. Has a *Patron's Award* for visiting 26 member clubs on their regular dance night. A blank Patron's card is in your graduation packet. When you visit a member club, have their treasurer or president sign and date the card.
6. Has a *One Square is Fair Award* (presented twice a year) to member clubs who have at least one square in attendance at Association Plus and Summer Specials.
7. Holds Special Plus Dance Programs on the 5th Fridays or 5th Saturdays of the dance season, usually with national callers and cuers.
8. Holds a Mini-Festival, featuring Mainstream through Challenge dancing, every November for a full day of dancing. The next Mini-Festival is November 8, 1998 (see page 6).
9. The Association makes available instruction booklets for Mainstream and Plus classes and diplomas for graduation.
10. Assembles special packets of information for new graduates that are presented at graduation by an Association Officer. The Association also awards a special dangle for perfect attendance at classes.
11. The Association provides Dance Clearance, through the Recording Secretary, of all club dances and specials to prevent conflicts.
12. Sponsors a *Poster Contest* (see page 9) every year to foster interest in square dancing, and distributes publicity packets.
13. Provides a forum for discussion and dissemination of flyers at the Delegates Meetings.
14. Has a NJ State Outfit Chairman, who has the patterns and fabrics for the green and white NJ State Outfit. This outfit is worn at National Square Dance Conventions for the parade of states as well as other special occasions when the dancer wishes to be identified from NJ. Nominations from the floor will be accepted for each position. Candidates for office must meet the eligibility requirements as stated in the Constitution, Article VIII Election of Officers:

- Section 1. Individuals receiving remuneration from any Member Club directly or indirectly, are not eligible for election to office.
- Section 2. To be eligible as an officer in the Association, candidates for office must have served as a Delegate of the Association or an officer of a Member Club.
- Section 3. To be eligible to hold office as President of the Association, candidates for office must have served as an Officer of the Executive Committee.
- Section 4. Election of officers shall take place at the Annual Meeting, from a slate presented by the Nominating Committee and nominations from the floor. Any nominations from the floor must have prior consent of the candidates. The Nominating Committee's slate shall be presented to the Delegates not less than 30 days prior to the Annual Meeting.
- Section 5. Election shall be by simple majority of the Delegates present and voting. The vote shall be by secret ballot whenever a contest occurs.
- Section 6. The elected officers shall serve for a one-year term, starting June 1st.
- Section 7. No person shall hold the same office for more than two consecutive terms.

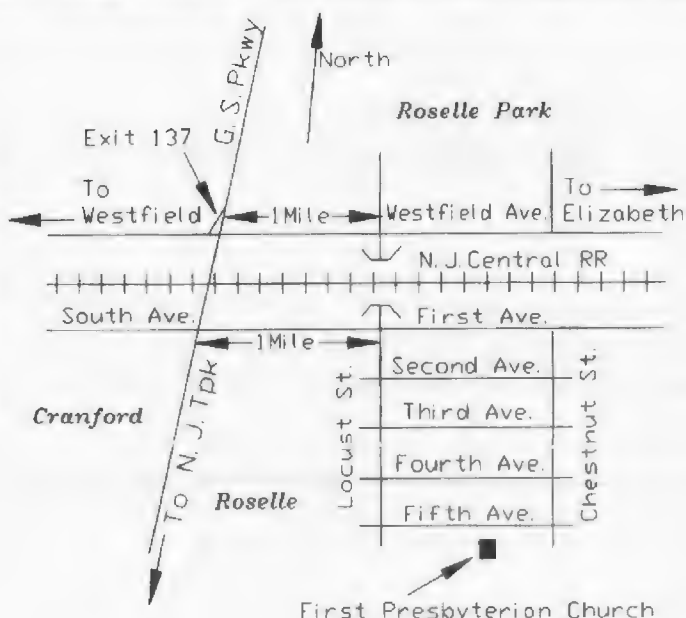

LETTERS TO THE EDITORS...

This letter is in response to the Berlinruts' letter in the Winter/Spring 1998 Issue:

The wonder of square dancing is that it attracts people with a variety of motives. Some of the new dancers are "older people" with physical limitations, but many are "empty nesters" looking for social and aerobic activity. If square dancing gets the reputation of being an old folks activity, we will never attract energetic people of any age.

