





One of the many functions of the NNJSDA, and one of my personal goals as President of the organization, is to provide educational opportunities for square dancers. An important part of being in a square dance club, besides knowing how to square dance, is being able to support and sustain your club. Square dancing is about fun, and no job in a club should be so demanding that a person feels hesitant to take it on. Unfortunately, most people learn how to carry out a leadership role while they are holding the office and never really get taught the skills to make the job easier.

The NNJSDA is planning to provide opportunities for experienced members to share such skills as organization, planning, and other subjects that will interest square dancers. These opportunities will become available as part of the Delegates Meetings (to which all club members are always welcome) and as a separate seminar called *The Gathering*. We encourage all square dancers to keep on the lookout for information about the sessions and to plan to attend and participate.

Our Association, Our Clubs: What the Individual Dancer Can Do

Our Northern New Jersey Square Dancers Association's Raid Program and One Square Is Fair Program encourage and reward our clubs for raiding other member clubs and for supporting our Association's Special Dances. Supporting your club's raids and other activities is loads of fun as well as essential to your club's health. Our Association also has two programs, <u>Patron</u> and <u>Freeloader</u>, which recognize and reward the enthusiastic participation of an individual square dancer. These two programs are for ALL dancers, new and experienced alike.

Become an NNJSDA Freeloader: When you attend three Summer Specials and the Mini-Festival in the same year, you are eligible for a Freeloader dangle and a free ticket to one of the next summer's dances. Just have the form signed by the Treasurer or Assistant Treasurer at each of the Summer Specials and the Mini-Festival. It then becomes your ticket into an NNJSDA dance the following summer.

Become an NNJSDA Patron: When you have visited 65% of the Association's Member Clubs (there is no time limit) on their regularly scheduled dance night and danced to their regular caller (if they have one), you are eligible for a Patron dangle. Have a club officer sign and date the form, then mail the form to the current NNJSDA President (address is listed in the Grand Square). If you have met all the qualifications, you will be awarded your Patron dangle at the next Association dance.

<u>Flyers for the Patron and the Freeloader dangles</u> are available at club and Association dances. For further information and forms, please contact Rusty and Richard Ball at 973-838-0312 or *NJSquareDancers@verizon.net*. Happy dancing!


New Format for NNJSDA Summer Dances Pre Rounds/ MS tip/ 1 RD/ PL tip

The NNJSDA Executive Board approved a new format for the Association's 2006 Summer Dances. The new format was suggested by a committee chaired by 3rd Vice President Billy Flynn, which worked to enhance the dance experience of new dancers and Mainstream dancers at our Summer Dances. The committee included Mainstream dancers, Plus dancers, and round dancers, and had the objective of looking into a format that would be enjoyed by all members of the Association's diverse membership.

The new format of our 2006 Summer Dances will retain a half hour of prerounds. Following pre-rounds, the first square dance tip is to be a Mainstream tip (patter and singer), followed by a single round, then a Plus square dance tip (patter and singer), followed by a single round. The dance will then continue this format until the last square dance tip; however, the last tip is to always be a Mainstream level tip. The dance will also be conducted to minimize the waiting time between squares and rounds to maximize dancing time. We will also ask the caller to invite everybody up if the singing call during the Plus tip will be Mainstream or "easy" Plus.

I hope that Mainstream dancers and new graduates will enjoy and support our Summer Dances. I view the use of this new format as a marketing trial. If the 2006 Summer Dances appear to be supported, I would like to see the marketing trial extended for a second year. My view is that if average attendance for two years of NNJSDA Summer Dances exceeds 90% of the attendance for the previous year, the new format should be continued on a long term basis for our Association's Summer Dances.




Helping Our New Dancers







Happy Squares

What makes square dancers happy? For one group of dancers, making others happy does the trick. That group is called (what else) the Happy Squares.

The Happy Squares are dancers from Tenakill Twirlers, RocklandRockytops, Hi Taws, and Motiv8ors who have been entertaining others since 1978. The idea started with the Tenakill Twirlers and grew to include three nearby clubs. The happy mission of the 20 or so participants is to share the fun of square dancing at nursing homes, senior citizen centers, schools, day care centers, and similar locations. Led by a caller, the Happy Squares entertain and educate with approximately 35 demos every year.

The arrival of the Happy Squares typically creates a stir of excitement as they appear in their showiest outfits. Curious spectators at both ends of the age spectrum have been known to sneak a peek at the crinkly crinolines. The Happy Squares dance at the Mainstream level and generate smiles throughout their audiences... usually. At the end of one senior group meeting, 95% of the members left before the dancers had even assembled for the demo! With that one exception, their rewards for spreading the joys of square dancing are hugs, kisses, and the extraction of promises to return.

While their roster is currently full, they encourage others to initiate similar groups in their own areas. The Happy Squares charge no dues and accept donations only to cover their expenses, but their personal compensation in providing happiness to others is priceless.
