





  - c. Must not be "localized" to any one geographic area.
4. **The winning poster will be featured on the cover of the September Issue of *Grand Square*.** The winning artist(s) will receive appropriate recognition at an NNJSDA Summer Dance.
5. **The winning poster will be reprinted by the NNJSDA.** Posters will be distributed to the clubs during the Summer Dances for use in promoting classes in NJ, NY, and PA.
6. **Deadline for all entries is Saturday, June 3, 1995.** Mail or deliver entries to the 3rd VPs, Ralph & Marilyn Neibart, 11 Lewis Drive, Maplewood, NJ 07040 (tel: 201-762-8481).
7. **Judging will be Sunday, June 4, 1995, by the NNJSDA Executive Board.** All entries become the property of the NNJSDA and may be displayed at National and State Square Dance Conventions.





## '95-'96 RAID PROGRAM

There is only one change in the rules from last season. We have expanded the time frame from June 1, 1995 to May 31, 1996, so that you have a full year to complete the Raid Program. A club raiding seven (7) NNJSDA member clubs in one dancing season will earn a free NNJSDA membership the following year.

### Requirements:

1. Must raid seven (7) different clubs between June 1, 1995 and May 31, 1996.
2. Must raid at least one club from each Area (see below for Area list).
3. Must raid a regular dance (not a special or dinner dance).
4. Must raid with one or more squares.
5. Members may not raid with more than one club per dance.
6. Must have Raid Card signed by an officer of the raided club.





See Saw Squares raided Rockytops when they danced at See Saw Squares' regular hall. There were 19 squares dancing to some challenging and fun calling.



Except for a flyer here and there, books on sewing for square dancers are very scarce. So when I found a truly useful book by Lee McCormick, I was very excited. When I learned that there were a series of them (Sew Square with Lee, Square Dance Designs, and Make a Western Shirt with Lee), I set out to acquire all 3. Her books are suited to all levels of sewers because, besides how-to's, she gives many design ideas that get a sluggish brain moving along new paths.

When I learned the books were no longer available in this area, I finally got up the nerve to call Oregon. Imagine my distress when I spoke with Ray, Lee's husband, and learned that Lee is no longer with us. Ray appreciated my interest, however, and I now have a small supply for those interested.

I am going to share a sample of her ideas on embellishments for western shirts with you. Realize that in today's fashions, these can be used for both men and women's shirts.



"...There are many varied things we can do to a ready-made shirt to make it match our square dance dresses. Here are a few ideas.

Sew soutache or pebble braid around the yokes of a ready-made shirt. Make a loop up into the yoke in front and/or the back to add a little variety to the yoke.

Rip topstitching that holds bottom of yokes (front and back) and slip piping - either ready-made or your own - under the edges. [Ed note: good way to add fringe; also, opening the sleeve seams about 1" where the yokes enter makes it easier.] Sew down, using zipper foot.

If you only have a little fabric left, or if you buy a dress that is a little too long and you can spare a little off the bottom, here's an idea using only little narrow strips.

Cut strips about one inch wide, turn under and press both edges, keeping strip a uniform width. Sew strips around yokes, matching center of strip with bottom stitching line of yoke.

Another idea using strips is to cut two squares of cardboard about 1 1/4" square. Interlock the two, as shown, and draw around them on back yoke of shirt. With strip laid over line, match center of strip to line. Sew each edge of the two squares, mitering corners and turning under edges at start and finish points.....

If sleeves are too short on a purchased western shirt, remove the cuff and add a longer cuff made of the fabric of your dress.....

Draw designs (or use transfers) on yokes, front and back. Machine embroider designs - or hand embroider - in colors to match your dress....." Sew Square with Lee, Chapter 7.

Thanks, Ray, for making these delightful books available to us again.

