DIRECTIONS TO REACH HALLS

BROOKLAWN JR. HIGH SCHOOL — Parsippany, N. J. — between Routes 46 & 10, just off Littleton Road (Route 202).

CEDAR HILL SCHOOL — Basking Ridge, N. J. — Take Route 287. Exit on Mt. Airy Road toward Liberty Corner. Take first left (Lake Road), continue to its end. Turn right (on South Finley), proceed long block. Turn left on Homestead for 1 block, turn left which ends at school.

FAIRLEIGH DICKINSON UNIVERSITY FIELD HOUSE — Teaneck, N. J. — from Garden State Parkway to Route #4. East on #4. Pass both shopping centers. Take River Road exit immediately after crossing Hackensack River. Go left under #4. Field House is immediately on left; going West on Route 4. Get off at River Road exit which winds around the Field House.

SOUTH JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL — Bloomfield, N. J. — from Garden State Parkway, heading North. Take Bloomfield exit (148), pay toll, continue straight across Bloomfield Avenue to next street which is Franklin Street. Turn right on Franklin Street for about 1 1/2 blocks.

ST. ADALBERT'S HALL — 363 Morningstar Road, Elm Park, Staten Island, N. Y. — From Goethals Bridge to Richmond Avenue exit. Turn left at stop sign to traffic light at Richmond Avenue. Turn left on to Richmond Avenue. Continue on thru light at Forest Avenue onto Morningstar Road; from Bayonne Bridge, turn left at end of bridge to Trantor Place; head south and take first right turn to Morningstar Road, make left to hall.

Again at the Hampshars one evening Walter handed Hal the mike and said, "Go ahead, Hal, you can do it!" From then on Hal became more and more involved as the years progressed. First, it was one night stands and then on to club calling.

First club was in Verona, and then dancing with Don Keane at the former Wayne Squares in Wayne. When Vin Caruso came into the area as caller for the Grand Prowlers, it was his encouragement and help that Hal first took the classes and learned to teach a class. During the years that followed on two occasions Hal & Doris were Presidents of the Prowlers, as well as Secretary and Treasurer. During their reign as President it was Florence Bradford who made the first small visiting banner for Prowlers. Doris & Hal also instituted the small pocket type cards with the dance programs for the club.

As the years went by Hal called for many of the Association clubs, both as visiting caller and also to help out in a crisis or SOS. The first western club calling was for Bell Labs to fill in for Vinnie in 1963. At this time Ed Olive was working with Isle Squares and again Hal was asked to fill in. His 1st date with Hi Taws in February 1964 when Slim Sterling was their caller. Time marched on and during the years that followed he called many times for the Hanover Squares, Tenakill Twirlers, Grand Prowlers, Hill City, Ramapo Squares, Hayloft, Hix & Chix, Reelers, Circle Eights, Somerset Hills, Sussex Spinners, Cross Trail Sq., M T Squares, Richmond Dancers, Mountain Squares, Ocean Waves, Princeton Squares, Squarenaders, Island Steppers (LI), Levittown Squares, (LL) Pioneer Squares (CN). When Hattie & Lou DeLeau started their Leisure Squares in Stroudsburg, PA, Hal was very happy to go to Stroudsburg to call for their first big dance. He has called for 4H's in Essex and Bergen Cty. Hal has called for every Association Summer Dance since 1964 and has also called for every Caller's Carnival and Graduates Ball. While Northern New Jersey is indeed fortunate to have many callers located within its area, few have ever been so willing to share their time and talents with so many as unselfishly as Hal & Doris. Their dedication and contributions to square dancing and square dancers are unsurpassed. Omaha, Louisville, Kentucky, and Philadelphia. Also in their travels in Europe were happy to call in London, England and meet many s/dancers.

Hal's first love is teaching new people. The feeling of satisfaction derived from the pleasure new people have in learning an entire new way of life means a great deal to both Hal & Doris. People - and all friends mean a great deal to Doris & Hal and the love of dancing has made them a very happy couple. Our loss is Vermont's gain.

Honeycomb smocking can be used at the tops of tiers on skirts, sleeve caps, wrists of long sleeves and even as insertions if worked separately and then inserted where desired.

It takes about twice as much fabric widthwise to make a piece of smocked work. (That is, 2 yards of fabric will be 1 yard wide after smocking.) For ease in learning a new art, it is highly recommended that you use gingham to learn on. It is preferable that you practice on a sample piece, $\frac{1}{2}$ yard is sufficient, and keep the sampler in your sewing box for future reference. The size of the checks for practice should be $\frac{1}{2}$ " or 1". The tinier ones are harder to work on.

Use strong thread in a matching or contrasting color.

Work from right to left, starting in about 1" from right hand edge, & down about 2 or 3 rows.

Start by bringing the needle up at the lower right corner of a white square, take a stitch at the lower left corner of same white square pull together and take a stitch thru both pieces, go down under the shaded square & bring needle up at the lower right corner of the next white square and repeat as before. That is all you do all across making row 1.

Row 2- Bring needle up at the lower corner on the right of the dark square in row beneath starting again on right margin. Take a stitch go across to the lower left corner, take another stitch, pull together & secure with a tiny stitch, go under shaded square, come up again in lower right corner of dark square & go across as before Repeat rows 1 and 2 as many times as desired. 5 rows makes a nice effect. Contrasting thread makes just dots of color appear in between. For a different effect try working from the centers of a square instead of the corners. If you have any questions I'll try to answer them if you call after 6 p.m.









TIPS TO GRADUATES - BADGES



Most graduates received a club badge upon graduation from their mother club. Wear it with pride whenever you go to a dance. And to those who earned a perfect attendance dangle, our congratulations. They may be easily attached to your club badge - either drill a small hole or use a small brad or large needle, heated red hot and burn a hole in your badge.

As you enter the wonderful world of s/ding, you will discover a profusion of fun badges. They are no more than mementoes of a "squaringly good time"...and cover every situation from A to Z. Some couples avidly collect them. Others may have earned the right to wear them, but don't bother. These badges are no criteria as to the wearer's dancing ability. There are many badge companies (see p. 37) who will create any badge.

But there are several awards that represent a bit more.....

FREELoader - graduates have only one opportunity to earn this - by attending all 8 NNJSDA summer dances (have the treasurer initial your card). Not only do you earn the coveted dangle, but also free admission to all NNJSDA dances between 9/1/75 and 5/31/76 except the mini-festival.

PATRON DANGLE - for those who have danced at 26 NNJSDA member clubs on their regularly scheduled dance night and to their regular club caller, if they have one. In other words, it does NOT count if you attended a guest caller special. A club officer, usually the president, signs the patron card. These patron cards are yours, free for the asking, from any Association officer or Editors of Grand Square.

CENTURY CLUB - for those who have danced to 100 callers. An official signature book is available from any s/d shop for a small fee. There is *one basic rule - no more than 3 callers may sign in any 24 hour period.* In other words, if you attend a festival or ball where there are a number of callers, choose the 3 you may not have the opportunity to dance with again. (Round Dancers have a 50-Q club book available.)

A SQUARE DANCER IS SOMEONE WHO WILL:

Drive 4 hours and thru 3 states to get a caller's name for his Century Book.

Get a blow out, have the spare go flat, buy a tire and still make the dance.

Take HER dancing clothes to the office and change there in order to meet HIM at the dance.

Have at least one outfit in the trunk whenever the car leaves the house.

Plan all their vacations around s/ding festivals.

Follow a s/ders flag decked car to his home.

Keep telling everyone at home that she'd like a white crinoline and pettipants for Christmas or her birthday.

Invariably get lost when caravanning on a small road with No place to turn around.
