At the Callerlab Convention this past year, Chairman Jim Mayo discussed the shrinking of square dancing, what we can do to slow the decline short term, and how to reinvigorate the activity long term.

Jim felt we must start to develop new approaches to recruiting, teaching, and retaining dancers. We do not all have to use the same methods, but we do in fact need to widen our horizons. Many callers and dancers are resistant to any changes, but the facts are clear: if we don't change, the situation will continue to worsen.

Here is a list of innovative approaches I have seen or have heard about that are successful for some groups. I hope you find some ideas that your clubs can use to help turn themselves around. You may contact me for more information and/or to be put in touch with someone who is operating this type of program. # THE NEW JERSEY STATE OUTFIT 

Some Changes for 2002

The Square Dance Council of New Jersey has adopted several new options for the state outfit for a trial period of one year.

1. Skirts may be white, green, or calico designs. Calicos must be shades of green on green, green on white, or white on green.
2. Prairie skirts of the above colors and combinations are acceptable.
3. Black pants for men are acceptable.

The state outfit is worn at square dance conventions and other major square dance events where there is a "Parade of States" or a "Grand March" during which the dancers of each state march together. Traditionally, the dancers of each state wear the same outfit or the same color combination. New Jersey's outfits are kelly green and white, signifying the concept of the "Garden State." The options listed above are an experiment to determine whether more square dancers will participate at these functions if the choices are more "liberal." This is also an attempt to encourage dancers to wear their outfits more often as they will be more suitable for regular use.
