



LETTERS TO THE EDITORS. . .

The following letter was sent to the Presidents of Circle Eights, Motiv8ors, RockyTops, and Western Wheelers with copies to Tenakill Twirlers, Pelham Promenaders, Mt. Pleasant, CCNJ, HVCC, HVC, and NNJSDA:

It's truly frightening! Half our Mainstream club members are Advanced or Challenge program dancers, one-third are in the Plus program, and only seven active members are Mainstream dancers. A few are new dancers, and all are people with jobs, families, or other non-square dance commitments so that they do not have the time or inclination to get heavily involved in the Club. There are two kinds of Mainstream dancers. One kind is the transitory members on their way to Plus and Advanced programs (some of whom maintain membership in MS "mother" clubs). The other kind are the dedicated Mainstream dancers who are usually content to dance at their own club and, if we're lucky, go on raids, share in social functions, and be angels. Where there are enough such members, a Mainstream club is healthy, meaning it can get officers and committees to run the club and can recruit and train new dancers.

Plus and Advanced clubs have officers and committees to produce a dance once or twice a month. Their biggest problem is drawing members from <u>dancers</u> who have completed the Plus program. Mainstream clubs also run dances once or twice a month. Mainstream clubs also run dances once or twice a month, but also have the problem of recruiting <u>new</u> dancers from the nondancing population. However, a Mainstream club needs to have fun dances to keep its Mainstream dancers happy and be "interesting" enough to keep the attention of *Please turn to page 10*

WELCOME NEW DANCERS



You are reading *Grand Square*, the Official Publication of the Northern New Jersey Square Dancers Association (NNJSDA).

What is the NNJSDA?

It is an organization of dancers who belong to member clubs. These clubs appoint Delegates, who attend 3 meetings a dance season, usually the 3rd Sunday in September

and January, and the 1st Sunday in May. Anyone may attend a meeting, but only Delegates can vote. Each club has one vote. Every spring, the Delegates elect officers for the coming dance season.

What area is covered by the NNJSDA?

NNJSDA's area begins in the south with Mercer County, and goes north all the way to Rockland County in New York State (Rockytops and Rockland Promenaders). In the east, the area begins in Brooklyn (Al'e'Mo Squares and Kings Squares) and continues west to eastern Pennsylvania's Pike County (Dingman Dancers).

How do I become a member of the NNJSDA?

You automatically become a member when you join a member club. There are currently 28 member clubs.

What does the NNJSDA do for you?

- 1. Publishes *Grand Square* three (3) times a year, which prints club and Association news, a dance calendar, regular and guest columnists, as well as information on the many other facets of the square dance activity. Look for copies at your club.
- 2. Provides insurance for the dances and classes of member clubs (exception: New York clubs). Please turn to page 6

- 3. Holds a special Summer Special Dance Program for new graduates.
- 4. Has a *Freeloader Program* for new dancers, which is earned by attending all 3 of the NNJSDA Summer Special Dances. The Freeloader entitles you to attend 1 Association Dance **FREE** during the next year. A blank Freeloader card is in your graduation packet. Have it signed by the NNJSDA Treasurer at every Summer Special Dance you attend.
- 5. Has a *Patron's Award* for visiting a percentage of the member clubs on their regular dance night. A blank Patron's card is in your graduation packet. When you visit a member club, have their treasurer or president sign and date the card.
- 6. Has a One Square is Fair Award (presented twice a year) to member clubs who have at least one square in attendance at Association Specials and Summer Special Dances.
- 7. Holds Special Plus Dance Programs on the 5th Fridays or 5th Saturdays of the dance season, usually with national callers and cuers.
- 8. Holds a Mini-Festival, featuring Mainstream through Challenge dancing, every November for a full day of dancing. Next Mini-Festival is November 14, 1999 (see ad on page 5).
- 9. The Association makes available instruction booklets for Mainstream and Plus classes and diplomas for graduation.
- 10. Assembles special packets of information for new graduates that are presented at graduation by an Association Officer. The Association also awards a special dangle for perfect attendance at classes.
- 11. The Association provides Dance Clearance, through the Recording Secretary, of all club dances and specials to prevent conflicts.
- 12. Sponsors a *Poster Contest* (see page 8) every year to foster interest in square dancing, and distributes publicity packets.
- 14. Provides a forum for discussion and dissemination of flyers at the Delegates Meetings.
- 15. Has a NJ State Outfit Chairman, who has the patterns and fabrics for the green and white NJ State Outfit. This outfit is worn at National Square Dance Conventions for the parade of states as well as other special occasions when the dancer wishes to be identified from NJ.



