

Back in February, 1968, NNJSDA Advisors George & Hazel Rose were asked to formulate some "ground rules" for club visitations, sometimes called "raids". This matter was most thoroughly discussed at two subsequent delegate meetings with the majority not desiring to steal banners (although the five interested clubs were listed in GRAND SQUARE). Tempus Fugit.

Gradually instead of stealing banners, travelling groups were formed to visit clubs and pin that particular club's banner. This trend has grown in popularity until many clubs have travelling groups and award a special dangle to members who have participated in a predetermined number of visitations. The ground rules are most simple - with most clubs writing their own; but TWO are so universal they bear including in GRAND SQUARE....1- The club must be visited on their regular dance night with their regular caller calling.

2- The visiting club must have at least 2 full squares to pin the banner.

As always the object is to try and get clubs to visit each other in groups and enjoy themselves. Happy travelling.

In an attempt to keep up with their brethern it appears they are really reaching and scraping bottom with such calls as the one currently in vogue therein one claps hands and then turns in a circle with his partner. The name of the call, as indeed with many other calls, escapes me for me it is beginning be too much work to remember them all. And what about "Motivate"? What did its creator have in mind? Motivate what? More work? Perhaps driving people away? Cannot something be done about too much work in dancing? Cannot we have the pure joy and fun of it all? Cordially, Muriel Osage" EDITOR'S NOTE - In the March issue of the NEW ENGLAND S/D CALLER was a petition sponsored by EDSARDA (Eastern District Square and Round Dance Association) concerning the establishment of a nationwide list of 75 basics and another list beyond this; a request for screening procedures for new basics; and a suggestion for limiting the number of new basics. The petition and final tabulations were sent to the International Callers Convention in St. Louis, Mo. in early April. The ensuing discussion

Showed the concern of all. More on this at a later date.

Your Association officers are also deeply concerned. Lacking a working Callers Association, the dancers can only make their comments known to local callers. In an attempt to better evaluate the dancing level of a club and help a dancer find a club more to his liking and ability, the editors, with the approval of the NNJSDA Ex. Bd., have come up with a new approach to classify clubs for next years roster. A list of 21 figures, which together with our basic 75, make up 99.9% of the figures that appeared in SQUARE DANCING for 1973 was distributed. Delegates were asked to be honest and evaluate their club - not themselves. (Some delegates said they had to take the list to their Ex. Bd for assistance). Clubs next year will be listed in the roster as 75+3, 75+5, etc....we ask your cooperation in trying this method. And we invite and value your opinions on this vital question.

If your club is like the rest of us you have probably been plagues with two problems. How to finance the vitally necessary beginners group without going broke and how to get as much mileage out of your hall as possible.

About seven years ago, Sleepy Hollow Squares in Manhattan fell to pieces and had to be rebuilt. At first we used the conventional format of having the beginners and the club dance on separate nights. Financially it nearly killed us because we only had one or two squares of beginners and not much more in the club. Since then we have gradually arrived at the format we now use that insures us a good house each week.

We dance every Monday, except holidays. On the second Monday of each month we have visiting regional callers from NJ, PA, CONN and MASS. We divided the evenings into two sections. The beginners meet from 7:30 to 8:45 and the club workshop meets 8:45 to 10:30. We expect the club members to come early and be angels and most of them do-since the club workshop is later that same night. True the beginners sessions are not as long as separate night sessions, but because they have plenty of help they progress just as fast. Along 8 to 8:30 the rest of the club filters in and at quarter to nine the beginners go home and the club workshop begins. This formula of having two dance sessions on the same night allows us to overdance our not-so-large hall. 


