NNJSDA Presidents' Message

Hello! There are two subjects we need to talk about!

The first is officers. Neither the clubs nor the NNJSDA can operate without these important volunteers. When we started dancing 30+ years ago, there were more than 35 clubs.

Most of them folded because they could not find officers.

Well, we are having that same problem today with the NNJSDA. We need volunteers to be officers, and in case you've wondered: Yes, there are perks! The major one is to secure the future of the NNJSDA and your club. Because of committed leaders from our member clubs, we can continue to dance. Other perks include a discounted fee at NNJSDA events and the opportunity to work with dedicated people who enjoy dancing as much as you do.

The second subject is new dance programs. Starting in September, Mainstream classes will include fewer (only 50) calls, with 14 of them being moved to the Plus program. In addition, to even out the number of calls between the Mainstream and Plus programs, eight former Advanced 1 calls have been added to Plus. This enables current Plus dancers to expand their repertoire without having to learn the entire current Advanced program – although they may now be tempted to do so!

So when the NNJSDA begins using the rearranged calls in all programs at all its dances, we expect to have many eager new dancers who have taken lessons at their home clubs and are ready to go. See the article on page 9 with more information.

If you are a Plus dancer and do not yet know the calls that have been added to the program, learn them by angeling at a Plus class where they are being taught. It will be a win-win for you and the students. The 50th Anniversary Mini-Festival will also include a teaching session on the new Plus calls.

The NNJSDA second vice president has provided clubs with the preferred teaching order for workshopping the eight new calls. We encourage all current Plus dancers to take advantage of the various opportunities to learn.

New Mainstream and Plus Programs!

September 1 is almost here, and I hope you are all excited for our new Mainstream and Plus programs! The changes (see above) include equalizing Mainstream and Plus to 50 calls each. Fourteen have moved from Mainstream to Plus, one from Plus to Mainstream, and eight from Advanced to Plus.

While not all clubs have reported as of this writing, it is expected that most will start using the new (reduced) Mainstream program upon completion of their fall classes. However, note that because Times Squares will start the new Mainstream program after its class graduates in October, NNJSDA will do the same to allow for inclusion of their dancers.

The Association and several clubs have provided lessons/workshops for the eight calls moved from Advanced to Plus. If you have not yet taken advantage of a session, please do so. It is expected that clubs will continue to roll out the new calls through December and begin using all of them in January. The NNJSDA will begin to introduce them in October, with plenty of workshopping as needed. A teaching session for the new calls will be offered at the Mini-Festival.

How will we know what program will be called at a dance?

For advertising their dances in the current season, clubs have been asked to label each one clearly in their ads in this issue: Mainstream, New Mainstream, Plus, New Plus. Those that have not labeled their ads are expected to have the information included in the club's email notices.

Spotlight on – Joanna Lieuallen!

Tips for Your Tips

A series devoted to helping you become a more confident dancer

The Sound of Music

To borrow from a famous song, the dance floor is alive with the sound of music. Music is what makes our activity *dancing*, not merely a caller moving human chess pieces around the floor.

First, there is the flavor of the music. Peppier tunes give a bounce to your step, while smooth tunes make you feel like you are gliding across the dance floor. Sometimes, familiar songs entice you to sing along with the lyrics.

Square dance music has a consistent beat. The beat helps keep you and your fellow dancers stepping at the same time. This is particularly evident during a Promenade; there is a rhythm and feeling of togetherness when everyone in the hall steps “squarely” on the beat.

Part of the mission of Callerlab, an international organization of square dance callers, is to maintain a list of the calls that are used in the various dance programs. For each call, there is a definition (how to execute the call) and a timing note (suggested number of steps to complete the call). Squares move more smoothly through the calls when dancers do not rush but instead spend the full count for each part of the call. A perfect example is Grand Square, where four beats/steps are allotted for each “side” of an individual’s square. When executed accurately, nobody gets stepped on. This is particularly important if Grand Square is called from a starting position other than your standard static square. Interesting note: When Grand Square *is* called from a standard squared up set, you will have two facing lines after six steps, if done accurately! The proper execution of calls becomes even more necessary with the more intricately timed calls (such as Relay the Deucey and Teacup Chain, in the Plus program). In these cases, proper pacing helps to maintain the square’s symmetry during the execution of the call’s various parts.

Not all dancers are aware that singing calls have a structure to their choreography that corresponds to the structure of the song. A singer’s structure is break, figure, figure, break, figure, figure, break. The break (frequently starting with Circle Left, Grand Square, or Ladies Chain/Promenade) is the “chorus” of the song. The figure (frequently starting with Heads/Sides Promenade Half, or Square Thru Three) is the “verse.” A woman should be with her opposite man when the middle break is called, and should be back with her original partner for the end break. So, if your square breaks down during the figure choreography, the breaks are your opportunity to straighten things out, if you so choose. Also, since the breaks are during the song’s chorus, they are opportunities for dancers to sing along during a Circle Left or Promenade home, which adds to the enjoyment of the dance.

Let the beat of the music guide you. Let the “feel” of the music move you. Enjoy the *dance*!

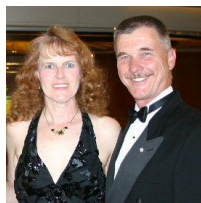