NNJSDA POSTER CONTEST

OBJECT OF THE CONTEST: TO STIMULATE INTEREST IN SQUARE DANCING.

- 1. Anyone is eligible to enter whether or not they are square dancers. Any number of entries may be submitted.
- 2. All posters must be 8-1/2" X 11" done in black ink on white paper or poster board.
- 3. Subject may be any square dance theme, but must include: a. National Square Dance Month—September
 - b. Sufficient space for each club to fill in their own class or open house information.
- 4. The subject matter must not be localized to any one geographical area.
- 5. Judging will be the responsibility and honor of the NNJSDA Executive Board at its Sunday, June 6, 1999 meeting.
- 6. All entries, including the winning poster, will become the property of the NNJSDA, and at their discretion be reprinted to promote square dancing in New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, and displayed at National and State Square Dance Conventions.
- 7. The winning poster will be featured on the cover of the Fall Issue of Grand Square.



Plus and Advanced dancers. The burden falls on Mainstream clubs to publicize square dancing, run demos, have fun nights, run classes, be angels, and hold and attend student dances. Then we must work to hold on to the new graduates and retain enough of the "upwardly mobile" dancers to become officers to run the club. Obviously, with seven Mainstream dancers, we do not have enough eligible and capable Mainstream members to fill offices and committees.

WE NEED HELP! Everyone is aware of the lack of new dancers coming in at the Mainstream level. Is everyone aware there is and will be a "trickle up" effect? We all (dancers in all programs) must work together to recruit and keep new dancers to re-establish the base of the square dance triangle. I have an idea of how all clubs can support the recruiting process. Let's form area committees (Rockland county; Rockland and Bergen counties; or Rockland, Bergen, and Westchester counties) to handle publicity and demos and Fun Nites (including a general dance party that Burt Schain would like to put on—Burt is good that this sort of thing). The idea is to have three committees made up of members of various clubs and dancers of all programs. One committee would produce several demos this summer in public places, such as shopping centers, county and local fairs, street sales days, parks, and cable TV (if possible). Another committee would produce ads and press releases for newspapers, radio and TV. A third committee would produce Fun Nites.

I am taking the first step by asking that the president of each club seek members of his (or her) club to volunteer for the appropriate committee. We need people with enthusiasm, some know-how or willingness to learn, and who believe the job must be done. If you send me a roster of your volunteers for each committee, I will endeavor to help set up the committees and send them on their way. To get a program going this summer, the committees need to be securing locations, callers, insurance, and, ultimately, dancers. This means we need committees operating by May 1. Please hurry: we're late getting started. The main purpose is to publicize square and round dancing over the summer and run Fun Nites and Burt's Party to recruit potential students.

By copy of this memo, I'm asking CCNJ, HVCC, HVC, NNJSDA, and the NNJRDLC for any help they can give us.

Let's work together and recruit lots of new people for fall classes.

To be eligible as an officer in the Association, candidates for office must have served as a Delegate of the Association or an officer of a Member Club. Section 3. To be eligible to hold office as President of the Association, candidates for office must have served as an Officer of the Executive Committee. Section 4. Election of officers shall take place at the Annual Meeting, from a slate presented by the Nominating Committee and nominations from the floor. Any nominations from the floor must have prior consent of the candidates. The Nominating Committee's slate shall be presented to the Delegates not less than 30 days prior to the Annual Meeting.

- Section 5. Election shall be by simple majority of the Delegates present and voting. The vole shall be by secret ballot whenever a contest occurs.
- Section 6. The elected officers shall serve for a one-year term, starting June 1st.

