

MINI FESTIVAL





NOTES FROM GRANNY'S HOUSE

A Bow Tie For Him:

Vary your gentlemans wardrobe with neck accessories that compliment your outfits.

Make him a bowtie wardrobe, this is a more dressy look, leaving the scarf and the bolo for a more relaxed mood.

Materials needed:

1 metal Bow Tie Clip


1 10"Lx 2½"W piece of fabric

1 12½"L x 2"W " " "

1 2"L x 1½"W " " "


Directions:

Fold the 10" piece of fabric in half, with right sides together. Stitch a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam so that you end up with a long narrow tube, 10" long x 1" wide. (Fig. A)



Turn the tube right side out by using a needle & thread. Make a secure stitch on one of the open ends. Carefully let the needle drop down through to the other end & gently pull the thread and material through the tube until it is right side out. Press flat. Stitch ends together. Fold the tube so that stitched ends are in center back. Wrap

a piece of thread around middle of the tube to make a bow, see (Fig. B). On the back, make two slits, one on either side of the middle. Slip the metal clip into the slits, (Fig. C). With the $12\frac{1}{2}$ " piece of fabric, make a second tube following procedure above. This will end up $12\frac{1}{2}$ "Lx 3/4"W and will be the tails. Tuck in raw edges and slip stitch.





Hold the tails under the bow and wrap with a piece of thread to secure in place. Take the 2" piece and fold the raw edges into the middle. Press so that the right side is out. Wrap this piece around the center of the tie, covering the center back of clip as well then turn in raw edges and hand stitch securely in back. TRUDY K. AUSTIN

AS I SEE IT

BOB OSGOOD LOS ANGELES. CA

The name of Dr. Lloyd "Pappy" Shaw may not be familiar. But were it not for this individual, the rebirth of square dancing just preceding and immediately following WW II might never have occurred. There's much to be said about this gentleman, principal and superintendent of the Cheyenne Mountain School.

With two squares of his high school students he formed the Cheyenne Mountain Dancers and starting in the late 1930's and continuing into the early 1950's he brought square dancing from one coast to the other. He brought more than choregraphy, more than dancing alone to the North American continent. He brought a spirit of friendliness and joy to a people who had all but forgotten how to be neighbors.

Up until the mid-1930's square dancing had all but disappeared. What there was was often rough dancing synonymous with the wild frontier barrooms, complete with hobnailed boots and a jug on the floor. Then, when Lloyd Shaw appeared on the scene to research the dances of the West, he set out to eliminate this rough dancing and bring back the element of moving to the music. "Our square dance is something special," he would say. And, as he told us all to be proud of our heritage of dance, he also encouraged us to dress the part and to look and act like square dancers.

All of this happened many years ago but those words of "Pappy" Shaw ring as true today as they did then. "Dance tall. Be proud of your dancing." It is natural to want to dance well, to improve one's style of dancing and to do better those basics we have already learned to dance mechanically. In tennis, golf, swimming, bowling, etc., we learn a limited number of "rules of the game," then we strive to improve. In square dancing it should be the same.

We've reached a point in square dance history where we have movements aplenty to last us for years. At the same time we may becoming negligent in our ability to dance well. Dancing smoothly and considerately places no barriers to anyone's dancing pleasure. On the contrary, as we learn to dance more uniformly and with greater smoothness we enhance our scope of enjoyment. We savor the unlimited pleasure which comes with being at one with music and being a part of a team. And we begin to experience square dancing as it is meant to be.

Comfortable dancing has a very personal connotation. Have you ever asked yourself, "Am I a pleasant dancer to be with?" It is a good question to ask one's self occasionally. It might just be that some of the problems we find with other dancers are errors we may commit ourselves.

As an example, have you ever danced with someone who reminded you of a <u>dead fish</u>? On a swing thru, a spin the top, or on any of the many turning patters the "dead fish" people offer no resistance -- only a limp arm, requiring you to do all the work. Could it be that this is also one of <u>your</u> failings?

Are you a rough dancer? How can you tell? Ask your dancing partner? Maybe he or she will tell you; maybe not. It's a good idea to know what rough dancing is and what effect it has on the others with whom you dance. Most of our trouble spots are simple errors, sometimes the result of bad habits picked up along the way. Rough, inconsiderate, uncontrolled dancing can be corrected. There is not one of us who cannot become a better dancer -- if we have the desire.



The S/D Activity is made up of many facets of dancing. CALLERLAB recognizes this fact and encourages its members to become conversant with areas other than just S/D calling. The callers have a responsibility to provide a pleasurable program for the dancers. Quite frequently, to provide variety, Round Dancing is included in this program.

While some S/D callers do not include rounds in their program, CALLER+ LAB's official position is that squares & rounds go together, They are part of the same family tree. CALLERLAB has an active R/D Committee which selects a "Round of the Quarter" for suggested use by its members. It was at CALLERLAB's request that ROUNDALAB developed a manual for callers who wish to introduce rounds into their S/D program. Dual membership in CAL-LERLAB & ROUNDALAB is not at all uncommon and many CALLERLAB members teach or participate in round dancing.

If your area does not include R/D in its S/D program, encourage your leaders- callers, cuers, dancers - to develop a way of including it especially at the Basic, Mainstream and Plus dance programs. All will benefit from it. Square and rounds, do, indeed, go together. What the proper balance may be at any particular dance should be at the pleasure of the dancers and worked out cooperatively between the caller and cuer.



WHERE DID WE GET SQUARE DANCING?

Square dancing is strictly an American folk dance. The dance developed about 1825 out of the then fashionable cotillion and quadrille, stately French dances in square formation. To simplified figures from these dances were added elements from the faster moving contra dances of New England & "running" sets of Appalachia.

American square dancing also introduced the caller, who was free to improvise the order of the figures. The caller's prompting soon developed into rhythmic pattern calls with a characteristic, wry vocabulary and, by the 1870's into singing calls.

Typical figures included the allemande (a quadrille term), dosido (from the French "back to back"), birdie in the cage (from the running set) and star (from the contras).

In the 1860's the fast swinging of partners in ballroom dance position added further interest. Square dancing developed regional variations in figures and style of calling and in Canada similar dances developed with French, Scottish and Irish influences. (HOME NEWS published this reply)

It took the 99th Congress just 47 seconds to once again kill months of work - HJR 316 - the bill to designate the Square Dance as the National folk dance of the US. Then within 10 days, in 35 minutes, without even notifying Congressman Panetta who has worked so hard on HJR 316, 22 other commemorative bills were brought to the floor under the unanimous consent calendar. No action was taken on the

S/D bill's counterpart in the Senate SJR 425.

At least in meetings between square dancers & the Directors of the American Folklife Center & the Archive of Folk Culture, a resolution was adopted to work with the Lloyd Shaw Foundation to survey, acquire and preserve S/D materials for the Library of Congress.

The new Chairman of the NATIONAL FOLK DANCE COMMITTEE, FRANK/NAN HABERS-BERGER (a former NNJ president) certainly have their work cut out for them. But they are determined to succeed. 
