NNJSDA President's Message

I would like to begin by thanking Gary Bergman (Rutgers Promenaders, Y Squares) for stepping up as the new *Grand Square* editor. Through his leadership and the efforts of the entire editorial team, our magazine is back in circulation!

When regional rules prohibited gathering in person due to Covid, square dancing went “underground.” Mike Dusoe, who had called for our last NNJSDA dance before the shutdown in March 2020, was also (to my knowledge) the first caller to go virtual. He launched what became a worldwide phenomenon: two-couple square dancing online. Soon there were virtual dances on Zoom nearly every day, and sometimes two or three per day. Virtual dancers kept up with their moves and took online lessons with callers from around the globe, interacting with people from many countries.

On the home front, some of our own callers and cuers became part of the Zoom movement: Mark Franks, Betsy and Roy Gotta, Greg Moore, Karin Rabe, and Howard Richman. Greg and Karin have offered ongoing virtual dances (replete with props) and lots of support and workshopping, to the delight of attendees.

Even though live dancing had gone dormant in our area, the NNJSDA executive board was working in the background by monitoring the situation, checking on available venues, and maintaining insurance to avoid any lapse in policy. RocklandRockytops held the first in-person dance in June 2021 with safety precautions such as vaccination and masking requirements. Shortly after, most clubs followed suit.

It has been thrilling to return to live square dancing. In many cases, clubs have scrambled to find new venues and stretched budgets. To keep our activity alive and well, we need the continuing return of experienced dancers and ongoing efforts to recruit new dancers. As the pandemic wanes and vaccination requirements are eventually ended, our entire community will once again be able to dance in unison. In the meantime, we all need to be patient, understanding, and respectful of one another.

What can we do to help our clubs? First, get out and dance as often and at as many clubs as possible. The NNJSDA has canceled its own fall 2022 events to encourage attendance at more club dances instead. Talk with and encourage your square dance friends who have not yet returned. Many who are concerned that they've forgotten too much find that the calls come back quickly. Be sure to invite people to your club's beginner dances, too. Personal invitations go a long way.

Although holding a Mini-Festival will have to wait another year, we have the opportunity to be part of rejuvenating and growing square dancing in other ways.

In conclusion, I would like to thank Jean Agostinelli, our assistant president, for her gracious investment of time in advancing the NNJSDA from afar and for supporting me as I have learned the ropes. Happy dancing, everyone.

NNJSDA Special Incentive Programs

Patron

- Download the Patron form at nnjsda.org (see Documents for Dancers).
- Visit nine different NNJSDA member clubs and have an officer sign the form.
- You may work on multiple forms at the same time, but obtain only one signature per visit. There's no limit to the number of dangles you can earn.
- Submit completed forms to the NNJSDA secretary.
- You will receive a dangle and a coupon for a free NNJSDA dance.

Freeloader

- Download the Freeloader form at nnjsda.org (see Documents for Dancers).
- Attend at least three qualifying NNJSDA dances and another event, according to current NNJSDA requirements, and have an authorized person sign the form.
- You will receive a dangle and a coupon for a free NNJSDA dance.

One Square Is Fair

You can benefit your club with a dues reduction by having at least eight club members (one square) attend five of the scheduled NNJSDA dances in one season. For the Midterm Student Dance only, officially registered students of the club may be counted.

Raid

You can benefit your club with a dues reduction by having at least eight club members (one square) visit other member clubs at their regularly scheduled dances (not specials) in one season, accumulating a minimum of 200 miles as indicated on the form. The program may be completed twice per season.

Remembering Shirley and Dick White, NNJSDA Past Presidents

Former Association presidents Shirley and Dick White passed away on October 26, 2020, and May 13, 2022, respectively.

Shirley and Dick were NNJSDA presidents from 1991-1993, advisor/trustees, Raid program founders, Mini-Festival chairs, and much more. After moving to New England, they served as officers in their club, delegates to their association, committee chairs for four New England Conventions, and eastern district vice presidents in the United Square Dancers of America. They attended 22 National Conventions and were instrumental in bringing the 2015 convention to New England.

In 2013, the Whites received the Yankee Clipper Award honoring “those who, by their unselfish dedication to the advancement of square and round dancing in the New England area, have set a standard by which all participants in the square dance activity may be judged.” They were equally dedicated to dancing in New Jersey – and managed to dance in all 50 states!