(Think music please:) "I COULD HAVE DANCED EVERY NIGHT"

Dear New Dancer:

Welcome to the wonderful wacky world of square dancing. You have reached the end of classes, but you were a dancer from the first day of the first lesson. You can join a square dance club now, but you were square dancers and members of your sponsoring club from the very beginning. You can start to have fun now, but you must have been enjoying it so far or you wouldn't be here. **AND YOU CAN GO TO DANCES ON YOUR OWN NOW!**

There is a strange phenomenon that goes to work as soon as graduation takes place. At one and the same time, dancers feel they are not very good, prone to mistakes, and afraid of taking the squares down, while at the same time dancers feel they are ready for anything.

Hence a whole bunch of new dancers, unfortunately aided and abetted by well-meaning angels or unwitting callers, are wrongly encouraged to start dancing at the Plus program when they simply are not ready. Just because you are the star in your class doesn't mean you are ready for a new program. And even if you are ready, it is not advisable.

Here are just a few of the groups who all agree that all dancers should dance at least a full year at any program before adding an additional program: **Callerlab, Northern New Jersey Square Dancers Association, Caller's Council of New Jersey, most club officers, most Advanced program dancers, and nearly all callers.**

Notice I talk about "programs," not "levels," of dancing. "Levels" imply that higher is better. At our CCNJ meeting the other day, one of the callers described her answer to the "What level do you dance?" question by saying, "I dance moderately well to excellent!" What a nice answer. How well you dance is the

And I would love to see more Mainstream clubs announce a hot hash, or a "Dance By Definition" tip, etc., at each dance.

But if you really want to learn something new, become a good angel for your club's class in the fall. You'll be surprised how much **you** learn doing it over.

**RECRUITING THE YOUNG -  
MAINTAINING THE YOUNG AT HEART**

Several of the Legacy/NEC seminars at the National Square Dance Convention in Portland, Oregon, dealt with this broad topic. Various methods and examples of getting square dancing into the school system were explored. *Goals 2000: Educate America* contains the National Standards for Arts Education guidelines describing what every US school child (K through 12) should know and be able to do in the four areas of the arts: music, dance, theater and the visual arts. The standards were signed into law in January, 1994.

Dance context standard #5: "Demonstrating and understanding dance in various cultures and historical periods" is the framework for introducing our American Folk Dance, Square Dancing, into the school system. From K through the fourth grade, one of the achievement standards is to demonstrate and answer questions about dance in particular cultures and time periods. A good example is learning why and in what setting people in Colonial America danced and some of the dances themselves. In grade five through eight, the achievement standard is to competently perform folk, social and/or theatrical dances from a broad spectrum of 20th century America. Square dancing, our American Folk Dance, certainly fits here.

It was also suggested that callers investigate Artists in Residence programs and/or volunteer to work with local cultural councils. The importance of working with teacher's colleges and indoctrinating prospective physical education, music, and dance teachers into western style square dancing was stressed.

Although square dancing is a non-competitive adult activity, it was pointed out that the 4-H square dance program has been successful with competition at its fairs. A deterrent in attracting and keeping youth in the activity is a lack of family oriented clubs. The United Square Dancers of America (USDA) "Hop To It" program, identifying youth friendly dancers with little green frog stickers, was also explained.

Discussing the needs for more family oriented clubs led to a lively session that branched out to include the problems of being a single in a couple oriented activity, various programs that dealt with maintaining the young-at-heart and the needs of persons with handicaps.

#### THE WAY TO GO - THE WAY TO GROW

It was standing room only at the Thursday educational seminars that Legacy, the International Assembly of "Trustees" of the Square Dance Activity, presented in conjunction with the National Executive Committee at the 43rd NSDC in Portland, OR. At every session, material was distributed to the attendees to take home and read at their leisure.

In discussing recruitment or attracting new dancers, much emphasis was placed on the various kinds of publicity tools available and the importance of the personal touch. The Legacy "Baker's Dozen" display ads, the *Club Leadership Journal*, the square dance city entrance signs and handouts were displayed as well as samples of the Legacy Promo-Pak especially created for recruitment. It was pointed out that the monthly *Journal*, edited by Bernie & Carolyn Coulthurst, which covers a variety of topics related to the activity, always includes a new "recruiting poster."