I've been square dancing on and off since 1948, and some days I may have to find square dance clubs that are slower. However, I currently seek out those clubs that hire fast callers with high-energy choreography and have round dancing between tips. Square dancing survival requires clubs that offer a wide variety of styles. Clubs should exist for the Berlinruts to find gently paced square dancing, but this activity also needs fast and medium paced dancing. I want to see more "hootin-n-hollerin, let-it-all-hang-out clubs" that will attract a younger crowd with enough years left after they finish classes to fill our ranks. I'd like to see our ACTIVE clubs get out and really "strut their stuff" doing demos in highly public places so that the "Boomers" and other "youngsters" can see that square dancing is fun to do.

I want to give you some information about adding yokes to patterns that do not include them, but first I will report some changes we have made to the State Outfit Pattern. The NNJSDA, via the State Outfit Coordinator, has made patterns, fabric, and emblem kits for the State Outfit available for many years as a service to our dancers. For a nominal fee we provided homemade copies of vest patterns and charged only the overhead for the other items. It has always been intended as a service not a business. There are times,

however, when economy is wasteful and this is one of those times: hand-drawn patterns have minimal instructions and guidelines and have proved to be confusing to the sewor. We have decided to update the service, and so have changed to a ready-made vest pattern. (We will continue to provide hand-made underskirt and overskirt patterns, but these are simple gore-type patterns and have not presented problems to the sewor.)

What does the State Dress look like? A white-stitched green vest with a 9" green and white state emblem on the back is worn over a white shirt or blouse. Either white or green pants or skirts are acceptable. Most skirted dancers wear a white underskirt with a green overskirt/apron trimmed with white eyelet, and this overskirt has the state emblem repeated on it. Either buttoned or bolero-style vests are acceptable.

The colors and emblems are the key to the outfit. Because zig-zagging around the state of New Jersey is a pain, we have the emblems pre-embroidered, complete with initials and stars, as a kit. They may be sown on (machine stitch or by hand), ironed on with fusible web, or attached with permanent fabric glue which is available at most sewing/discount department stores. Many sewors want to be sure the colors are correct so we make fabric available with the patterns. However, we have to charge postage and overhead, so it less expensive to buy fabric at a fabric store (see order form on page 48). The "new system" will allow the sewor to order a ready-made pattern from the coordinator, who will then shop for what is available in the current pattern catalogs and charge for the cost of the pattern and postage. Or the sewor can tap into the coordinator as an information resource, and then buy the pattern himself/herself.

Most patterns in the 1998 catalog lack yokes but it is very simple to add a yoke to a pattern. Simply lay the front and back pattern pieces on a sheet of paper (newspaper or freezer wrap) and trace the top 10" of the pattern around the neck and shoulder to the bottom of the armscye. On the back piece, place the mark on the armscye 5" down from the shoulder seam, and another 8" down the center back. Connect these two lines and you will see a yoke appear. This is the cutting line; cut away the waste paper along the line you just drew, and draw a second line 1/4" above for the full/seam line. On the front, place a mark on the armscye 5" down, another 6-1/2" down on the center front edge; fold the shoulder in half vertically and mark the fold line. Then open it and measure down 7-8" on the fold—this is the point of the yoke. You have full creative control at this moment: you can make the bottom line of the yoke straight, add another point, make it slightly curved, adjust the measurements to make it lower for the vertically handicapped or higher for smaller folk, or whatever you desire.

Give me a call and we can fill in the gaps. Have a nice summer!

CONFLICTS ON THE DANCE FLOOR

by Dick Mazziotti, Caller/Teacher

Let's face it, while square dancing is among the friendliest of activities, we are mostly human beings, and irritants can occur on and off the dance floor. We cannot, of course, stop the fact that they happen. We can, however, moderate their effect through good manners and thoughtful behavior.

It is a fact that square dancing is a cooperative venture. It takes 10 people (8 dancers, the caller, and the caller's partner of course) all playing in the same sandbox at once to make it work. Just as "plays well with others" was a sought-after entry on a report card, it is a plus on the dance floor.

Nevertheless, there are times when, for whatever reason, one or another of us turns testy. We appear in several guises:

The Glarer - Symptoms: Square goes down in flames. Jaw sets, lips firm into a very thin line, brow beetles and head shakes from side to side.

Cure: Smile and nod your head up and down. The Glarer won't know whether you're fer or agin'im.

The Quitter - Symptoms: At the first sign of difficulty, this one throws hands in air, looks to heaven, bows head, and walks in circles, thereby preventing the team from completing any further moves or joining the dance program.

Cure: Absent the ability to get his attention with a two by four, dance somewhere else for the next square.