Remembering Mike Szekula, NNJSDA Past President

Mike Szekula passed away on January 28, one day before his 80th birthday. He served the NNJSDA as president, 1st vice president, recording secretary, insurance coordinator, and *Grand Square* proofreader. In addition, he maintained the Raid forms, updating them annually. Mike and his partner, Donna Poyer, were on the leadership team of every NNJSDA Mini-Festival since 1988, and Mike co-chaired three of them (2007, 2008, 2016).

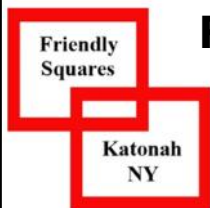

We are also one of the few clubs that dance during the daytime on alternating Sunday afternoons. This makes it easier on older folks who sometimes have difficulty with night driving.

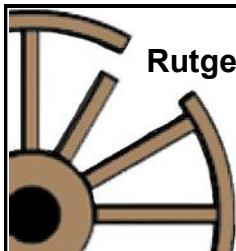

When Covid-19 came a-knocking, Times Squares kept a-rocking. Although it did seem pretty bleak in 2020, when our venue was closed and we stayed home to protect ourselves and one another, it would not take long for the club to embrace the new-at-the-moment Zoom lifestyle. Weekly chats provided connection, which turned into online activities – quizzes, photos, games, scavenger hunt (ask Joanna Lieuellen about that one), and virtual two-couple dancing. This allowed us to stay in shape, despite those pesky phantoms who sometimes got confused. Peel the Pumpkin 2020 was transformed into a virtual one-day event with Howard Richman calling and changing costumes.

As Covid cases plummeted in the spring of 2021, Times Squares organized a May Day picnic – our first in-person assembly in 14 months, with 35 attendees (but no maypole dancing). Two weeks later, we successfully experimented with using headphones connected to mobile phones, which connected to a Zoom meeting, where a caller from somewhere gave us much-needed direction to square up and get the rust out. About two squares danced the rest of the summer in that fashion.

In September, we resumed indoor dancing after extensive planning of health and safety protocols – proof of vaccination, face masks, and social distancing when not dancing. We danced steadily and more confidently for 17 weeks through the fall and winter, thanks to Betsy Gotta and Howard Richman. They called a mini Peel the Pumpkin in October at PS 3. On December 26, Ted Lizotte called our ever-fun Boxing Day event with dancers in boxer shorts. Despite concern over the Delta variant, life seemed on “Track 2” normal. And then came Omicron ...

It was inevitable, due to the variant’s hyper-contagiousness, that a dancer would test positive in early January 2022. We put dancing on hold until February. The club remains smaller, but a core dedicated dozen come out week after week. We graduated six Mainstream dancers in April and three Advanced in May – the longest class ever. Their journey began in fall 2019! We danced weekly during the summer in air-conditioned PS 3 with popular traditional themed nights like Rainbow Pride, Xmas in July, The White Party, and Wigstock. Occasional dancing to callers on Zoom provides variety at a reasonable price – no travel fees!

We will continue dancing weekly, rotating through Mainstream, Plus, and Advanced on Thursday and some Tuesday nights and a Saturday all-skate dance in September. C1 dancers will have to wait for the Saturday Specials in November and December. In October, Peel the Pumpkin has been replaced with Summer of ‘69: Sashay Away all day at our usual NYC location. It’s going to be a groovy time with Dayle Hodge and Howard Richman.

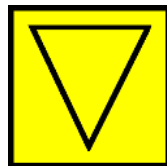

Celebrating 59 Years with Western Wheelers/Hix & Chix



Hix & Chix, the “mother” square dance club for my husband and me, was formed in or about 1963. Rich and I took lessons there and became members in March 1977. At that time, H&C danced Plus and rounds with three different club callers every Thursday except Thanksgiving. (For many years, Marshall Flippo called a special dance the Sunday after Thanksgiving.) Over the years, we cut back to twice a month. For a time, we tried alternating Mainstream and Plus, but attendance fell off and we resumed Plus only.

