## Scrip Pharmacy Solutions Cards

Scrip Pharmacy Solutions Cards were distributed this fall to all organizations affiliated with the Square Dance Council of New Jersey, including the NNJSDA. The Council has received these cards as a result of its membership in the United Square Dancers of America (USDA).

This program was approved during the USDA annual Board of Directors Meeting at the National Convention in Anaheim. Dancers should be able to obtain average savings of approximately $\mathbf{2 0 - 2 5} \%$ off the retail price of prescriptions with this card. The USDA receives a modest royalty from this program, which will be used to promote square dancing. Dancers without a prescription plan can use this discount card. It can also be used in conjunction with your current co-pay prescription plan if your plan excludes certain types of drugs or if your plan has a deductible.

The card is not restricted to square dancers only. You can give the cards to family and friends for their use as well.

Ask your club president or NNJSDA delegates for the Scrip Pharmacy Solutions Cards.
