Patron Awards of a dangle and a coupon for a free NNJSDA dance will be presented to the following dancers at our next NNJSDA event:



You can receive a Patron Award by simply visiting eight different NNJSDA member clubs. Download the form at *nnjsda.org* (see Documents for Dancers) and have it signed by an officer of the visited club. You may work on multiple forms at the same time, but only one signature per visit. There's no limit to the number of awards. Submit your completed forms to the NNJSDA secretary. Dangles are exchanged as each progressive award is achieved. They are given for awards 1-10, 15, 20, and finally a super patron dangle for 25.

One Square Is Fair benefits your club with a dues reduction by having at least eight club members (one square) attend five of the scheduled NNJSDA dances in one season. Officially registered students may be counted for the Midterm Student Dance.

Raids can benefit your club with a dues reduction by having at least eight club members (one square) visit other member clubs at their regularly scheduled dances (not specials) in one season.

Club Visitation is a new incentive program in which five or more club members visit NNJSDA clubs and earn points based on the number of members visiting. Sixty points earns the club a dues reduction.

What's new with Circle Eights?