Club members enjoyed bus trips to various clubs in New Jersey as well as Dixie Derby Squares in Pennsylvania. Also, H&C “raided” other clubs before NNJSDA implemented its Raid program. Each year we had a dinner-dance at the Rustic Lodge in Elmwood Park before moving to The Brownstone in Paterson. Demonstrations were performed at nursing homes.

Western Wheelers Square Dance Club was formed in or about 1973. The Plus/rounds club danced on second and fourth Saturdays from September through June (later, through April). Many of the H&C dancers also danced at WW, which was known for its fabulous New Year’s Eve parties.

By 2011, H&C was dancing only in the summer and attendance started falling off at WW. The presidents of WW (Hilda and Bob Bachmann and Maria and Roger Hoernlein) and H&C (Connie and John Huettemann) guided the two clubs into a successful merger. Dances were held on second and fourth Saturdays from September through May and on various Thursdays from June through August. We continued having New Year’s Eve parties, and our annual meeting was a cookout at the Huettemann home. Plus workshops were held to interest dancers in Bergen County.

Eventually, WW/H&C cut the dance schedule to once a month, and then reduced the number of dance months. Still, few dances made a profit, and again a decision was made – to close the doors. If Hix & Chix had continued, Rich and I would have been the most longtime members.

We appreciate all the dancers who supported us over the decades.

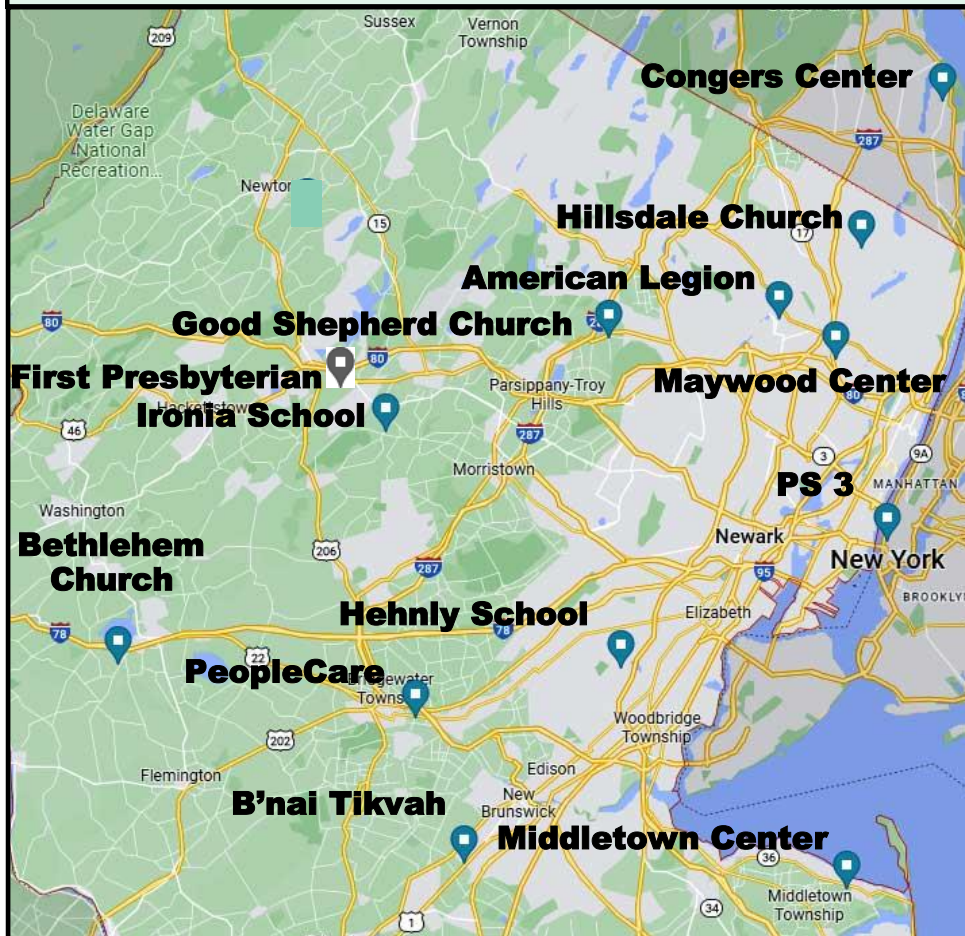