Section 7. No person shall hold the same office for more than two consecutive terms.

Callers are usually quite visible, prancing and preening up on stage, cajoling or lashing the dancers with the microphone, singing or pattering. By contrast, little is seen or heard, usually from the caller's partner, the "Caller Hauler." Yet square dancing would not be the

activity it is, nor callers the stars they think they are, without suitable and frequent application of corrective measures by their partners.

Here is a catalog of just some of the positions callers' partners, both female and male incidentally, are called uon to fill:

Caller Hauler: Many callers work during the day and have to be picked up and driven to the dances to get there on time. This means the caller's partner has to get the equipment together, load the car, and arrive well before time to pick up the caller. For a 7:30 p.m. dance, it is not unusual for the partner to have to start to get ready at 3:00 or even 2:00 p.m.

Sound Engineer: Different halls call for different sound arrangements, more music, less voice, etc. While dancers usually feel that "MORE VOICE" is the right solution, the callers and partners know that subtle changes in lots of areas can affect the sound. So when you see a caller's partner at the back of the hall waving a finger in the air, he or she is not usually telling the dancer of the caller to stuff it, but is giving signals to the caller to adjust the sound.

Partner de Jour: It's interesting that different clubs seem to treat the caller's partner differently. In some clubs, the partner is expected to fill in anywhere, anytime, and with anyone, even the bad-smelling lurcher whom the club people avoid. Other clubs are quite classy, asking the partner politely if he or she would like to dance, and even filling our a dance card as appropriate. And, of course, partner are never ever allowed to make a mistake dancing. Fortunately, they don't (he said, sucking up).

Booster: While you will find this incredible, sometimes callers leave a dance feeling quite low about their own performance, some mistake they made, the quality of their calling, etc. Then it is the poor partner's lot to try to give a little fanny-pat so the long ride home is not also dreary. And partners do find extremely clever ways to say, "You're not a bad person, even if you couldn't resolve a single tip all night," and they make us believe it.


Critic: For every action there is a reaction. If a caller improves his or her craft, it is probably due directly to the partner, who has to find ways of saying, "With your voice, dear, take that record and burn it," about your favorite singing call, without appearing to be nasty about it. The single most important thing a caller partner can do is tell the caller about things that need improvement (a small list in my opinion; a large book of small print, in my partner's opinion).

Baby Sitter: Yes, it's true. Caller's partners have been asked to mind the little darling while mom and pop trip the light fantastic. But be careful with this one. I know some partners who will delight in teaching the child all manner of interesting things during their tenure.

Whine Connoisseur: I guess most dancers are afraid of callers. We must make it awful hard to talk to us about problems. Because there sure seems to be little reluctance to complain to partners. Also, where the partner is of the opposite sex, they get to visit the other bathroom and hear all the tales there.

Writing this column, of course, is taking my life in my hands. I know, for example, that each caller partner has a list 4 times as long as the above, and is absolutely sure I left our the most important items like: baking cookies, keeping





LETTERS TO THE EDITORS . . .

This article represents our views as square dancers. We started square dancing in 1946, and this was a time of growth of the square dance population. Clubs flourished in the United States. What helped make it popular and easy to learn was the result of the efforts of Bob Osgood and "Pappy" Lloyd Shaw, who started the standardization of all calls in 1935 so that square dancers could dance to the same calls at any location.

The club we belonged to in the 1970s still has on its banner, "We dance for fun," and has remained Mainstream. Thirty-five years later, it is still going strong and is continuously being reinforced by the addition of new graduates.

Starting around 1975, the gradual introduction of higher levels, that eventually added up to ten in all, started the separation of dancers from each other. There was no visible effort made by Advanced clubs to bring new dancers into Mainstream. We have seen caller-run clubs in Florida advertise their A-1 level at Plus clubs and, after these dancers made that move, these same callers then bemoaned the fact that there were less dancers in their Plus clubs. Then they asked their club dancers to go out and bring in more people to classes. This practice has been very discouraging to dancers, and definitely not an incentive for dancers to bring new people into the activity.