The attendees agreed on the necessity of including more than just teaching square dance figures at lessons. Time should be built into each lesson to give the first year dancer background on the whys, wherefores, and mores of the activity. Area newsletters just for the students can also reinforce some of this information. Several classes getting together for party nights, using just the calls already learned at class, help the beginning or new dancer to meet others just being introduced to the activity. Also discussed were ways to involve the new dancers into club activities, always being careful not to overwhelm them with too many presentations.

Dropouts due to poor health, family needs, and job changes will always occur. Several successful programs to help former dancers return to the activity were examined as well as the Callerlab Community Dance Program. Dancers must be encouraged to remain dancing and strengthen their newly learned skills by



dancing in the same program and must not be rushed or pushed into lessons for the next program or phase. Developing such a program could be a cooperative venture between several clubs and callers.

"Leadership - The Way to Grow - The Way to Go" was the topic for the second hour. Much of this hour concentrated on who is being trained to become leaders of tomorrow - and how. The prevention of "burn out" was also a hot topic. Learning to delegate responsibilities is an absolute necessity for good leadership. Leaders should be planning now for their replacements. One must start planting the seeds early, giving them a chance to sprout and also showing the future leader that you actually enjoy doing the job. Unless a person volunteers, never rush the new dancer or member into a job, especially an officership. Several suggestions were made:

- To establish a telephone list of existing and past officers and workers of your club who can serve as advisors to new and future officers.
- To provide for better continuity of activities, elect new officers several months before they are to assume their new responsibilities, thereby giving them time to attend the last few meetings of the outgoing board.
- To rethink the "tried and true" ways. If finding new officers is difficult, try multiple people in one leadership position. Or elect the board and let them choose the head couple and appoint committee heads to other jobs.
- To have a designated announcement maker if the president suffers from microphonephobia.

To train new leaders, Legacy publishes an excellent guide entitled the Leadership Manual, available for purchase from the Legacy office at 1100 Revere Drive, Oconomowoc, WI 53066. For subscriptions to the Club Leadership Journal, contact the Coulthursts at PO Box 766, Plover, WI 54467-0766





*PLEASE NOTE: Our weekly program, "introduction to plus" is for ALL SQUARE DANCERS and introduces the complete callerlab plus program. One plus figure from the previous week is reviewed and one new plus figure is introduced by the caller for the evening. Because we dance each Monday night, all the plus figures on the callerlab list will be presented and then repeated. This program gives dancers plus instruction from many callers for the price of a mainstream dance.*

## LETTERS TO THE EDITORS ...

As you know, Western dancing has become quite popular. I am currently teaching four nights a week; each class runs one hour and has 25 students: Monday, North Tarrytown (two classes back-to-back); Tuesday, Secaucus (one class); Wednesday, Ardsley, NY (two classes back-to-back); Thursday classes will begin shortly. The above classes total 130 individuals - yes, all single ladies, even though many are married.

We are trying desperately to get square dancing offered in any school. The answer is always, "Western line dancing? Sure! Square dancing? No!"

Now, while we are all trying to save square dancing, let's examine the reasons why line dancing attracts such large numbers:

1. Line dancing does not require a partner (many men don't want to dance).
2. It is socially acceptable and seen on TV daily.
3. It can be learned relatively quickly.
4. Casual clothing is acceptable.
5. It's good exercise, with good music, but not as challenging as aerobics.

Why does square dancing attract less and lose more people:

1. People don't want to make a long term commitment.
2. Progressive lessons are necessary; they can't be ill or take a trip.
3. Even if they hang on until graduation, there is a perceived stigma to dancing "only" Mainstream; there is peer pressure to move with one's friends to the Plus program or be left behind.



## **WHAT IS "CLUB DANCE," AS SEEN ON TV?**

Also known as Western Dancing, it consists of two segments:

1. Couples dancing around the perimeter of the room, with a constant "slow-slow, fast-fast" step that never varies. The female is twirled under or around the male.
2. Individuals doing solo, or "line" dances in the center of the room. There are memorized routines.

