CALLING ALL CLUBS

WANT NEW DANCERS?

HERE'S HOW!

Most dancers will agree that the biggest problem facing our clubs today is getting new people to swell our beginner classes which have been declining of late. New dancers are the life blood of square dancing. Here's a proven way to get them...Get your club on its first or second night of dancing this fall to plan and announce a gala beginner night on its very next regular dance night. How it works is simplicity itself - every member couple pledges to bring one interested couple to the new dancers night. Members not present on the night of the announcement should be contacted by phone or by personal call, and advised of the plan and what they are required to do.

Your caller can help mightily! He can arrange to have a special program for the "New Dancers' Night" - a good idea is to have each square consist of two regular dancer couples, and their two guest couples. This permits the caller to get the new people doing quite a few new things without much difficulty, and, most important, insures that they have a real good time. The program can consist of a tip like this with the beginners participating, followed by a tip for experienced dancers only, with the new dancers looking on. Plan special refreshments and a few gimmicks to maintain interest, such as a Grand March, simple mixers, etc. Arrange to sign up the new people for classes during the evening. Have some person give a good, carefully worded presentation on the benefits and enjoyment of square dancing to sell the new people on the idea of taking the classes, and sign them up.

Every couple square dancing today can look back to the time when some other person or couple went out of their way to sell them on the benefits of our favorite recreation. What better or easier way to help square dancing than to help new people get started on years of fun and fellowship. All you do is to get one new couple and share your night with them. You'll never regret it.