The awareness that the imposition of higher levels was causing a significant drop in the square dance population was reflected in the opinions expressed at educational panels and symposiums at National Square Dance Conventions since 1980, at which we participated nine times as moderators or panelists. The club officers and members attending were even then expressing their dissatisfaction with too much to learn in too short a time, and too many levels after graduating into Mainstream. The push toward higher levels resulted in dissatisfaction by many dancers to becoming "perpetual students."

When there was just one category of the square dance, there were between 10 and 25 squares in attendance at club dances. The size of the attendance was based on: The skill and charisma of the caller; the density of the population in the area of the club's location; and a club's convenient location. At that time period in the area that we danced, most clubs danced twice each month. This plan encouraged dancers to visit or raid other clubs, and to dance more frequently to other callers. It also made allowance for the fact that there were other social activities in which the square dancers might like to participate.

Today, club membership has dwindled and attendance has fallen in many areas to three or four squares per dance. With that small attendance, clubs scheduling a dance once every week have considerable difficulty in meeting expenses, particularly the increasing cost of renting a hall. One suggested solution is having club dances twice each month, possibly alternating with another nearby club using the other weeks. One example of the consistent drop in members is our regional square dance association which had a membership in 1982 of 630 members; in 1988 of 498 members; and in 1998 of 218 members. During the past 20 years, dancers expressed their dissatisfaction in being "perpetual students," voted with their feet, and walked out.

In 1990, a new generation of callers gave recognition to the fact that it was the callers who developed and imposed the systems of "levels" on the square dance activity and that, because of its damaging effect, it was logical that it should be up the callers to now abandon that system and return to some form of the original plan which had produced the greatest growth in members in


THE NEW JERSEY CONVENTION IS BACK!!!







the square dance activity. These callers proposed a category which is essentially a return to that original concept and call it simply the "Square Dance." They would reduce the field to just three categories: Square Dance, Advanced, and Challenge.

It took 20 years of levels to reduce the square dance population to the lower membership that it has today. It may take five years or more to turn it around and start filling our square dance halls again. Now is the time to move from talk to decision and action. In Florida, 24% of all clubs are Mainstream, and 48% are Plus and higher. Gradual acceptance of the "Square Dance" category by the Mainstream and Plus clubs would change those figures to 72% of all clubs that could accept new graduates. There must be a broader base of clubs that accept new graduates, and keep them.

Accepting and strengthening the first category of "Square Dance" should merit the support of all Advanced and Challenge dancers. If there is no change forthcoming, the square dance population will continue to decline; there will be less new dancers to feed into these clubs; and, conceivably, they will be the first to disappear from the scene. Dancers and callers need to work together and concentrate more on being caretakers of the square dance activity and less on elevation of dancers to the higher levels.

The gradual decline in the square dancer population during the past 25 years is not due entirely to the imposition of the additional levels. There has been growing competition by other social activities such as bowling, tennis, and golf. Better promotion and packaging will be needed to bring the awareness and pleasures of square dancing to the attention of the non-dancers.

To summarize, we propose the following changes to stop further decline of the square dance population by returning to the original objective and that is: to promote and develop square dance clubs based on fun and fellowship (not proficiency). Eliminate all square dance "levels." Apply the following three categories of the square dance, with classes for each category: (a) Square Dance; (b) Advanced; (c) Challenge.

Much of the information and views contained in this article were learned from interested dancers and callers and also from articles in square dance publications. This is not, and should not be assumed, an adversary situation, pitting dancers against callers or vice versa, but rather a "grass roots" movement by all us (dancers and callers) working together as family, to revamp the procedures and guidelines to prevent further loss of dancers and callers when clubs fold. All of the above recommended changes will take understanding, time, and much cooperation to gain acceptance. We have all talked about the decline in the square dance population for several years. It is now time to do something about it.

The dancers are paying all of the costs in our activity. It is time for all of us to make our wishes known to our club, association officers, and callers. It is essential that all of us work together to assure that there will be acceptance of the "Square Dance: concept in our particular areas in the near future.