Western dancers may wear boots, hats, and jeans.

## **HOW DOES SQUARE DANCING DIFFER?**

1. Mentally challenging, it defers the aging process.
2. Popular throughout the world, done in English even in Japan, Germany, and Sweden, as well as Australia and Canada.
3. Offers a lifetime opportunity for socializing, without fancy footwork. If one can walk, one can square dance.

Female square dancers wear a skirt and low-heeled shoes, while males wear long-sleeved shirts and bolo ties.

## **BOTH ACTIVITIES REQUIRE A SERIES OF LESSONS**

Western line dances can be learned relatively quickly, but square dancing requires about 30 weeks of (once a week) lessons. These lessons are offered in the "building block" style, and progress until 68 different moves have been learned. The caller may combine these moves in different ways, so the dancer is never bored; the "unexpected" is the delight!

Western dancing socialization may be limited to the dance hall (sometimes the bar scene) but square dancers become friends and socialize outside of the dance floor, at picnics, New Year's Eve, Mystery Bus Rides, and, of course, on

square dance trips overseas, where the locals invite us to stay in their homes overnight. There are also state, national (both US and Canada), and other (Sweden) Conventions.

Square dancing is not a competitive activity. Cooperation is a key word for all four couples in a square to succeed. Men usually shake hands with each other at the beginning of each (15 minute) "tip" before taking a coffee break. Everyone then moves on to another square of dancers, constantly meeting new friends.

### **SQUARE DANCING IS FRIENDSHIP SET TO MUSIC**

Callers use old favorites as well as newer, popular music to move the squares in various formations such as Boxes, Waves, Columns, Lines, and Circles. By changing partners (within the square, as well) during the formation shifts, an infinite variety can be obtained to keep dancers interested.

Ten years ago, USDA established a Handicapable Committee to help dancers with handicaps reach their potential in the square dance activity. It is a continuing task of this committee to maintain a listing of "handicapable" clubs and to actively promote and assist at their biennial (even years) square dance convention.

All in attendance also learned that the majority of singles disliked the "Solo" ribbon wording, suggesting it be worded, "Need a Partner." Mac MacKenzie, Chairmen of the USDA committee, also mentioned that the handicapables preferred to be called "persons with handicaps."

## NNJSDA OFFICER NOMINATIONS FOR '95-'96

The NNJSDA Executive Committee received the Nominating Committee's Report at its March 12, 1995 meeting. The Nominating Committee was unable to find a couple to serve as Presidents.

Article VIII Election of Officers, of the Constitution states:

- Section 1. Individuals receiving remuneration from any Member Club directly or indirectly, are not eligible for election to office.
- Section 2. To be eligible as an officer in the Association, candidates for office must have served as a Delegate of the Association or an officer of a Member Club.
- Section 3. To be eligible to hold office as Presidents of the Association, candidates for office must have served as an Officer of the Executive Committee.
- Section 4. Election of officers shall take place at the Annual Meeting, from a slate presented by the Nominating Committee and nominations from the floor. Any nominations from the floor must have prior consent of the candidates. The Nominating Committee's slate shall be presented to the Delegates not less than 30 days prior to the Annual Meeting.
- Section 5. Election shall be by simple majority of the Delegates present and voting. The vote shall be by secret ballot whenever a contest occurs.
- Section 6. The Elected officers shall serve for one year term, starting June 1st.
- Section 7. No person shall hold the same office for more than two consecutive terms.

The following motion was passed by the Executive Committee: "The Executive Committee of the NNJSDA recommends to the Delegates that Article VIII, Section 7, of the Constitution be suspended for the 1995-96 year of the Association to permit the nomination and election of John & Joan Berg to serve a third consecutive term as Presidents of the Association.."

Pending the outcome of this vote, the Nominating Committee will place the following names in nomination as officers for the '95-'96 dancing season at the May 7, 1995 Delegates Meeting:


