#### From the Computer of... Frank and Helaine Penn, NNJSDA Presidents







### LETTER TO THE EDITORS...

Starting Basic classes in January as well as September is a great idea. Other clubs and we have doubled our number of students! This is a great way for people who began the classes in September to bring their friends in January, and they can even dance with them as angels. It also means that people who were busy in September can still learn to square dance without waiting an entire year.

We started a new Basic class in January. Our original class, which started in September, continued on the same night. We followed a model used by Randy Page in Connecticut. Andy Woerner, our teacher, began the Basic class at 7:30 PM. Our continuing Mainstream students and our regular club members angeled the new Basic students. The Mainstream lessons were conducted from 8:45-9:45 PM with the help of our club angels.

We are experimenting with the order in which the classes are held each evening. We have tried both orders, but we're uncertain whether the Basic or Mainstream section being taught first works best for the majority of MS students. Either way, they are encouraged to angel without overtiring themselves. We have students of all levels and ages, and need to be able to tailor the class to each person's needs.

Another challenge was having a place for the students who only know Basic to be able to dance through the summer, so they can return in September to continue their lessons. Many clubs and individuals in our area are being supportive and will be alternating Basic and Mainstream tips at their regular dances during the summer months. Thank you to Belles & Beaux, RocklandRockytops, F. A. D. Squares, Spinning Wheels, Andy Woerner (who is using his home), and the CCNJ. 

We will try to encourage them to dance during the summer without overwhelming them. People are very busy and need to find ways to fit this new activity into their lives. We have all been through that stage when you just begin and are not sure you are "good enough" to go to dances. When we started to dance, a couple mentored us and motivated us to continue and become more involved in our club.

Dual classes have the potential to help us repopulate our clubs with new dancers who can eventually take positions within the clubs and help them to flourish. We wish you lots of happy dancing and hope to see many of you at these Basic/Mainstream dances throughout the summer.


#### NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE CONVENTION – Parade of States


We'd like to extend our best wishes to Jim Snyder and Joe Landi for a speedy and full recovery from their medical problems.



### LETTER TO THE EDITORS... How I Make the Lakeland Squares Ad for Grand Square

The ad is made with the program Microsoft Publisher. I am going to explain the various steps I followed when I made the ad... (not the contents of the ad, which was done by the person before me). I'm going to start with the border and then explain the rest from the top down.

The border: In "View" I chose the option "Toolbars and Rulers" and then brought up the Format toolbar. On the Format bar I chose "border" option, clicked "more" to bring up the BorderArt tab, and then chose Shadowed Squares for Lakeland's border. I also made sure that the border was just slightly within the 6"w by 10"h, the size requirement for a *Grand Square* full-page ad.

The Lakeland header: I inserted a text box and typed "Lakeland" using Times New Roman, Size 36, and Bold. Then I drew 2 squares using the square option, and then added the "s" to the end using the same procedure I used for "Lakeland." I scanned in the picture of the boats and waves from an old flyer and inserted the file into the document. I also did the same thing for the dancers at the bottom.

The rest of the ad was done with text boxes using different-sized lettering and the same font (Times New Roman), all done in Bold. Each month was done using a separate text box. The lines were drawn in using the line function (tip: holding down the shift key will make the line straight) to separate the different sections. Then I printed it out and cut it using the guides the program puts on the paper.
