Rec. Sec. - All Clearance requests up to date but one.






#### Dear Students:

This is your "Mother" speaking. I've watched you as you progressed through your weekly classes, & have the following comments for you.....


- 1. Read your S/D book & pamphlets given to you at various times throughout the year by your club & instructor.
- 2. Understand the "Ten Commandments" of S/D you don't have to memorize them, just know what is going to be expected of you, 8 what you can expect from other dancers across the country.
- 3. Attend Class Level Dances!!! The more the better!! They are programmed and planned specifically for you - the new dancers & the caller understands that you take just a little bit longer to com-plete a call than someone who has been dancing for several years. Just relax & enjoy the dance & get to know some new friends.
- 4. How do you get to a dance? Car Pool! It's friendly, & saves time & traffic congestion. The 'rules' that usually apply are: driver pays for gas, etc. & the passenger pays for tolls. Alternate drivers so that the same couple is not always the one required to drive.
- 5. Refreshments are served at both classes & regular dances. When your Class Instructor or Club Refreshment Chairman asks you to help, do so with enthusiasm. If they request 'home-made' goodies (cakes or cookies) and you always seem to burn boiling water, ask a relative or friend or neighbor to help you out, or find someone who does a fantastic job of baking, & trade off some other responsibility with them.
- 6. Attire: Gentlemen, remember that long sleeves are a MUST. Slacks, not denims or jeans (even if they are designer, & probably cost more than a pair of slacks). Bolo or scarf tie, towel & holder, & soft soled shoes. Soft soled shoes will frequently be listed on a flier as a requirement in order to dance in a particular hall. Ladies, a full skirted dress or blouse/skirt combination, petti-pants, crinoline, & soft-soled shoes. Part of the reason for the crinoline & full skirt is so you can do your 'skirt-work' on a promenade or star.
- 7. What are workshops? They are like private lessons, guided by either your caller or a very proficient dancer, who has both the time, space & patience to help you improve your skills.
- 8. Bring your tape recorder. Everybody loves to hear the sound of their own voice, & S/D callers are no exception. The value of bringing a tape recorder to class is that you can listen to it later on during the week, to review or refresh your memory or understanding of a call. Quite frequently, a caller will have a special "box" for you to plug your recorder into, so you will get the clearest sound possible.



9. When you are dancing, & someone makes a mistake, don't stand around in the square & argue as to who It serves no useful purpose at that time, did what. & only takes away from your dancing time. Instead. immediately reform into lines facing or a box formation, watch another square, & start dancing again. It doesn't matter that you may not wind up with your original partner- it does matter you keep on dancing. (continued on pages 12 & 17)









- 10. During the break between tips, as soon as you hear the music begin again, get up to form a square. Don't wait for someone else to invite you into their square. Stand up & hold up your hand for others to see that you have space available in your square.
- 11. Don't try to teach another student a new move. That is the caller's responsibility, & if only one person does the teaching, then all the students will understand & perform the move in the same way.
- 12. During class, there is absolutely nothing wrong with changing dancing partners every so often. In fact some clubs require it. That way there is less chance for bickering between couples.
- 13. When you are at a dance, you will see a "flier table" with all sorts of announcements about future dances. Take one of each of them that appeals to you, & follow the directions to another new dance. Fliers are the S/D method of advertising future dances to other clubs, etc.
- 14. At some time after graduation, you will most likely be asked to serve on some committees or as a club officer. Take this responsibility with enthusiasm & do the best you can for the club. If you find you have a problem, call on past officers of the club, who will be happy to guide you & give you some hints on the things they've learned.
- 15. If you are asked to participate in a demo, go,GO,GO! Demos are S/Ding's way of bringing our activity to the attention of the general public. Demos are fun, usually very short, & very gratifying, especially in the nursing homes. All of the residents in the homes may not be able to participate with us, but they love the bright & happy faces that S/Ders always bring with them.
- 16. If you have young children at home, why not try & find another couple in your area who is also taking lessons & combine the children for one baby-sitter (at slightly more than the usual fee for one family). This way, two families know that one person is looking after the children, & the split cost is slightly less (maybe the savings will pay for coffee & cake after lessons or a dance). 