The Follower - Symptoms: Some dancers, seeing a particular couple forming a square, will run across the room, partner swinging wildly at the end of the towing arm, knocking other dancers aside, to get into the same square...over...and over...and over again. Usually this is caused by the desire on the part of the Followers to be tugged and pushed into position by dancers who know what they are doing. The Followers run because they recognize the hapless couple forming the square as good dancers. Maybe it should be taken as a compliment...over ...and over...

Cure: This is a toughie. We do not want to encourage star or preset squares for every tip, and certainly do not condone walking away from a forming square. Unless you are comfortable politely telling someone that you've seen enough of them for this lifetime, or can hire trippers and blockers to cause interference until others fill the square, my only suggestion is the "slow wander" where you never quite seem to decide on which square to settle in until you find one with three couples already there.

The Abuser - Symptoms: This one is for real folks. Some of us have experienced dancers who actually yell at their partner when things get confused. Or even at other dancers, not their partners. I'm sorry, but this is intolerable behavior at this kind of activity. In virtually every case I have personally experienced, it was the Abuser's error that caused the problem.

Cure: This is the one type of dancer that I will not extend a helping hand to. I am not that understanding. If it is someone you think you can reason with, a side discussion away from the dance floor might be appropriate.

NOTE: In all cases, this is a special activity, not a life or death contest. There is no excuse for bad manners, on the floor or off. Any discussion about any problem can wait until the dancers in question are off the floor, and in private. In the meantime, try to fool everyone into thinking you are having the greatest time of your life. If you are any good at it, in a short time you may fool yourself too!

NOTE: Due the Callers Council of New Jersey (CCNJ) electorate voting me into

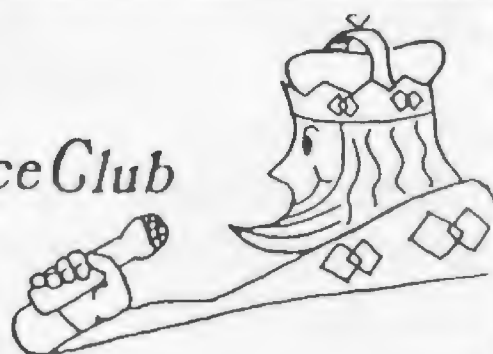

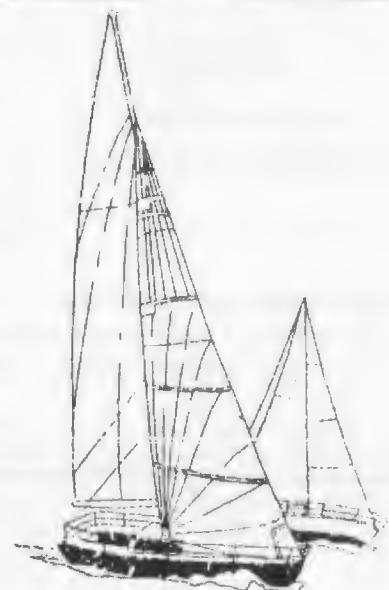

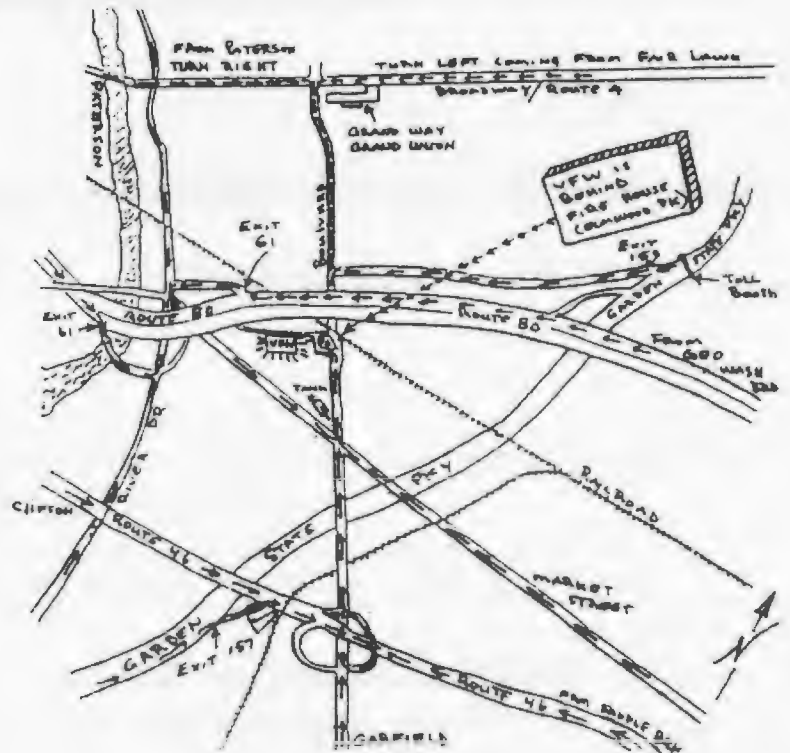

NOW THAT YOU HAVE THE NEW DANCERS— HOW DO YOU KEEP THEM?

