### **Square Dancing with the NYC Ballet**

On January 15, the New York City Ballet Education Department presented a program of modern folk dance at Lincoln Center. Square dancing was featured as the American art form along with the tarantella from Italy, the tango from Argentina, the waltz from Austria, and the czardas from Hungary. Howard Richman arranged the square dance portion of the program with his usual style and expertise. The entire time allotted was probably less than three minutes, so it was not an easy task, but Howard was up to the challenge. He gave a brief history of square dancing as well as called a short tip performed by local dancers. Howard then called to the ballet dancers as they danced the choreography of George Balanchine's "Square Dance." It was a beautiful performance. The Times Squares were represented by Larry Petterson, Daniel Jason, and Pauline Plummer. Belles & Beaux' Fran Wadel and Rosann and Billy Flynn and Circle Eights' Susan and Frank Gufert completed the square. Everyone had a great time. ### **Improving Caller-Club Communications**

On January 16, Betsy Gotta addressed the NNJSDA delegates at their meeting. Her presentation, "Improving Caller-Club Communications," was most informative and useful. Her suggestions will help the hiring process and the club dances run more smoothly, to the satisfaction and enjoyment of all concerned. Below is the hand-out Betsy distributed at the meeting.

#### **I. First Contact**

- A. Let the caller know about your club/event
  - 1. Dance program (Mainstream, Plus, etc.)
  - 2. Standard positions, DBD, social group, or avid dancers
  - 3. Small club or large special dance
  - 4. How long is the dance? Will there be a workshop or pre-rounds?
  - 5. Is there a round dance program or line dances?
- B. Do not be afraid to discuss fee
  - 1. Tell the caller(s) a range that you can afford
  - 2. Do not book a caller and send a contract without settling on a fee
  - 3. Asking a caller a fee without any guidelines can lead to misunderstanding

#### **II. Contract**

- A. Specify all factors of the event including both start and ending times, dance programs, fee, request for workshop, whether there are rounds or line dances between the sets of squares, and terms for cancellation



Bluegrass and klezmer? Sounds like an odd combination, doesn't it? On the other hand, if you've ever been to a Jewish wedding, you can see how it just might work. When the wedding party dances the hora as they lift the bride and groom on their chairs to the lively strains of klezmer music, they're doing a whole bunch of concentric "circle lefts." You begin to imagine how the fast-paced music would provide a perfect accompaniment to square dancing.

Margot Leverett, clarinetist for the famous Klezmatics, saw the possibilities for a klezmer-bluegrass fusion, and that led to her formation of the Klezmer Mountain Boys. The group has been touring nationwide for the last couple of years, and in March they





The Hills now live in a retirement village in Whiting, where Fred just completed seven years of service as a trustee and Kathryn enjoys needlework and walking. Fred continues to handle insurance for the NNJSDA. They both take pleasure in spending time with their expanding family, which now includes seven grandchildren and 16 great-grandchildren. The Hills agree that the best things they ever did in life were marrying each other and learning to square dance. Their deepest wish is that God would grant a long and happy life to them and the many friends they have made through dancing and other activities. The wish seems to have come true for Fred and Kathryn, as they are both enjoying life in their 90s.





# **NEW RAID PROGRAM**

The NNJSDSA Raid Program was developed to promote more interaction between clubs and to provide a financial incentive for visiting other clubs. It evolved over the years to its current form. With the folding of several clubs in the last few years, however, the regions (areas) became imbalanced. A number of our clubs are in very remote areas. In an effort to be fair to ALL clubs the following guidelines have been adopted by the NNJSDA Executive Board based on the miles between the home bases of our clubs.

**Raiding Goal: a minimum of 210 miles, as calculated on the attached chart**

**Raiding Rewards:** the fun of dancing with other clubs  
one half off the NNJSDA membership dues for the  
following year

**Requirements/Guidelines:**

1. Must raid between June 1<sup>st</sup> and May 31<sup>st</sup>
2. Must accumulate 210 points based on the attached mileage chart
3. Must raid a regular dance (not a special or dinner dance)
4. Must raid with one or more squares
5. Members of more than one club may not raid with more than one club per dance
6. Must have the attached mileage chart signed by an officer of the raided club
7. Cannot RAID (this does not mean cannot visit) the same club twice in one year

**Officer of Club being Raided**

1. Circle the number where your club and the raiding club intersect.
2. Sign your name and write the date next to your club's name.

