

Several couples have made the suggestion we publish a booster list, while others have said they were glad this practice was discontinued as it gave more room for club and other news. Having never had a dearth of material for the 16 or 20 pages of GRAND SQUARE we prefer to



go along with the latter group. So, even tho we do not thank each and every one of you personally in print, we, the staff of Grand Square, just want all our boosters to know how much we do appreciate your support. Thanks loads for everything.

This year, as you've all heard from your delegates, something new was added to the Booster Drive. Since there seems to be some confusion over the rules, we will reiterate them here for all to peruse at their leisure... Have Fun. There are 26 clubs in the NNJSDA. At each different club the booster couple dances with, between February 1, 1967 and May 31, 1967 have the caller or president sign your booster tag and include the date and the clubname. (Even tho the club has more than 1 caller, one visit is all that is necessary.) On June 1, 1967 mail your booster tag with its signatures to the Lucarini's, 18 Edison Street, Staten Island, N.Y. 10306. The couple visiting the most clubs in the Association will receive a FREE LOADERS Badge and have the privilege of attending any and all NNJSDA sponsored dances free during the period from June 21, 1967 to May 31, 1968. Hence the name - Free Loader!!! Duplicate prizes will be awarded in case of tie. All entries must be received by June 7, 1967. If by any chance you do not think the tag will hold all the signatures, then use the January cover of GRAND SQUARE and have the caller or president sign the stepping stone...and include the date...and mail this with your booster tag to the Lucarini's by June 7, 1967. Here it is mid-March and we've seen some tags with 11 clubs represented!!! Some folks never stay home.

Please try not to confuse this Free Loaders contest with the article in Grand Square last month concerning the ~~Association~~ Jersey Rambler idea now being crystalized by Win McCarty, Al Searls and the Tirrells. Their idea, while it embodies visiting clubs, has no time limits set and does not begin 'til next fall. More about it in a future issue.