Great! Your club has new dancers eager to learn how to square dance. Club members worked hard to attract these new dancers and certainly deserve recognition for a job well done. Now you can sit back and relax.

Wrong! Your work is just beginning. A successful new dancer program doesn't happen because you introduce the new dancer to the caller. A successful new dancer program happens because club members continue working to keep those dancers interested and excited. In fact, the true test of success is if the new dancers are so excited, they bring their friends into the activity the following year. It's up to you to create that kind of excitement or enthusiasm.

I know, that's easier said than done. You can't order people to have fun. You can't force people to stay with the new dancer program. You can't make them join the club and you certainly can't coerce them into bringing their friends into the activity. That's true, but there are things you can do to make your new dancer program the best it can be—a dynamic learning experience full of fun, friendship, and music.

One of the things we've allowed to slip by the wayside is the simple act of cheerfully and enthusiastically greeting everyone at the door with a smile, a "glad you came" remark, and a warm "Yellow Rock." Take this one step further by making sure members seek out the new dancers for conversation between tips. This simple act enhances your club's image of friendliness and makes the new dancers feel more at ease. Then, after the new dancers program is over, everyone should get another "Yellow Rock" and an "I'll see you next week." Your new dancers will appreciate the attention and will look forward to the weekly new dancers' dances.

Clubs can also assign members to each student or couple with the understanding that it's the member's responsibility to make personal contact with the student outside of the new dancer program setting. A telephone call between new dancer program nights to say hello, find out how the new dancer is progressing or even to set up a date to meet for coffee or shopping. Again, it's a simple thing to do but reaps so many rewards, particularly when we advertise and promote square dancing as a means of making new friends. We should remember that it is always easier for someone within a group to extend the hand of friendship than it is for the newcomer.

If your club sends out a monthly newsletter, devote a column or page to the new dancer program. Review the calls learned, highlight a few of the new dancers, remind them about the next new dancer program or special dance, and include information about square dancing that new dancers wouldn't know, such as the fun of going on a banner raid. Then personalize the newsletter for each student with name and address. If a student isn't at the new dancer program, then mail the newsletter. This is one of the first steps toward making the new dancers think of your club as his/her own.

By including new dancers in club activities whenever possible—barbecues, pot lucks, theater nights, etc.—you reinforce the concept of friendship and make the new dancers feel as if they are an important element of the club. Let's face it, new dancers are an extremely important element of the club. Let's face it, new dancers are extremely important. They are the future of the club and the activity. By the time graduation comes along, new dancers

should already be fully integrated into your club. When you hand them their club badge—and if you aren't giving it to them free of charge, think about doing so—it's icing on the cake. I should stress one point here: make those invitations to club activities with a personal call. Don't just announce it at the new dancer program or in the newsletter, because chances are your new dancers won't come. Go the extra mile and call to enthusiastically invite them to join in the activity.

Look for opportunities during the new dancer program year to award new dancers dangles that they can hang on their new dancer badge and then transfer over to their club badge later. Opportunities to award a dangle can vary and are limited only by your imagination. Obviously, once new dancer program level dances start, you can award a dangle for traveling. In many areas around the country, a square or two of new dancers and club members attending a new dancer program level dance counts as an official banner raid. You can make the reasons for the dangle award as silly or as serious as you want. The important concept here is getting the new dancers involved on a more personal level. And when they do achieve a dangle, award it with fanfare and lots of clapping.

The objective of a club's having new dancer programs each year is to perpetuate the square dance experience and to ensure the longevity of the club. By applying these ideas (none of which are new) diligently, we can reverse the current decline in the activity that brings us so much pleasure. Remember, enthusiasm is the key in everything we do. It is contagious. People are drawn to enthusiasm like moths to a flame. Where there is enthusiasm, you'll usually find laughter and people having fun. And that, my friends, is the true value of square dancing. It's what keeps us in the activity and draws others into it as well.