**President/ Raid Chairman of Raiding Club**

When the numbers circled total 210 make a copy of the form for your records and send the original to the president of the NNJSDA.





#### **Improving Caller-Club Communications by Betsy Gotta continued from page 9**

1. If the club cancels, is the caller paid any fee?
  2. If the caller has to cancel, who arranges the replacement caller?
  3. Does a replacement caller have to be approved by club officers?
  4. Is the ending time the end of the dance, or when the club and caller have to be out of the building?
- B. Contact numbers should include someone's cell phone number (for traffic/car problems on the day of the dance)
- C. Send directions even if the caller is not new to your club
- I. Reminder Notices
- A. Callers are human and can mark a schedule incorrectly. Send a reminder notice or phone the caller to confirm the date prior to the dance (preferably not the same day). Do not just assume that an e-mail has been received; set it up so that you get a receipt when the e-mail is opened.
  - B. Let the caller know if your club has changed its dance format or location
  - C. If you want a workshop prior to the dance, keep a record of what was workshopped at the last 2 or 3 dances and tell the next caller so (s)he doesn't pick the same calls. Let the caller know if the club wants a specific call workshopped.
  - E. Tell the caller about ongoing construction which could impact his/her trip
  - F. Give the cell phone number of a current contact – often the contracts are two years old and the phone numbers are outdated
- V. Helpful Things to Tell the Caller before the Night of the Dance
- A. Theme – callers may be able to pick music from their archives for the theme
  - B. "We've invited our class." Great, what calls have they been taught?







### **Congratulations to Two Intrepid Dancers**

We are pleased to report that we have now danced in all 50 states, the last being Alaska in August 2004. We have also danced in four provinces of Canada and Scotland. Although this was not originally a goal, as opportunities presented themselves, it grew out of our becoming increasingly absorbed in the square dance activity after we completed classes in 1995. We have found meeting new people, the fellowship, exercise, and fun rewarding in our retirement years. With so many pleasant memories, we began keeping detailed records of the different clubs we visited (205 to date), noting their names, location, dates, and callers' names in a

tabulated list. Every detail of the clubs and 63 conventions is listed in a looseleaf notebook which has become our square dance memory book. The signatures of 832 different callers fill our nine Century Books. Furthermore, we have our convention ribbons and some 293 dangles (with dates on the back) as mementos.

We believe we have traveled some 150,000 miles in the activity. For our travels we have used our car, sometimes up to 500-600 miles one way, and have combined flying and driving for greater distances. Daylight hours are valued for sightseeing on roads less traveled (not interstates), checking out interesting sites we have researched beforehand. We use the National Square Dance Directory to locate clubs or conventions in adjoining states with dances on consecutive nights. For economical overnights, we have used Evergreen ([www.EvergreenClub.com](http://www.EvergreenClub.com)), a reciprocal bed and breakfast group with about 2,000 members. With more than 60 such stays of 1-4 nights, we have hardly stayed in a motel for years. We have found our hosts to be most interesting, pleasant, and friendly people. About 15% of our hosts were either current or former square dancers. These good conversationalists often share their experiences with us, so we get a sense of them and the local culture. We have similarly hosted 2-3 Evergreen couples, both domestic and international travelers, for 1-3 days each year. All of the above have been truly enriching experiences for us, and we would highly recommend Evergreen to others.

Square dancers are the most incredibly accommodating people. Our five-state trip (Louisiana, Mississippi, Arkansas, Oklahoma, and Texas on consecutive nights) almost did not happen because we could not get a return call from the Jackson, MS contact whose club danced on a Saturday night, critical to our trip plan. In desperation, I called the contact for the Monday night club, and she explained that the caller had had a coronary by-pass and wouldn't be calling for months. I explained our problem and, convinced I was serious, she said she would contact members of both clubs for a joint club dance on Saturday night. The local dancers made it happen, to the mutual satisfaction of all.

We danced with Jerry Junck in Omaha, Nebraska. At this club, we ran into a variation of the handshake that usually follows a tip. Here, the right hand is raised about chest high, pointed down and shaken, not touching another dancer. So, in Nebraska, they "shake hands," but not the way you expect.

We highly recommend combining square dancing, traveling, and sightseeing. This country is filled with friendly and interesting people and fascinating places to visit. Enjoy!

- C. Tell the caller of any changes in the time that the club has to vacate the building
- D. If possible, do not spend the last tip taking down the decorations or setting up chairs while the caller is calling; dance if needed. Remember, the caller needs five minutes or so to pack - the chairs can be set up then.