It is courteous to move to the sidelines or hallways to carry on conversations. By clearing the floor, round dancers can quickly form their circle when the R/D leader puts on their records. S/Ding resumes immediately after the rounds. With, or without the rounds, your club dances will have the same # of tips & S/D time as this is the caller's rest period.

Now that graduation is here, I can only wish for you the same happiness and friendship that we received when we graduated some years ago. CHALLENGE DANCING IN THE NNJSDA ....

This past season has brought something new to the NNJSDA-Basic Challenge Level (C-1) dancing at Colonial Squares & Montville Squares. Let' see if we can help everyone understand what this means.

Just as there are various programs in Club Level dancing, there are also levels in Challenge Dancing. This often comes as a surprise to the non-challenge dancer, who usually thinks of all high level dancing as merely "challenge". Several years ago CALLERLAB did a lot to clarify this by defining the C-1,C-2,C-3 levels in prescribed lists of additional calls. required to learn for each level. Challenge is NOT the caller speeding up his material, using gimmicky choreography, or the dancers shortcutting movements. This season the C-1 CALLERLAB list was successfully taught to the A-2 dancers at Colonial Squares. This is just the next step for Advanced dancers looking for something new.

To those of us who have been involved in Challenge for many years, we see the present C-l level comparable to the old Advanced level before the CALLERLAB lists. Those levels beyond C-l are presently only being danced in Caller-run clubs and dances-probably because of the fewer number of dancers, the greater amount of calls to be learned, as well as the increasing difficulty of complex positioning at each level.

Yes, Challenge dancing is here and it is alive & well. Anyone who attended the recent January Jubilee in Philadelphia could see full floors of enthusiastic dancers in the Advanced, C-1,C-2 & C-3 halls.

One of the most frustrating problems in the S/D scene is that of dropouts. This can happen for various reasons at ALL dancing levels. The NNJSDA realizes that we must have healthy Clubs presenting all levels of dancing for the diversity of the people in the movement. Different talents, energies and desires are what makes us individuals, and a choice of levels (or programs) and clubs is what will keep square dancing the greatest pastime in the world. On June 1,1982 Pres. Reagan signed SJR-Public Law 97-188 designating the S/D as the National Folk Dance of the USA for 1982-83. The limitation amendment was placed by Congressman Robert Garcia,NY. Senate members voted for SJT 59 to be parmanent: Congressmen Mineta & Panetta (CA) introduced HR 1706 on Feb. 28,'83 with 41 co-sponsors. We need 218 cosponsors to get it out of committee to House floor for a vote. The National Folk Dance Committee asks all to contact their Congressman to co-sponsor HR 1706 NOW. Although the winter season has just given way to spring, it is not too soon to start thinking about ( and making) a jacket for next winter.



With the bouffant skirts we gals love to wear, to find an appropriate cover-up is difficult. So here are a few ideas.

A quilted jacket is both stylish and useful with regular street clothes as well. There are a few suitable patterns. The pattern should be loose fitting & with a minimum of seams. A size larger

than usual is recommended as the quilting makes it a little smaller. Cut out your pieces from the lining fabric, then from a lightweight batting, and finally from your outer fabric. Pin together and treat each piece as a single layer. The outer fabric may also be done in applique or patchwork or embroidery before assembling, sandwich style. Finish the edges with fold-over braid or binding. The first chill of Autumn and you'll be glad you made it.



A warmer type of jacket with or without a hood would be a jacket made of fake fur. How dressy & useful. Use a pattern where one of the fabrics recommended is a fur-like fabric. Again minimal construction. It will only need a lining, no interlining. Cut your


seams a little wider, don't try to press your seams-you can just finger-press them. A loop type closing or something that would not use conventional buttonholes would be a wise choice.

The fur-like jacket could be cut blouson style with a casing and drawstring. You could use it as a blouson type with regular clothes and fold the jacket under to the waistline without using the drawstring for square dancing.

I hope this has stimulated your imagination enough to try one- it will be a worthwhile addition for many years.
