

LETTERS TO THE EDITORS...

"Was the square dance demo a success?" Being asked this question over and over again led me to write this letter. By success the asker implied or actually added, "How many signed up for classes?" My answer invariably was, "Yes, the demo was a success. Lots of people saw the fun of square dancing and now know what square dancing is."

I think the idea of doing demos for the purpose of recruiting for classes has to change. The square dance community should be out dancing in front of the public, or non-dancing populace, as often as possible all year long. We need to let people see that square dancing is exercise for the body and brain, and fun toonot the hokey square dancing from school days or the country western dancing on TNN. And they need to see it again and again and again. In time, if they see it enough, we will attract some people because they decide they like the activity and others as they find time in their lives to fit it in. But we need to plant the seeds and let them germinate.

Club membership is down because the number of new dancers coming in is down, and it is sad to hear how many clubs couldn't get a class together and how many clubs are folding. Our recruitment methods need updating and all dancers from all levels need to be involved. Square dancing is the best kept secret around and the time has come to open the door and let the secret out. Demos are one way of doing this. We need to be seen! *Chariss Smith, Rockland Promenaders*

LETTERS TO THE EDITORS...

The survival of square dancing depends on: 1. Recruiting new dancers; 2.

Keeping new dancers active.

Recruiting new dancers: We must find ways to get people to try our favorite pastime. One idea for getting people to try square dancing: Offer barn dances as a fund-raising event to other groups. For instance, the event might raise money for a new organ for a church; new uniforms for a team; a school trip to Washington, D.C.; help a disaster-stricken neighbor; new equipment for a fire department or rescue squad; and any event that might garner media attention.

The organization wishing to raise funds arranges the dance hall, does the publicity and ticket sales. Square dancers would arrange for the caller (possibly at a reduced rate if there will be publicity, especially for a class), and provide the demo dancers. The square dancers and the sponsoring organization work

together in arranging the date and the time.

If getting a hall is difficult for the sponsoring organization, the square dance club involved might set up one of its dances at the fund-raising barn dance, but the organization must be heavily involved in selling tickets, especially to its own members.

Keeping new dancers: We must have them feeling part of the club and having fun. The feeling of being part of a club is to form a closeness with the other members. A feeling of being part of the club is formed by a gradual integration into the club, such as having them come to a club dance where the dance is at their level two or three times before graduation. Raid other classes or Mainstream clubs with as many new graduates as possible and have an equal (or greater) number of club members.


and contributions to make that evening a success.


Our dance year is off to a good start with great callers and our usual excitement level with a party atmosphere. Our DBD/APD Mainstream workshop

Callers Council of New Jersey meets regularly in December, March, June, and September, on the second Saturday of the month. Our meetings range from incredibly boring to wonderfully exciting. (Boring is listening to the President drone on about something no

one wants to hear. Exciting is our workshop and discussion sessions where we discuss our own abilities.)

Except for those who occasionally get roped in by a caller to help with a basement workshop session, most dancers never see the amount of work that typically goes on in the making of a caller. Knowing how to dance is not enough. Knowledge of the call definitions, where they can legally start, and where they end is a complete study in itself, and the subject of many, many hours of study by callers. Callers also need to know the kinetics of dance, or how the bodies move to the various calls. Dancers who have had their heads snatched off their shoulders by us when we forget body flow are participating in the caller training process, albeit as a nonvolunteer.

Timing is a huge factor that callers must consider literally every second of every call. Differences of fractions of a second in call delivery can effect your dancing tremendously, both positively and negatively. Callers who have been to a caller's school are often shown vivid examples of what a very little difference in timing can do to the smooth flow of a dance. On the other hand, most of the callers you really enjoy are concentrating hard on their timing continuously.

Hand availability is also a large caller consideration. Calls start with either a right or left had move, and end with either a right or left hand move. But woe betide the caller who too often tries to have dancers using the same hand twice, or even three times in a row. You, Joe & Sue Dancer, may not know what's wrong, but you'll surely know something is wrong.

So callers study, and work out dance choreography, spending many hours on a simple singing call, to make sure it is enjoyable, smooth-flowing and workable for the dancers. And as you have often seen, all that work can go for naught when some aspect is overlooked, and the best laid plans of mice and callers go astray and the figure doesn't work out. Dancers are left experiencing the dreaded mill-arounds, while the poor working caller tries to salvage the tip.

On the other hand, when callers do their homework successfully, deliver their product as planned and on time, the dancers and callers together get to enjoy an activity that can be magic.

There is another side of this smooth-dancing equation that is also important. That is dancer proficiency. You, the dancer, must also study your craft. Perhaps not as intensely as the callers must, but you still have a responsibility to be at least familiar with the calls on the program you elect to dance. And don't forget that whatever program you dance, it includes all the calls from all the preceding programs. That means if you dance Plus, you should know how to Fan the Top, and See Saw. If you dance A-2, you should know how to Load the Boat from any position, as well as how to do Wheel Around and Circle Left.

If you find that you are in squares that are continually forming facing lines to restart dancing, you may want to investigate your own level of proficiency. Perhaps it is time for you to attend a class as an angel and refresh your own proficiency so you can enjoy the dances more fully. Some clubs ask for a preliminary half-hour workshop. Typically, it is for a next-level program call (a Plus call for a Mainstream dance, etc.), but maybe some of your club members





WHAT IS A NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE CONVENTION?

A National Square Dance Convention is a once-in-a-lifetime experience for many square dancers, since it is an event that takes place close to home only once in roughly 10 to 12 years. The National Convention is the largest Square Dance Convention, and is considered to be the apex, peak, or top event of a square dancers' career.

Webster's Dictionary defines a convention as "a body of delegates, members, representatives, or the like, periodically convened for a common purpose." Usually a very large and complicated meeting of those with a common interest. Usually requiring the work of many committees and one chairman. Can last from one to several days. Usually repeated on an annual or alternating year basis.

Therefore the National Convention is a gathering of a large number of dedicated square dancers, round dancers, contra dancers, cloggers, folk dancers, country western dancers, callers, cuers, leaders, organization officers, and suppliers, at a convenient location for the purpose of discussing common objectives, exchanging ideas, trying out new techniques and dancing together.

Without question, the National Square Dance Conventions are some of the largest, most successful gatherings anywhere in the world. The most awesome and unbelievable fact to sophisticated, professional convention planners is—the 4-day convention is planned and conducted by amateurs and volunteers, and they are financial successes! The amateurs devote thousands of hours just for the love of their recreations.

Estimates of the labor cost, if the dancers were paid for the convention work, would run from \$1.5 to \$1.75 million while the rent of the convention

centers and all the other expenses connected with putting on the convention can run as high as several hundred thousands of dollars more. These unpaid volunteers, donating their time and talents, keep the cost down for the dancers who attend.

WHY GO TO A NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE CONVENTION?

It might be asked why should you go to a state festival or a weekend special or even to your club dance. It is, of course, the enjoyment you get from dancing and visiting with friends.

A National Square Dance Convention is in one sense a much larger festival, with dancers from all over the world with whom you may become "instant friends." The convention is also the world's largest square dance shop with 200 booths. The largest seminar of educational features, with many hours each day of panels, clinics, workshops, on a variety of interesting and important subjects vital to the growth of square dancing. It is the largest fashion show, featuring square dance apparel for men and women, and Sew

and Save Program to help the novice as well as the experienced seamstress.

It is an opportunity to see dozens of exhibition groups instead of just two or three; to learn new figures, new round dances, clogging routines, line dances, contra and heritage dances. At the National Square Dance Convention, the Parade of States will thrill you just as much, whether you join in or watch from the grandstand. 


