His travels have taken him to 44 states, 3 provinces of Canada, England, Sweden, Denmark, New Zealand, Germany, Finland and Japan. He is a regular caller in the summer at Cherry Ridge, PA.

Bill has been a member of Callerlab since 1977. He is currently on the Board of Governors of Callerlab and has served on the Executive Committee for two years, in addition to many other leadership roles. Currently, Bill is serving on the Mainstream, Challenge, and Application Review Committees. The father of two married daughters, Cynthia and Elizabeth, and grandfather to three amazing grandchildren, Bill enjoys home life with his wife Judy when he is not on the road.

Bill has recorded records with some of the biggest labels in the square dance activity, and is staff artist for Elmer Sheffield Productions (ESP).

Calling levels from basic through A-2, Jet has never missed a year of teaching a beginner's class since he was 10 years old.

Red and his wife Ginny now split their residences between Maine and Florida where he continues to maintain an active calling schedule calling levels from Basic through C-1. Many in our area know Red from the Tumbling Leaves Festival held in the fall in Bennington, VT, which Red started almost 30 years ago. A member of Callerlab, Red has served in many leadership positions including 10 years on the board of directors. Red also has recorded for several square dance labels, most recently for Silver Sounds, and many of his recordings have become best sellers.
