The Quarterly Movements Committee of CALLERLAB selected one new movement ( TRACK II) and one review movement (TURN THRU) for mainstream dancing during the months of July, August and September. We include a brief description in case you missed workshopping TRACK II this summer.

Track II by Dick Bayer. The action starts from a completed double pass thru formation. The normal formation is easily set up by having the head couples lead right and circle to a line. Lines pass thru, wheel & deal and double pass thru. The boys are in the left track and the girls are in the right track.

The dancers will work together in tandem, i.e. the trailing boy will follow in behind the lead boy and the girls will do the same (trailing girl will follow the lead girl). The dancers will do what amounts to a tandem partner trade with the two boys walking single file to the right around the girls. The girls will move single file to the left inside the boys to end still in a double pass thru formation. The movement continues as the dancers progress single file to a half tag formation, ending in two parallel ocean waves, boys on the end, girls in the center of the wave.

Turn Thru is No. 38 in the NNJSDA Basic Manual,





### Z, EGACY



The square dance world is not perfect - what is! But it is peopled with folks who are concerned with our American Folk Dance and where it is going. From a meeting in 1971 of todays callers/leaders who were members of the

S/D Hall of Fame emerged an organization, eventually to become known as CALLERLAB, whose desire was to share with the new callers some of the philosophies, techniques and abilities of the veterans.

Growing gradually over the years, Callerlab has accepted the responsibility of providing professional guidelines for S/D callers. Tho young in years (its third annual meeting was last April) its accomplishments are noteworthy.

One accomplishment all dancers are familiar with is the Quarterly Movements Clearing House established to remove the complaint of "Too many calls.". At this 1976 session, 6 of the 8 movements issued since the inception of the project have been retained temporarily for mainstream dancing including - recycle; walk & dodge; coordinate; half tag, trade & roll; ferris wheel; & pass the ocean.

Mainstream Basics have been researched to find those currently in use in the s/d activity. Procedures have been established for an annual review of their list to keep it up-to-date. "50 Basics" & "75 Basics" are no longer. Callerlab has adopted new terms more in keeping with the situation. "Basic Program", "Extended Program", and "Mainstream Program" and they recommend teaching in that order...suggesting about 41 sessions of 2-2½ hours each be used to teach the basics of all three lists. (Any dancer wishing to see the list, contact ye editors or your callers.)

Accreditation is a project that can be accomplished only by the callers themselves. In addition to the above is the development of a system of identifying various levels of calling and dancing. A workable curriculum for callers schools has been completed.
